

SIR CHARLES IN RETIREMENT. His Luxurious Home on the Banks of the

London, July 31.—Sir Charles Dilke has disappeared, leaving his address with his lawyers only. He is believed to have left the country. This is a mistake. On one of the prettiest parts of the Thames, half way between Shipperton and Chertsey, in the middle of the famous Chertsey Meads, is a small, red brick summer house, which was built on arches because the ground was swampy. For half a mile it is surrounded with a thick growth of tall rushes. The house consists of two sitting-rooms, kitchen and bedroom. It is beaufitfully constructed and plainly furnished with old oak furniture. Half hidden by trees from the river, which is only a few feet away, is a tiny red boat house with a little boat landing just big enough to bold one person at a time. The old name of this spot is Tuckett Eddy. The house was built by Dilke a few years ago as a little pleasure resort close to London, yet assuring extreme privacy. Here Sir Oharles and Lady Dilke are keeping themselves in retirement.
