OTTAWA, July 2.—The Commons re-assembled this afternoon with a rather strong attendance after the holiday dispersion.

The proposal to pay over to the Quebec government the principal of the \$2,300,000 representing the subsidy to the North Shore railway, drew a perfunctory protest from Mr. Laurier.

Accordingly, on motion for a third reading of the bill, Mr. Laurier moved to amend by applying to the consolidated debt, as in 1885.
