C A P. LXXVII.

An Act for allowing, until the First Day of August One thousand eight hundred and two, the Importation of certain Fish from Newfoundland and the Coast of Labrador, and for granting a Bounty [27th June 1801.] thereon.

THEREAS it is expedient to permit the Importation of falted Preamble, and pickled Salmon and falted dry Cod Fifh from the Mand of Newfoundland and the Coast of Labrador into the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and to allow on fuch Importation a Bounty on every Quintal or Hundred Weight of fuch Fish fo imported; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That, from and after the paffing of this Act, it shall and may be Salted Salmon or falted dry lawful to import from the Island of Newfoundland, or the Goaft of Labra- Cod Fith may dor, into the faid United Kingdom, any falted or pickled Salmon, or be imported falted dry Cod Fifh, having been taken and cured at the faid Places, or foundland or either of them, by British Subjects, any Law, Cultom, or Usage to the the Coalt of Labrador by contrary notwithstanding.

II. And be it further enacted, That, upon the Importation of fuch and on Fish into the faid United Kingdom, there shall be paid and allowed to the there shall be Importer or Proprietor thereof a Bounty of Three Shillings for every allowed a 6 H Quintal per Quintal or

Quintal or Hundred Weight of fuch Fifh, and fo in Proportion for any greater or lefs Quantity, which Bounty fhall be paid and allowed upon the following Conditions; that is to fay, upon the Mafter and Mate of every Ship or Veffel in which such Fish shall be imported, making Oath at the Port of Importation before the Collector or other principal Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, that all the faid Fifh imported in the faid Ship or Veffel was taken and cured by His Majefty's Subjects carrying on the Fishery at the Island of Newfoundland, or on the Coaft of Labrador, as the Cafe may be; and upon fuch Fifh being duly entered and regularly landed in the Prefence of the proper Officer or Officers appointed for that Purpole.

III. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That falted Cod Fifh and Salmon which shall have been imported under the Authority of, this Act, and on which the Bounty above-mentioned shall have been paid as aforefaid, may neverthelefs be exported without being fubject to the Repayment of the faid Bounty; any Thing in this Act, or any other Law or Statute, to the contrary thereof in anywife notwithftanding.

IV. And be it further enacted, That fuch Bounty shall be under the

Ireland respectively, and shall be paid by the faid Collector or other principal Officer, before whom such Oath is directed to be taken as aforefaid, out of any Fund under the Management of the faid Commissioners respectively : Provided always, That, before any Bounty shall be paid upon any fuch Fish as aforefaid, the fame shall be examined by Two indifferent and difinterested Persons, experienced in the Nature of such Fish, appointed for that Purpose at the Port of Importation, with the Approbation of the faid Commissioners respectively; which Persons so appointed, together with the proper Officer or Officers who shall attend the Examination of the faid Fifth, shall declare, upon their corporal Oaths, to be administered by the Collector or other principal Officer at the Port of Importation, whether the faid Fish, or any Part thereof, is or is not merchantable; and in cafe any fuch Fish, or any Part thereof, shall not be merchantable, no Bounty shall be allowed or paid on the Importation thereof.

Y. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That nothing in this Act contained shall extend or be deemed or construed to extend to vary, alter, or repeal any Act or Acts of Parliament made for the Security of the Duties upon Salt, but that every Act or Acts of Parliament, relating to fuch Duties, shall remain in force in like Manner to all Intents and Purposes, as if this Act had not been made.

VI. Provided alfo, and be it further enacted, That no Bounty shall be paid or allowed on the Importation of any fuch Fifh, for or upon any greater Quantity or Weight thereof than is or shall be contained and expressed in the Manifest required by Law, upon the Importation thereof into any Port of the United Kingdom.

VII. And be it further enacted, That in cafe any Perfons shall, in any Manner whatever, fraudulently obtain any Bounty upon the Importation of fuch Fifh, or thall enter any fuch Fifh for the Purpole of obtaining

IX. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall continue in force Act to contiuntil the First Day of August One thousand eight hundred and two.
