Bon Voyage, But...

Canadians love to travel. Each year we make more than 100 million trips abroad for both business and pleasure. The vast majority of these excursions go off without a hitch.

But unfortunately all trips do not come with a hassle-free guarantee. Accidents, illnesses, legal problems and linguistic and cultural difficulties do occur.

Most problems are minor and you can usually solve them yourself. But if you run into more serious

obstacles, our Canadian missions are there to assist you.

If you are sick, in trouble or have lost your passport, our missions will do all they can to smooth your way.

Bon Voyage, But... will help you plan ahead. Read it before you book your next business trip or vacation abroad. And pack it in your luggage – it is a handy reference book of travel tips, important telephone numbers and addresses of Canadian missions around the world.

Before You Go

Preparation is the key to a successful trip. By doing your homework before you leave, you minimize the chances of something going wrong.

Be Prepared

Before you board that airplane or train, take the time to learn about the political, cultural and economic environment of your destination. Learn at least a few key phrases in the country's language. Even a modest command of the local language will go a long way.

When you are travelling, the laws of the country you are visiting apply to you too. **Never** assume that, because you are a Canadian citizen, you are immune to foreign laws.

Some countries experience ongoing wars, insurgencies or sporadic unrest. Find out if your destination is known to be dangerous. Check with the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade (DFAIT) before you leave.

Travel reports providing information on safety and security conditions, health issues and entry and visa requirements for over 210 travel destinations can be accessed from the Travel section of the DFAIT Web site (<http://www.dfait-maeci.gc.ca>), or by phone at **1-800-267-6788** (in Canada) or **(613) 944-6788**, or by fax at **1-800-575-2500** (in Canada) or **(613) 944-2500**. This information is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

If you are abroad, contact the nearest Canadian mission. Addresses and telephone numbers are listed at the end of this booklet.

When travelling abroad, you may wish to use *Canada Direct*, an automated long-distance access service that allows you to call home to Canada or to other countries using the Canadian telecommunications network. Simply dial the access number for the country you are in and follow the voice prompts. If required, a bilingual Canadian operator is always available to assist you. For a list of *Canada Direct* access numbers, call **1-800-561-8868** (in Canada). The numbers are also listed on page 62 of this booklet.

While you are abroad, tune in to Radio Canada International (RCI) for the latest news. You can also receive RCI broadcasts via the Internet (<http://www.rcinet.ca>). RCI also broadcasts messages from the Canadian government during emergency situations. You can obtain a schedule of times and frequency of broadcasts to different parts of the world from the RCI Web site or by calling the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation at **(514) 597-7555**.

Is Your Passport in Order?

Your passport is the best proof of your Canadian citizenship. You and all family members should have a valid passport if you plan to travel outside Canada. If you have any questions about passports, you can access the Passport Office in the Travel section of the DFAIT Web site (<http://www.dfait-maeci.gc.ca>) or call **1-800-567-6868**. Locally you can call **(514) 283-2152** in Montreal; **(819) 994-3500** in Ottawa-Hull; **(416) 973-3251** in Toronto; or **(604) 775-6250** in Vancouver.

Passport applications are available at passport offices, post offices and Canadian diplomatic and consular missions abroad. Allow at least three weeks for delivery of your new passport.

If your passport is due to expire within the next six months, check with your country of destination's embassy or consulate in Canada for its rules and restrictions regarding passport validity and expiration. Some countries will not let you enter if your passport is within six months of expiry.

Before you leave on your trip, be sure to complete the "In case of accident or death notify" section in your passport. This will help us quickly notify your family or friends if an emergency arises.

Make a photocopy of your passport's identification page and keep it separate from the original when you travel. For added security, leave a photocopy with a friend or relative at home. These simple steps may speed the replacement process if you lose your passport.

If your passport is lost or stolen while you are travelling, contact the nearest Canadian mission immediately for a replacement

A Canadian passport remains at all times the property of the Government of Canada and may be used only by the person to whom it has been issued. Selling a passport or permitting any other individual or agency to use the passport may lead to criminal prosecution and is cause for revocation of the passport and refusal of future passport services.

after reporting the loss or theft to the local police. Make sure you get a copy of the police report or the report number. Before a new passport can be issued, you must complete an application form, produce written evidence of your Canadian citizenship (e.g., a birth or citizenship certificate), provide a copy of the police report or report number, present new photographs and pay the required fee.

We also recommend that you carry a birth certificate or naturalization certificate confirming your identity in addition to your Canadian passport.

Do You Need a Visa?

You need a visa to travel to certain countries. Your travel agent or the country's embassy or

Planning a trip? Don't forget about your health! Hepatitis, malaria and other diseases are out there. Getting sick while travelling can ruin a well-planned vacation or business trip. Learn about vaccines, water precautions and other ways to travel healthy in this supplement and by visiting either a travel clinic or your physician before you go.

Avoid The Risk. Travel Healthy.

Travel. Everything about it is appealing. Except getting sick. Becoming ill while away from home can not only ruin a long-planned trip, but dealing with foreign countries and their health systems can be difficult at best, and next to impossible at worst. The best part is that a few precautions can help ensure that you stay healthy whenever you travel.

If you are planning to travel, especially if you will be visiting any developing country outside of western Europe, the United States, Australia, New Zealand or Japan, you should see your doctor or a travel clinic for health advice (this includes travellers to Mexico and the Caribbean!) Important health topics for travellers include:

● **Vaccinations**

Depending upon your destination, the risk of disease, and the length of your stay, your doctor may recommend one, or more, of the following vaccines: cholera, hepatitis A, hepatitis B, influenza, Japanese encephalitis, meningococcal, polio, typhoid fever, or rabies. For instance, Hepatitis A, the most frequently-occurring, vaccine-preventable disease among travellers, is usually contracted from contaminated food or water. Hepatitis B, which can lead to a chronic, long-term infection, is spread by contact with bodily fluids of an infected person. Both of these serious liver infections are easily prevented by simply being vaccinated.

● **Acclimatization**

Tips to prevent heat illness, sunburn, altitude sickness, motion sickness and jet lag.

● **Insects**

Several types of insects can transmit diseases. Your health care professional can provide advice on vaccinations, medications and avoiding insect bites.

● **Soil and Fresh Water Swimming Precautions**

Find out how protective footwear helps to prevent injuries, insect and snake bites, bacteria and/or parasite infection. In addition, swimming in slow-moving fresh water in certain developing countries can lead to a parasite infection – learn how to avoid it.

● Drinking the Water

Unless you have been assured by your travel health advisor that the water is safe to drink, there are precautions you should take, such as brushing your teeth using water that is purified or bottled, and drinking only commercially bottled beverages.

● Should I Avoid Foreign Foods?

Consuming the local cuisine is a great part of the appeal of travelling. However, you may want to take precautions. Among them: eat food that is piping hot and well-cooked; eat uncooked vegetables and fruits only if washed in purified water or peeled yourself.

● Other Things to Know

Certain activities could put you at higher risk for contracting an illness when abroad and should be avoided. For example, receiving injections, having skin-piercing procedures (tattooing or acupuncture) or unprotected sex, accepting blood products for non-life-threatening situations and swimming in fresh water.

Upon your return, if you have any health problems (such as fever or persistent diarrhea), you should see your doctor. And, if you develop flu-like symptoms within one year of returning home, see your doctor and request a blood test to rule out malaria.

Whether travelling for business or pleasure, be sure to include health precautions as part of your pre-travel planning! Staying healthy while travelling will help ensure a successful trip.

consulate in Canada can advise you of the requirements. You can also check the Travel Reports for the countries you intend to visit in the Travel section of the DFAIT Web site (<http://www.dfait-maeci.gc.ca>) or call DFAIT's Consular Affairs Bureau at **1-800-267-6788** (in Canada) or **(613) 944-6788**.

Apply for visas well in advance of your trip.

When you arrive at your destination, be prepared to prove that you have enough money to support yourself during your stay.

Be aware of the rules and restrictions governing visas and your length of stay. This knowledge can save you both time and money.

Some countries will allow you to enter only if you can prove you will be leaving. Be prepared to show your return or onward ticket or any visas that demonstrate you plan to visit another country.

Schengen Convention Countries

Austria, Belgium, France, Germany, Greece, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Portugal and Spain have implemented the Schengen Convention, which abolishes permanent border controls between

them, except in the case of Greece, and sets out rules governing the movement of foreigners within their territory. Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden have also signed the Schengen Convention, but have not yet implemented it. If you would like information about the entry requirements for Schengen countries, please contact their embassies or consulates in Canada **before** your departure.

Charter Flights

Before you book a charter flight to your destination, check the credentials of both the travel agency and the charter company with either the Better Business Bureau or a local consumer advisory organization.

Dual Nationality

To avoid unpleasant surprises, find out whether you, your spouse or any other family member is a citizen of another country. If you are considered a national, you may be compelled to do military service or pay special taxes.

If you do run into problems because of your dual nationality, contact the nearest Canadian mission immediately.

People with Special Needs

Many countries do not provide access for people in wheelchairs or make allowances for those with special hearing, sight or other physical requirements. Contact your local access organization or talk to others who have travelled to your destination in the past. There are also several guides published about international travel and people with special needs. Check your local library or bookstore or the Canadian Transportation Agency Web site (<http://www.cta-otc.gc.ca>).

Getting Medical Advice

Health Canada strongly recommends an individual risk assessment by your own family doctor or a travel medicine provider prior to travelling. Based on your health risks, vaccinations and any special precautions to take during your trip can be determined. Health Canada's Laboratory Centre for Disease Control (LCDC) provides travel health information through the Internet (http://www.hc-sc.gc.ca/hpb/lcdc/osh/tmp_e.html) and through a fax retrieval system, FAXlink. To access FAXlink, call (613) 941-3900 using the handset of your fax machine and follow the instructions.

When planning to travel, it is recommended that you visit a travel clinic well before your departure. The travel clinics listed in the fold-out will ensure that you receive the most current advice, as well as any vaccinations and medications that are necessary to avoid health problems while abroad. A list of travel clinics in your area can also be obtained through Health Canada's Travel Medicine Program at (613) 957-8739, through the Internet (<http://www.hc-sc.gc.ca>) or from the Canadian Society for International Health at (613) 241-5785.

Vaccinations

Before travelling to any destination, find out **well in advance of your trip** if you need any special vaccinations or preventive medications for such illnesses as yellow fever, typhoid, meningitis, Japanese encephalitis, hepatitis or malaria. For instance, a meningococcal vaccination is required for pilgrims travelling to Mecca, Saudi Arabia, for the annual hajj; and an International Certificate of Vaccination for yellow fever is a legal requirement to enter certain countries.

You may need to start receiving your vaccination shots or taking medication **six to eight weeks**

before you leave. Also ensure that your routine immunizations – diphtheria, whooping cough (pertussis), tetanus, polio, measles, mumps and rubella – are up-to-date. Other immunization requirements for travel will vary according to your age, existing medical conditions and the nature and duration of your travel.

If you are travelling with infants or small children, you may need to arrange an alternative or accelerated childhood immunization schedule for them. Talk to your pediatrician, family doctor or travel medicine clinic.

AIDS

AIDS/HIV is a global disease. Some countries require proof of AIDS testing. Have the test conducted and obtain the results **before you travel.** Call Health Canada at (613) 957-8739 to find out if the country you plan to visit requires this documentation. When travelling, take the same precautions you do at home. Do not assume that condoms will be readily available. Even if they are, they may not meet the safety standards set by the World Health Organization.

Remember: Using intravenous drugs is not only illegal but also extremely risky – especially if you share needles.

Medication

If you take medication, be sure to pack an extra supply in case you are away for longer than expected. Carrying a duplicate of your original prescription is highly recommended – especially when travelling to a country that is particularly sensitive about drugs. Also, carry an extra prescription that lists both the generic and the trade names of the drug, in case your medication is lost or stolen. This is also a good idea if you wear glasses or contact lenses – having the prescription makes it easier to replace them.

Do not try to save luggage space by combining medications into a single container. Keep all medications in the original, labelled container to avoid problems.

Find out whether your medication is sold in the country you are visiting. Also check to see that it is legal. Some over-the-counter medications in Canada are illegal in other countries or require a prescription. Obtaining a note from your doctor that states

the medical reasons for your prescription and the recommended dosage is also encouraged.

If you need syringes for a medical condition such as diabetes, it is very important that you take along an appropriate supply. As well, you should carry a medical certificate that shows they are for medical use.

If you have a pre-existing medical condition that could present a problem while you are travelling, it is wise to wear a MedicAlert® bracelet. Through the MedicAlert® Foundation, your vital medical facts become part of a database that can be accessed 24 hours a day from anywhere in the world. Call 1-800-825-3785 for membership information or visit the MedicAlert® Web site (<http://www.medicalert.ca>).

Pregnancy

If you are pregnant and plan to travel abroad, talk to your doctor. Some vaccinations may not be recommended. Also, check your travel and health insurance plans carefully to ensure they cover health complications arising from pregnancy.

On Your Return

If you should become sick or feel unwell on entering Canada, see your doctor. Inform the doctor, without being asked, that you have been travelling or living outside Canada, and where. Likewise, if you were ill while travelling, see your doctor on your return and explain your travel history and any treatment you received.

If you have been in a malarial area and develop fever during the first year after your return (especially in the first two months), see your doctor immediately and remind him/her that:

- antimalarial pills do not guarantee protection against malaria; and
- malaria must be ruled out by one or more thick and thin blood film examinations.

Supplemental Health Insurance

Do not rely on your provincial health plan to cover the total cost if you get sick or are injured while you are abroad. At best, your health plan will cover only a portion of the bill. **It is your responsibility to obtain and**

understand the terms of your supplementary insurance policies. Some credit cards offer their holders health and travel insurance. Do not assume the card alone provides adequate coverage.

Be sure to ask whether your policy:

- Has an in-house worldwide emergency hotline you can call if you are in trouble. Check to see whether it is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week; whether the operators are multilingual; and whether nurses or physicians are on staff.
- Pays foreign hospital and related medical costs and, if so, whether it pays "up front" or expects you to pay and be reimbursed later.
- Provides for your medical evacuation to Canada.
- Pays for any required medical escort (doctor/nurse) to accompany you back to Canada.
- Excludes pre-existing medical conditions. If such conditions exist, notify your insurance company and get an agreement in writing that you are covered for these conditions. Otherwise, you could find your claim "null

and void" under a pre-existing condition clause.

- Covers premature births and related neonatal care.
- Allows for cash advances if a hospital accepts only such payment.
- Pays for the preparation and return to Canada of your remains should you die while travelling.

Carry details of your insurance with you. Also, tell your travel agent, a friend or relative at home and your travelling companion how to contact your insurer.

Get a detailed invoice from the doctor or hospital before you leave the country. There is nothing more frustrating than trying to get the proper paperwork from thousands of kilometres away. Remember to always **submit original receipts** for any medical services or prescriptions you received while travelling abroad. Most insurance companies will not accept copies or faxes.

Other Insurance

Individual personal medical insurance for those working outside Canada, with both occupational and non-occupational coverage, is available. These plans consist of full accident and sickness coverage, including emergency medical evacuation and war risk. There is no requirement to maintain a government health insurance plan. Coverage is available to both the contracted person and his/her dependants. You may wish to refer to the advertisement from Telfer International Inc. on page 17 for further information on this type of insurance coverage (e-mail address: info@telferinsurance.com).

Lost luggage, theft of your purse or wallet, or flight cancellations can happen to you. These annoyances can cause major disruptions when they take place in a foreign country. Consider purchasing a travel insurance package that will compensate you for such inconveniences.

Travelling by Car?

Keep in mind that each country has its own driving regulations. You may be required to obtain an international driver's licence or additional insurance. Be sure to learn the local rules of the road before you get behind the wheel. In some countries, the driver may be detained and questioned by the police even though only a minor collision (such as a "fender-bender") has occurred. Country-specific insurance must be purchased for travel by car to Mexico and Central America. This is usually available at border crossings. For specific information on driving in the United States or Mexico, consult DFAIT's booklets *Crossing the 49th or México: ¿Qué pasa?* (see page 30 for details on how to order these publications).

Money Matters

Canadian currency and traveller's cheques in Canadian dollars are not always widely accepted. Before you leave Canada, consult a bank or a foreign currency agent to find out the most appropriate currency to carry. Traveller's cheques in the appropriate currency or in U.S. dollars are often the safest and most convenient option. It is a good idea to have a small

amount of the local money on hand when you first arrive, unless the importation of local currency is a crime. There may be restrictions on taking money in and out of the country. Check with the foreign embassy or consulate in Canada or with your travel agent about currency regulations in the country you plan to visit.

Do not rely exclusively on bank machine cards or credit cards. They are not necessarily honoured internationally.

Canadian Taxation Status

If you are living or travelling abroad but maintain residential ties in Canada, you are usually considered a factual resident of Canada for taxation purposes. However, there may be other factors involved, so you should review your situation with Revenue Canada before you leave in order to avoid surprises. The Revenue Canada publication *Canadian Residents Abroad* provides excellent information for individuals. See page 31 for details on how to order this publication.

Revenue Canada's International Tax Services Office processes income tax returns for non-

residents and deemed residents of Canada, including Canadians posted overseas. It also provides general assistance by telephone, correspondence and counter service, and looks after all non-resident tax withholding accounts. You can contact the office at 2204 Walkley Road, Ottawa, ON K1A 1A8, or by fax at (613) 941-2505. You can also telephone the office (collect calls are accepted) at the following numbers:

Before travelling abroad with valuable items, you can take advantage of a free identification procedure at any Customs office. This service is available for items that have serial numbers or other unique markings. Alternatively, if

you request it, Customs can apply a sticker to any item to give it a serial number.

Jewellery often has significant value and can be difficult to identify. To make it easier to re-enter the country with jewellery, you should contact your nearest Customs office to find out the steps to take before your departure.

Travelling with Children

If you are travelling to another country with your child and there is a possibility of a custody dispute developing while you are away, you should talk to a lawyer before leaving home. A special publication, *International Child*

Abductions: A Manual for Parents, is available from DFAIT. See page 30 for details on how to order this publication.

Your child custody arrangements in Canada may not be recognized in another country. In extreme cases, you or your child may not be allowed to leave. Check your status with the country's embassy or consulate in Canada **before** you travel. In regard to custody questions, contact DFAIT's Consular Case Management division at **1-800-387-3124** (in Canada) or **(613) 943-1055**.

If a person younger than 18 is travelling alone or with only one parent or another adult, notarized documentation certifying that the trip is permitted by both parents should be carried.

Before You Go... A Traveller's Checklist

- Do your research. Learn about the country you plan to visit. Learn a few phrases in the local language.
 - Arrange supplementary health insurance and travel insurance.
 - Carry proof of insurance coverage, and give a copy to someone at home.
 - Draw up a flexible itinerary and budget. Leave a copy at home.
 - Make sure your passport has not expired and is valid for six months beyond the time of your trip. Photocopy the identification page and keep it separate from your passport.
 - Leave another copy with someone at home. Fill out the "In case of accident or death notify" section in your passport.
 - Make sure you have any visas you need.
 - Find out whether you or any members of your family are considered nationals of the country you plan to visit.
 - Have any vaccinations required. If you are taking medication with you, make sure you keep it in its original container.
 - Carry a doctor's prescription for any controlled drugs, and if you use syringes, carry a medical certificate. Leave copies at home as well.
 - Keep the original receipts for any purchases you make, as well as your hotel bill, rental car agreement and medical service bills.
 - If you are female and travelling alone, take extra precautions to ensure your safety.
 - Review all child custody arrangements if you are travelling with a child. If your child is travelling alone, have him/her carry documentation stating that the trip is permitted by both parents.
 - Ensure that any plant or animal products you plan to bring back are acceptable to Canada. Travelling pets may require shots and special permits (at a fee). See page 25 for more information and check with a local office of the Canadian Food Inspection Agency.
- Do not forget to pack this booklet. It could help you more than you can imagine.**

Seeking Assistance

Registering at a Canadian Mission

If your stay is longer than three months in one country, it is recommended that you formally register at the nearest Canadian mission. This will help us contact you in case of an emergency or crisis. Registration is voluntary and the information you provide is not shared with any other Canadian government department. Registration is not usually available in the countries of Western Europe, Australia, New Zealand and the United States.

In countries where Canada has no direct representation, there may be arrangements in place for you to register with another country's embassy or consulate. For instance, Canada has a formal reciprocal agreement with Australia.

Consular Assistance

Canada's 250 service points worldwide are ready to help you if needed. In some instances, there may be a fee for services.

What can we do for you?

- We can contact, at your request, your relatives or friends and ask them to send you emergency funds.
- We can help you during emergencies such as natural disasters and civil and military uprisings.
- We can direct you to sources of information about local laws, regulations, cultural customs and how to obtain visas.
- We can assist with medical emergencies.
- We can replace passports. However, not all missions are authorized to issue regular passports.
- If you are arrested, we can try to ensure equitable treatment under local laws. At your request, we can inform relatives and friends about your arrest and try to ensure that legal rights and processes are extended to you consistent with the standards of the host country. However, we cannot set aside local laws if you are

charged with an offence, nor intervene in the judicial process of a foreign country. We cannot post bail, pay for a lawyer or pay your fines.

- If you wish, we can notify your next of kin regarding accidents or deaths and let them know whether, and how, they can help.

Check the list of countries at the end of this booklet for information on the address(es) of the Canadian mission(s) in the country you plan to visit.

Emergency Consular Services

Canadian missions offer 24-hour assistance. During non-office hours, a telephone call you make

to a mission will be automatically transferred to a consular officer in Ottawa or you will be asked to leave a message on an answering machine. In either case, there will be a prompt response. If you leave a recorded message, make sure that it is clear, and that you leave a telephone number or a full contact address. In addition, you can make a collect call to DFAIT in Ottawa, 24 hours a day, seven days a week, at (613) 996-8885. You may wish to use the *Canada Direct* or AT&T Canada services if they are available.

In some locations, where Canada does not have a resident mission, the Australian and British missions will provide emergency services or contact the nearest Canadian mission on your behalf.

On the Road

Foreign Laws and Customs

When you are travelling in a foreign country, familiarize yourself with the way of life there. Respect that country's laws, religions, culture, class structure and economic conditions. Although you may not personally agree with some of the country's beliefs, remember that you are a visitor.

In many countries, appropriate attire – for both sexes – is very important. In some countries, laws govern what men and women can and cannot wear in public. Penalties for disobeying local laws can be quite severe.

Be especially respectful of temples, mosques, churches, synagogues and other religious

sites. Many of these areas are off limits to foreigners or people who are not members of that faith. Ask permission before taking photographs of religious artifacts or buildings.

Not everybody likes to have his/her picture taken. Local people may resent you for taking their photograph or they may demand money for the picture after it has been taken. Always ask first.

Never take photographs of military facilities, a harbour where naval vessels are docked or industrial installations such as oil refineries. You may lose your film and your camera, and could even come under suspicion of espionage.

Taking Precautions

The same rules apply abroad as at home, only more so. Foreigners are usually at greater risk than locals. In many countries, foreigners are specifically targeted. Do not wander into unknown areas; find out how safe they are first. Do not pick up hitchhikers or cross borders with people you have just met. Watch your luggage and make sure it is locked. **Never take anything, even an envelope, across a border for someone else.**

Do not display large amounts of money or expensive jewellery in public. Use a money belt or a case with concealed sections for valuables. Dress appropriately.

Leave a copy of your itinerary with someone at home so that they can contact you in case of an emergency. Telephone home, particularly if you have promised family members or friends that you would do so. We receive thousands of calls every year from worried family members or friends who have not received a promised call.

Keep a separate record of your traveller's cheques and credit cards. **Never carry your passport, travel tickets, identification documents, cash, credit cards and insurance papers together. If you do so, you risk being left with no identification or funds.**

Use the safety deposit box at your hotel. Never leave valuables in your room.

Illegal Drugs

Drug use and trafficking are prohibited in all countries, even though drugs are readily available and openly used in some places. Most countries impose heavy fines and long prison sentences for

possession and trafficking. For more information, visit DFAIT's Anti-Drug Information Program Web site (<http://www.dfait-maeci.gc.ca/english/travel/adip-pia>).

In some countries, possession of even small amounts of drugs carries the death penalty.

Never take across a border any parcel that is not yours.

Choose your travelling companions wisely. Never cross a border with a hitchhiker or as a hitchhiker. Although you may not be carrying anything illegal, your companions may be.

Sexual Exploitation of Children

The Government of Canada has enacted legislation that permits the arrest and prosecution of Canadians in Canada for the sexual exploitation of children in other countries. Most countries are now enacting legislation, or more vigorously enforcing existing laws, concerning the sexual exploitation of children. Those convicted face a penalty of up to 14 years' imprisonment.

Crime and Punishment

More than 2,200 Canadians are currently imprisoned abroad for

various offences; 60 per cent of those are in the United States.

The laws and customs of countries around the world can be very different from those in Canada. Ignorance of those laws is no defence.

While in a foreign country, you are subject to its laws and regulations. Your Canadian citizenship offers no immunity. Canadian consular staff abroad must also follow the rules of the host country. If you do find yourself in trouble, they can help you find a lawyer, contact your family and friends, and ensure that you receive fair treatment according to the standards of that country. However, they cannot wield any influence to reduce your sentence or fine.

Judicial Process

Never assume that the legal system of the country you are visiting is the same as at home. "Innocent until proven guilty" is not a universally recognized concept. In some countries, you may not even have the right to legal representation or a trial in your mother tongue.

Some countries do not recognize or respect religious freedom, freedom of association, speech or the press,

or equality of the sexes. For instance, guilt by association is presumed in some countries. This means that you may be charged simply for being in the company of a person suspected or found guilty of a crime.

Even if you are an innocent bystander at a demonstration or riot, you may be considered a participant and rounded up with those involved. **Your Canadian citizenship does not grant you immunity.**

If you do find yourself in legal trouble, contact the nearest Canadian mission immediately. If you cannot do so yourself, have someone else do it for you.

Mail

If you are travelling for an extended period of time, you can arrange to have your mail sent to a post office

box or, where possible, to the nearest Canadian mission. In the latter case, the mission will hold on to letter-size mail (not parcels) for you to pick up **in person**. This mail cannot be forwarded to another address.

Travel to the United States and Mexico

Always carry your Canadian passport, citizenship certificate or birth certificate when you are travelling to the United States or Mexico. A driver's licence is not valid proof of citizenship.

When You Return

Departure Tax

Some countries impose a departure tax or service fee at the airport or point of departure. Prior to leaving such a country, make sure you set aside enough money, in local funds, to pay this tax.

Canadian Food Inspection Agency: Be Aware and Declare

A single sausage illegally brought into Canada caused foot-and-mouth disease, destroying cattle and costing Canadians more than \$1 billion. Every year, thousands of travellers fail to declare things

like cheese, meat, animal hides, live birds, plants and fruit. These items may carry pests and diseases, and pose a risk to human health.

Foreign pests and diseases could destroy Canada's crops and forests and wipe out our livestock, thus threatening our ability to produce food and a multi-billion-dollar export trade critical to Canada's economic well-being.

We need to protect our country. Canadian law says you must declare all plant and animal products you bring back. It restricts and prohibits the entry of products that could harm Canada's agriculture and forestry or pose a danger to human health and safety. To enforce these laws, we have Canadian inspectors with dogs trained to sniff out plant and animal products.

Canada Customs and Import Controls

You must declare everything acquired abroad, whether purchases for yourself or gifts, as well as goods bought at a Canadian or foreign duty-free store. Keep your original receipts for possible inspection.

If you have been away from Canada for 24 hours or more, you may bring back goods worth up to C\$50 without paying duties or taxes. This does not include alcohol and tobacco.

If you have been away from Canada for 48 hours or more, you may bring back goods worth up to C\$200 without paying duties or taxes. These goods can include tobacco products and alcoholic beverages, as described below.

If you have been away from Canada for seven days or more, you may bring back goods worth up to C\$500 without paying duties or taxes. These goods can include tobacco products and alcoholic beverages, as described below. In calculating the number of days you are absent, do not include the date you leave Canada, but include the date you return.

Canada

If you have been away from Canada for 48 hours or more, you may bring back up to 40 ounces (1.14 litres) of liquor or wine, or a case of 24 bottles/cans of beer, each containing 12 ounces (355 ml). You may also bring back up to 200 cigarettes, 50 cigars or cigarillos, 200 tobacco sticks and 200 grams of manufactured tobacco. Provincial age restrictions apply to liquor and tobacco products.

Certain goods are restricted from entering Canada. If you are considering importing meat or dairy products, plants, weapons, vehicles, or exotic animals or products made from their skins or feathers, contact Canada Customs beforehand for guidance.

Obscene materials, hate propaganda, most weapons, including firearms, and goods harmful to the environment are prohibited from entering Canada.



Advice for Canadians Travelling Abroad
