Domini in Parliament.

OTTAWA, July 2.—The Commons re-assembled this afternoon with a rather strong attendance after the holiday dispersal. Some preliminary passages took place across the floor between the leaders on the perpetual subjects of the fast Atlantic line.

The proposal to pay over to the Quebec government the principal of the \$2,300,000 representing the subsidy to the North Shore railway, drew a perfunctory protest from Mr. Laurier. Accordingly, on motion for a third reading of the bill, Mr. Laurier moved to amend by applying to the consolidated debt, as in 1886.

Sir John Thompson showed that beyond ensuring a saving of one to one and a half per cent in interest, this particular had nothing to do with the particular mode of its application of the extinction of provincial indebtedness. Ottawa, July 4.—In the house today, Mr. Gillies enquired: have the government entered into any negotiations with the United States, for compensation for the loss of the three mile limit with such damage and injury to the fishing grounds upon the Atlantic coast may be rendered unlawful and prohibited in future by the joint action of the two governments?

Sir Charles H. Tupper replied: the government have entered into a convention with the United States, by which though not dealing specially with the subject of purse sealing and trawling contemplated a joint investigation, which would proceed, which will deal with subjects to which the hon. gentleman refers in his question; and no action of course, will be taken upon that subject until the commission have reported.

The house then went into committee of supply, and passed most of the supplementary estimates.
