That Was the First Topic in the House at Ottawa Yesterday and It Was Supported All Round.

Mr. Casey Brought the Measure Forward in a Pointed Speech and Was Backed by Grit and Tory Members from Both East and West—Telegraph Companies Had No Friends.

Ottawa, March 12.—(Special.)—The East and West met today in the House on one plank of the World's platform, namely, State ownership of telegraph lines. The matter was brought up by Mr. Casey when he introduced a bill entitled "An Act for the establishment of a Government system of telegraphs." Mr. Casey is not an orator, but he has a happy faculty of expressing himself brightly, and has of late been the advocate of progressive schemes.

Again the West went Forward.

Again the West went forward, when Dr. Rutherford (Portage la Prairie) informed the House that the people of Prince Edward Island had written to him with the following message: "The telegraph lines in this province had been a great benefit to the people of this province. We hope you will be able to do more for us." The speaker then read the message, and he had reached home 24 hours before the telegram. (Laughter.)

At a quarter of 8 Mr. Davin introduced the following motion:

"That the Government should be instructed to acquire the telegraph lines of the Dominion, and to operate them as a public utility." The motion was carried by a large majority.

Some Pointed Instances.

By interesting statistics he showed that the telegraph business in Great Britain, Australia and New Zealand had resulted in increased convenience and business and a large reduction in rates. In Great Britain, during the past five years, under this regime, the telegraph business had increased ten times out of proportion to the increase in population. Last year, in Great Britain, the cost of the telegraph service was lowered a quarter of a million pounds.

Canada was a good country to introduce the telegraph system, he said, as it was a long country, and the telegraph lines, owned by the Dominion, would be a great benefit to the people of this country. He suggested that the Dominion should acquire the telegraph lines, and operate them as a public utility.

Considerable Strides Were Made by Canada's Mining Industries During 1899.

GOLD, COPPER, SILVER, IRON. Brick From Crown Point Smelter for Trout Lake, B. C.—Stocks and Sales.

Canadian mining is growing. The Geological Survey of Canada, in its summary of mineral statistics for the year 1899, gives the following statement of the total production for the Dominion for the 12 months ending Dec. 31 last:

The increase in the value of the mineral production of Canada, which has been so noticeable a feature in the figures for the previous four years, is continued during 1899. Compared with the corrected total for 1898, the preliminary figures for 1899 show an increase of over 22 per cent. The increase for 1898 and 1897 having been nearly 35 per cent. and nearly 27 per cent. respectively.

Of the above-mentioned 22.28 per cent., 15.52 per cent. is credited to the Yukon placer, 2.92 per cent. to the increase in the other metallic products, and 3.84 per cent. to the growth of the non-metallic minerals.

The value of the mineral production per capita for 1899 would be about \$8.30, being increased almost fourfold in the available 1899, when the average per available person in the Dominion was \$2.09.

In copper, owing to the large advance in price, there was a marked increase in value notwithstanding the fact that the output decreased in the production of the country, lead and silver are the only two showing a considerable increase.

The increase in the quantity and value of the nickel produced attests the continued prosperity of the mines of Sudbury. Ontario notwithstanding the fact that the production of copper as mentioned above.

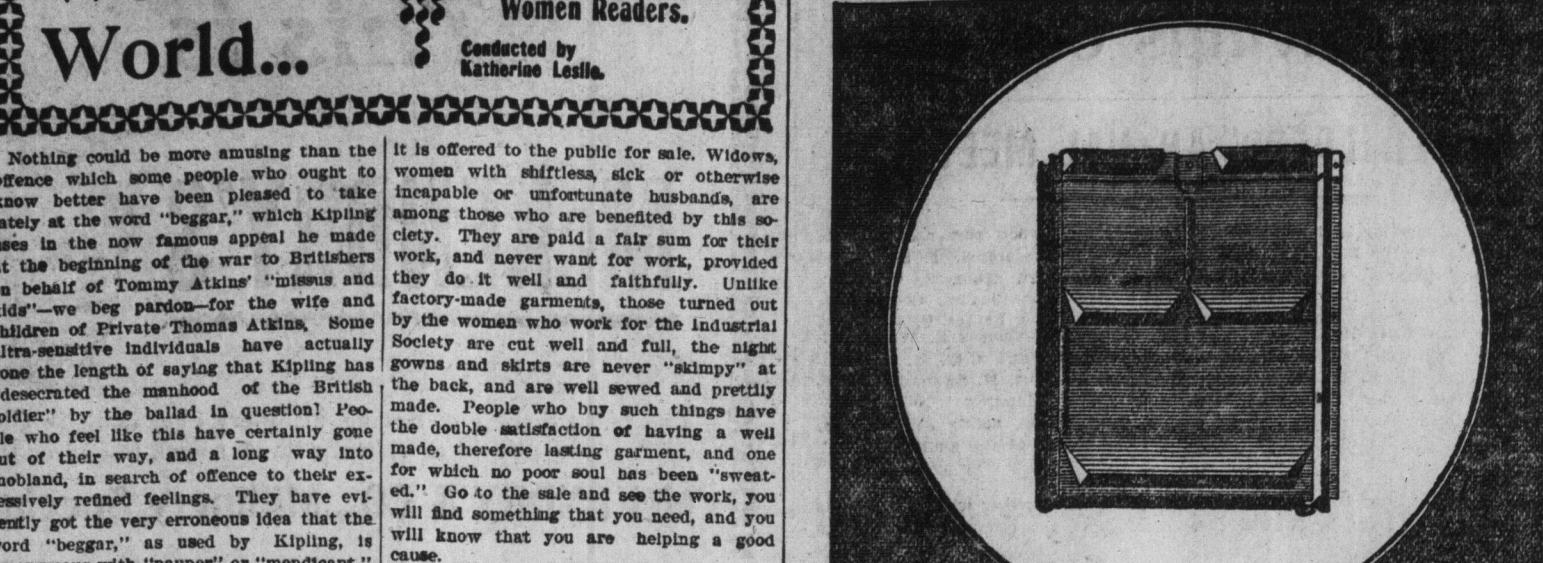

CANADA'S MINERAL OUTPUT

Increase of Over 22 Per Cent. for the Year 1899 Compared With the Preceding Year.

NEARLY ONE-HALF IN GOLD ALONE

In Other Minerals, However, There Were Good Increases—Lead and Silver Fell Off.

Ottawa, March 12.—(Special.)—The total mineral production of Canada in 1899 was valued at \$47,275,312, as compared with \$38,061,010 in 1898, an increase of 22.2 per cent. Of the increase, 15.35 per cent. is to be credited to the increased output of gold from the Yukon placers, 2.92 per cent. to the increases in the other metallic products, and 3.84 per cent. to the increase of the non-metallic mineral products. Of the total output, gold contributed 44.53 per cent., coal 19.12, copper 3.62, silver 2.88, nickel 4.37 and lead 2.07 per cent. In copper, owing to the advance in price, there was a marked increase in value, notwithstanding a decrease in the output. Lead and silver show a considerable falling off, owing to a falling price in British Columbia. With the exception of a slight falling off in the value of the sulphur, and the other chief minerals show considerable advances, both in amount and value, especially true in the cement and coke-making industries.

TO SETTLE HALF-BREED CLAIMS.

Mr. Sifton Made All Arrangements for Same Before Leaving for Europe.

Ottawa, March 12.—(Special.)—The Minister of the Interior, before leaving for Europe, completed all arrangements for dealing with the claims of half-breed born in the Northwest Territories between July 15 and the end of the year 1885, and with claims preferred by representatives of half-breed born within that time and since that date. The following commissioners have been appointed to inquire into and report on the claims: J. A. J. McKenna of the interior, H. M. Gwynne of Ottawa, and Samuel Meach, M.P.A., of Prince Albert.
