I began by telling my friend (Tiers) in the elevated and patriotic style, which the election time produces, that I was desirous of having a stake in the country. "Then, "says he. This is all that can be said to commemorate the first landlord of the Red Lion and its sarly history. The mechanic who hewed the timber, put the frame together and finished the building deserves a notice; for four years afterwards he died fighting gallantly in behalf of his king and country. This was one sanders, who came over with Governor Simcoe and settled in the immediate neighborhood of the Red Lion. He was killed at the blowing up of the Old Fort in the war of 1812. The value of land and property during Tiers' time was very small: it is known that he offered the hotel and the two hundred acres to Mr. John Smith's father for \$400, which of course was refused owing to the valueless character of the land.





In an interesting little brochure on the subject of champagne, recently published, the author has collected a great number of curious and instructive facts with regard to the cul-ture and manufacture of the wine, and in adsure and manufacture of the wine, and in addition to this gives some points relating to the different varieties of champague, the manner in which it should be drank, and the precautions to be observed in order to preserve the wine in a perfect state that are but little understood by the average wine drinker here. One great mistake that is often if not invariably made is cooling the wine down to nearly the freezing temperature before drinking it. Upon this point the writer says that great ignorance prevails. In serving a champagne of fine quality it should never be iced to a temperature below fifty degrees Fahrenheit, nor mixed with ice or ice-water, for excessive cold destroys the bouquet and delicate vinous flavor, while its natural brightness will not admit of dilution. Abroad this rule is always observed, but here the custom of icing is almost universal. With low grade wines this does not make much difference, but a connoisseur would never think of taking his wine at such a temperature. The wine should be placed in a cellar ranging from fifty to fifty-live degrees Fahrenheit, the bottles being laid side by side horizontally.
