But there ought to be no difference of opinion as to the injustice of a law that discriminates against one particular city. The bringing together of representatives from the different cities in Ontario ought to have the effect of emphasizing the fact that the capital city of Ontario, with a population exceeding that of all the other cities put together, is the only one in which it is illegal to operate a street car system on Sunday.

WHO FIRED OSGOODY BUILDING? Opening of the Investigation—The Elevator Boy Suspended For Both Sides—Will Be Crown Witness? In the Police Court yesterday the preliminary examination of William McMillan and Adolph Rosenthal, charged with firing the Osgoody building, Melinda-street, on Jan. 10, was commenced before Justice Denison. The accused pleaded not guilty and were defended by J. W. St. John, Mr. St. John gave evidence that he intended to use Rosenthal as a crown witness. Therefore as a matter of right Rosenthal's evidence should be given first. The Crown Attorney told you as a matter of fact that probably it was my intention to use Rosenthal if when my evidence is all in I deem it wise to use Rosenthal as a crown witness. Mr. St. John—I maintain it is material to me to hear the statement of Rosenthal, who has told all he knows about the fire.

A WORK THAT JUSTIFIES ITSELF. Those who have passed through the eastern channel and examined the improvements that have been made at the piers by the Dominion Government must be strongly impressed with the thoroughness of the work. No doubt a good deal of money was spent in the undertaking, but we have the satisfaction of knowing that the work has been built to last, and that the expenditure will be necessary, except an occasional dredging out of the accumulating sand, or possibly an extension of the pier. Even if it may not be necessary, as the work extends so far out into the deep water that it is not certain that the sand ever finds its way into the channel, even if the time the work was undertaken it was insinuated and stated that the money was being spent by the Government as a bribe to retain the political support of the city of Toronto. It is evident now that the Government knew more than we did about the necessity of the work, and that it would have come into or left our harbor, if we had to depend upon the channels as they existed before this work was undertaken. The work was constructed with a view to facilitate navigation during the season of low water as well as other times. This year the channels had been so shoaled that it would probably ever be called upon to bear. Instead of putting improper motives to the Government, the citizens should commendable foresight and a business-like appreciation of the requirements of navigation.

HOW THE AQUEDUCTERS DOOR. It is expected that the proposal of the Aqueduct Company to supply Toronto with water will come before the Works Committee for consideration today. The chief promoter seems to think he has got the city by the throat and he exultantly asks us what we are going to do about it. If the Works Committee act in harmony with the consent of the public opinion of the citizens of Toronto, they will lose no time in showing the aqueducters the door and in requesting them to make their exit. If it is true, as the aqueducters allege, that the pumping water from Lake Ontario is a losing game, that Toronto must finally obtain its water supply from the north, then it would be a good idea for our representatives to enquire into the truth of the matter. The World is exactly what The World has urged the Council all along to do. When Engineer Keating's proposal was submitted for building a tunnel, The World advised the Council to employ an expert of undoubted ability to go over the whole field, to give an opinion on our own engineer's proposal and to inspect the sources of supply in the Humber.
