London, Feb. 4.—At a great United Protestant demonstration, held in Al-bert Hall to-night, resolutions were passed, opposing the confessional and the celebration of mass within the Church of England, the growth of which was alleged to be mainly due to the abuse of church patronage by the government and the episcopate. The resolutions pledge resistance to attempts to change that portion of the royal declaration in which the so-called "distinctive errors of the Church of Rome." They also urge the government to enforce the law concerning the exclusion of monks and Jesuits from Great Britain." The Timber Question. The Timber Question. The timber question was next taken up. It was the policy of the Conserva-tive party to impose an export duty upon logs, and it was only after long argument that the government was urged to endorse that policy. As a result, American capital was brought into the country, a stundy develop-ment of the resources commenced, so that to-day they had lines of industry all over the west of the province.
