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# CONSTITUTION

OF THE

## ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

### NAME AND OBJECT.

1. That this Association shall be denominated "The Ontario Rifle Association."
2. The objects of the Association are the promotion and encouragement of rifle shooting generally, and more especially amongst the Active Militia of the Province of Ontario, and to assist in giving permanence to the Force.

### MEMBERSHIP.

3. The individual membership fee shall be one dollar per annum, payable in advance.
4. A donor of \$20 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less than \$40, shall be entitled to be enrolled as a life member of the Association.

### AFFILIATION.

5. Associations shall pay \$5 per annum for the privilege of affiliation, irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, entitling the Association to a medal, to free entrance for one team in the match open to teams from Affiliated Associations, and entitling five members of the Association who have never won a prize at any Provincial, Dominion or National Rifle Association to compete at the Annual Prize Meeting without payment of the individual membership fee.

### PATRON.

6. There shall be a Patron, to be named by the Council.

**OFFICERS.**

7. There shall be a President, who shall be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

8. There shall be four Vice-Presidents, one for each Military District in Ontario, to be elected at the same time and manner as the President.

9. There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Toronto, both to be appointed by the Council and holding office during pleasure.

10. There shall be two Auditors who shall be appointed at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

**COUNCIL.**

11. There shall be a Council composed as follows: (1) Four members from each of the Military Districts in Ontario, who shall be elected at the annual business meeting of the Association. (2) The President and Vice-Presidents of the Association. (3) The Presidents of affiliated Associations or Clubs being members of the Association, Seven of whom shall form a quorum, and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies.

12. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account, duly audited, to the annual business meeting of the Association. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts or deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

13. The Council shall, at its first meeting in each year, choose from its members the Chairman of the Council.

14. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them, no by-law being in any way altered, or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of the Council.

**EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.**

15. The Council shall annually elect, at its first meeting in each year, an Executive Committee, consisting of ten of its members, two of whom shall be the President of the Association and the Chairman of the Council, and in the event of a vacancy occurring therein during its term of office the same may be filled by the Executive Committee from the members of the Council; three to form a quorum.

16. The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council shall from time to time order affecting the affairs of the Association.



**FINANCES.**

17. There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council, who shall be elected annually by the Council at its first meeting in each year, and who shall have a general supervision over the finances of the Association, and to whom all accounts shall be submitted before payment thereof is made by the Treasurer.

18. All expenditure for sums of current expenses which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the Chairman of the Finance Committee in writing, or, in his absence, by some other member of the Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner. All expenditures of a general nature are to be made only on the authority of the Council of the Association.

19. The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time in some chartered bank of Canada, which shall be named by the Council, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.

20. The Fiscal Year of the Association shall end on the 30th day of November. A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditures, duly audited, shall be tendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer within one month thereafter.

**PRIZE MEETINGS.**

21. Prize meetings shall be held at Toronto, at such times and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meetings of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time, as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision or the decision of a majority of them shall be final, conclusive and binding; but they, or a majority of them, may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

**ANNUAL REPORT.**

22. An annual report of the affairs and proceedings of the Association shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall, having been previously submitted to the Council, be published as soon after the close of the year as may be found practicable, and shall be submitted to the members at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

## MEETINGS.

23. The Annual Business Meeting of the Association for the election of Officers, the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Toronto on the first Tuesday in March in each year, at such hour and place as may be named by the President of the Association.

24. A General Meeting of the Association shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the transaction of all business of a general nature and for the discussion of matters that may be brought forward by any member attending the matches. The appointment of a committee to select the Provincial Team or Teams to represent this Association at the Annual Prize Meeting of the Dominion Rifle Association shall take place at this Meeting.

25. There shall be two ordinary meetings of the Council in each year, the first of which shall be held on the day of and immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association; the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

26. Special Meetings of the Council shall be summoned by the Chairman if required by any six members of the Council, notification being sent to each member of the Council at least seven days previous to such meeting, and the requisition for the meeting and the notices to the members must state the object or objects of such special meeting.

27. The Association, Council, Executive and Finance Committee shall keep minutes of their proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in books kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and shall be open to the inspection of all members of the Council.

## ALTERATION OF CONSTITUTION.

28. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the annual business meeting, or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members, as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the annual business meeting, at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

## REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

OF THE

# ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION

FOR THE YEAR 1894.

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The Council has the honour to submit to the members of the Association the Twenty-sixth Annual Report of its proceedings, and in doing so has pleasure in referring to the measure of success which has attended the operations of the Association during the year; and to report a continued and increasing interest by all concerned in its affairs.

### ANNUAL PRIZE MEETING.

The Annual Prize Meeting was held at Long Branch Rifle Ranges on Tuesday, the 21st August, and the two following days. The total number of competitors was 299, as compared with 254 in 1893, and 256 in 1891, the attendance being one of the largest in the history of the Association. The entries in the Extra Series Competitions were greater than in any former year.

In all matches the competitors were permitted to fire with either Martini-Henry or Snider Rifles, the former being used almost exclusively. The scoring was higher than usual, this being attributable of course to the weapon used.

The railway facilities afforded by the Grand Trunk Railway, between Toronto and the Ranges, were all that could be desired.

The limitation of the meeting to three days, instead of four days, as heretofore, appeared to afford general satisfaction to all and contributed materially to the success of the meeting; and at the same time rendered it possible to effect a very considerable saving in the working expenses. The weather was favourable and altogether the meeting passed off most successfully.

An "At Home" was given at the Ranges on Thursday, August 23rd at which His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor and Mrs. Kirkpatrick, and many friends of the Association from Toronto and Hamilton, were present.

This was a new departure and is worthy of encouragement, as we believe it can be made a means of interesting many in the Association to whom at present it is practically unknown, and thereby extend its usefulness and influence.

The thanks of the Council are due to the Officers of the 48th Highlanders for the services of the band of their regiment on this occasion.

The Council desires to acknowledge with thanks the following contributions to the Prize Fund:--

The thanks of the Council are due to the members of the Executive Committee; the Executive, Range, Statistical and Medical Officers, for their services during the meeting; and also to the Toronto Daily Press for their full and accurate reports of the matches and proceedings of the Association.

#### FINANCES.

The Treasurer's Statement of the finances of the Association, duly audited, is submitted herewith.

The total receipts for the year were \$8,063.05.

The amount received for membership affiliation, entry fees, &c., during the matches, was \$2,559.00, being an increase over the amount received in 1893 from similar sources of \$543.00.

There was received from rent of lockers during the year, \$61, which is equal to a return of nearly fifteen per cent. on the capital invested.

The amount expended in cash prizes was \$3,086. This was considerably less than the amount given in 1893, which was larger than usual owing to the fact that no prize meeting was held in the year 1892. The amount granted, however, in prizes was about the same as that for 1891 and previous years.

An expenditure of \$187 for the erection of firing points was necessary in order to meet the requirements of the Association. While this was an expenditure of an extraordinary nature which is not likely to occur from year to year, yet the accommodation for the Extra Series Matches is inadequate, and it is possible that some further outlay will yet require to be made for this purpose.

A saving in the working expenses of the Annual Match as compared with 1893 was effected, of \$164.50.

A claim has been made upon the Dominion Government for the amount paid by the Association during the years 1892, 1893 and 1894 for the services of a caretaker during the construction of the Ranges, amounting to \$764.50.

The Association's claim is based upon the fact that an allowance is made for a similar purpose by the Government in connection with other large Ranges at Ottawa, Montreal and elsewhere.

The Finance Committee deemed it prudent to arrange with the Ontario Bank for a small credit, in order to enable them to pay all outstanding accounts against the Association and thereby consolidate the liabilities. They were enabled to do this without any extra cost as by prompt payment they secured a small discount on all of the larger accounts.

The balance of liabilities over assets, as shown in the last annual statement (excluding plant and stores) was \$545. Adding to this the following items which were not included in the liabilities, viz.:

aggregating \$436.50, and deducting as an asset the proportion of the claim against the Government for caretaker for the years 1892 and 1893, \$465, would leave a net balance of liabilities over assets last year

of \$516.50. According to the statements submitted herewith, this amount is reduced to \$374.98. It will be thus observed that the financial position of the Association has been somewhat improved during the year. In the event of the Government declining to recognize the Association's claim, then it can only be regarded as a liability properly chargeable against those who have been benefitted by the maintenance of the Range.

### CONSTITUTION.

With a view of facilitating and, if possible, improving the efficient management of the affairs of the Association, the Council during the year recommended several important changes in the Constitution. These changes were ratified at a General Meeting of the members held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting. One change to which attention may be especially directed is the date of the Annual Meeting of the Association, which is now fixed to take place on the first Tuesday in March in each year.

### RANGES.

The construction of the New Ranges, which have been officially designated as the Long Branch Rifle Ranges, is completed, and they have been taken over from the City of Toronto by the Militia Department.

The question of the care and maintenance of the Ranges is one in which the Association is deeply concerned, and which should receive its early attention. The closing of the 200 yards range by order of the Honorable the Minister of Militia, caused considerable inconvenience in connection with the conduct of the Annual Matches, and is also a matter which claims consideration.

### LONDON MERCHANTS' CUP MATCH, OTTAWA.

The Council have pleasure in reporting that the team selected to represent the Province in the Inter-Provincial contest at the Dominion Rifle Association Matches was again successful in carrying off the first prize of \$100.

During the year the Council approved of a very handsome and suitable "medal and clasp," designed and manufactured by Mr. A. Elliott, to be presented to the members of the successful teams in this contest.

The holder of a medal being the member of a winning team in any future contest, to receive an additional clasp. Carrying out the understanding which has existed, but which had not been fulfilled, these medals and clasps were awarded to all members of successful teams during the past four years and were much appreciated by the recipients.

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MEETING OF THE COUNCIL.

*Held at Canadian Military Institute, Toronto, June 18th, 1894,  
at 2.30 o'clock.*

The Minutes of Council meeting held Aug. 24th, 1893, were read and confirmed.

Major Macdonald read proposed Report of Council for 1893, and moved its adoption, seconded by Inspector Johnston. Report was adopted.

The Secretary, Capt. Mutton, then read Statement of Receipts and Expenditures for 1893, and explained the items in detail giving list of controllable and uncontrollable expenditure.

Major Macdonald, as chairman of the Finance Committee, spoke upon the question of the Statement and explained several items.

Major Macdonald moved, seconded by Lieut. A. Pain,

“That the Statement of Receipts and Expenditures, also of assets and liabilities, be recorded and adopted subject to the usual certificate of the Auditors.” Carried.

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Carried.

Lieut. T. Mitchell asked for information about medals for the Association team of eight who had won the London Merchants' Prize at Ottawa in '91, '92 and '93. He said he thought these medals should be presented at once to the members of the three successful teams.

No formal motion was made, but the feeling of the meeting was that the medals should be ordered and presented to the successful competitors.

Lt.-Col. Otter asked Major Mason, of Hamilton, to take the chair as he had to retire. Major Mason took the chair.

Major Macdonald reported progress on behalf of the committee appointed to nominate some suitable person for the Presidency of the Association, and in doing so suggested the necessity for revising the constitution so as to provide that the president should be elected by the Association instead of by the council, as at present, and that the Council should elect a chairman from their own number, in this respect following out the principle on which the constitution of the National and Dominion Rifle Associations are framed.

He furthermore suggested the appointment of an Executive Committee of the Council which should be held responsible for and control all expenditures made. He suggested that the Annual Meeting of the Association and of the Council should take place on a fixed date in the early part of each year, say February or March. This would ensure the regular publication of the Annual Statement and Report, and also the better management and control of the affairs of the Association.

Lieut. Cartwright and Lt.-Col. White spoke upon the subject and endorsed the suggestions made by Major Macdonald.

Moved by Lt.-Col. White, seconded by Capt. Orchard,

"That the following be a committee to consider what changes, if any, are necessary and advisable in the constitution of the Association, and to report to this council:—Major Macdonald, Major Mason, Major Henderson, Capt. Mercer, Lieut. Cartwright, Lieut. Elliott." Carried.

Moved by Lieut. T. Mitchell, seconded by Capt. Orchard,

"That the Annual Matches be held on Tuesday, August 21st, 1894, and three following days." Carried.

Moved by Inspector Johnston, seconded by Lieut. A. Pain,

"That the following be the Match Committee to arrange for the matches and decide upon a prize list and programme:—Lt.-Col. Otter, Major Mason, Major S. Hughes, Major Macdonald, Capt. Mercer, Lieut. Cartwright, Lieut. Pringle, the Treasurer and the Secretary." Carried.

Moved by Lieut. T. Mitchell, seconded by Capt. Orchard,

"That the decision as to the amount that shall be expended in list of prizes be left to the Match Committee." Carried.

Moved by Lieut. A. Elliot, seconded by Major Henderson,

"That all the matches be open to Martini Henry and Snider Rifles." Carried.

Moved by Major Macdonald, seconded by Lt.-Col. White,

"That the Match Committee be authorized to build a firing point 100 yards in rear of the present 500 yards firing point, so as to be able to use 24 targets at 600 yds. at once." Carried.

Mr. John Crowe brought up the question of position at 200 yards, pointing out that the regulations were not definite enough, some competitors sitting on the side of the foot instead of on the heel, others rolling up a mat and placing it under the instep. He asked that the regulations be so worded so as to prevent any unfair position and the enforcement of the Hyth position by the Range Officers. Lieut. Elliott suggested that the same remarks in a way also applied to the standing position. After a great deal of general discussion the matter was referred to the Match Committee.

The following suggestions were referred to the Match Committee :—

By Lieut. T. Mitchell,

"That on Tuesday, the first day of the matches, Extra Series be fired from 10 to 12 a.m., and that the Regular Matches commence at 1 p.m.

By Lieut. T. Mitchell, seconded by Major Henderson,

"That the Regulations of the O. R. A. be made to confirm as near as possible to the Bisley Rules and Regulations of the National Rifle Association."

By Staff-Sergt. R. McVittie, seconded by Lieut. Pringle,

"That the following be dimensions of 3rd class target :—Size 4' x 4', bull 8" dia., inner 20" dia., magpie 32" dia., outer, remainder of target."

By Major Macdonald,

"That the following medals be given as prizes in the aggregate matches :—

National Rifle Association Medal, Governor-General's Silver and Bronze Medals, D. R. A. Silver and Bronze Medals, O. R. A. Silver Medal."

Meeting adjourned.

The Secretary read the notice calling a special meeting of the Council for July 12th, 1894, which notice was amended by another one calling the meeting for July 16th, 1894, a copy of each notice having been duly posted to each member of the Council.

The minutes of meeting of the Council held June 18th, 1894, were read and confirmed.

Major Macdonald reported on behalf of the committee, appointed Aug. 23rd, 1893, to consider and suggest to the Council the name of a suitable gentleman for President of the Association.

The committee had considered the matter referred to them and suggested the name of Lt.-Col. John I. Davidson, 48th Highlanders, for the office.

Moved by Major Macdonald, seconded by Inspector Johnson,

“That the Report of the Committee be received and adopted.” Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Col. Otter, seconded by Lieut. Pringle.

“That Lt.-Col. John I. Davidson, 48th Highlanders, be President of the Association. Carried.

The newly elected President then entered the room and the Chairman informed him that he had been elected President of the Association. Lt.-Col. Davidson then addressed the meeting and thanked the Council for the honour done him in electing him President of the Association.

The President took the chair.

Major Macdonald reported on behalf of the Special Committee appointed June 18th, to consider what changes, if any, are necessary and advisable in the Constitution of the Association.

The Committee had met and thoroughly discussed the question submitted to them and decided to report as follows:—(See Constitution.)

The meeting then discussed the proposed amended constitution, clause by clause, and the following amendments and additions were decided upon.

Clause 2.—Second line, the word “particularly” to be changed to *especially*.

Clause 8.—Second line, after the word “time,” the words “and manner” to be added, so as to read, “at the same time and manner as the President.”

Clause 5.—Add to this clause, “and entitling five members of the Association who have never won a prize at any Provincial, Dominion or National Rifle Association, to compete at the Annual Prize Meeting without payment of the individual membership fee.”

Clause 24.—Add to this clause, “the election of representatives from this Association to the Council of the Dominion Rifle Association, and the election of a Committee to select a team from the shooting members of this Association from Ontario to compete in the London Merchants’ Match of the Dominion Rifle Association, to take place at this meeting.”

Clause 28.—Strike out the first word of the last line of this clause, viz: the word *all*.

Clause 27.—In the first line after the word “Executive” add the words “and Finance.”

Moved by Major Macdonald, seconded by Staff-Sergt. McVittie,

“That the report of the Committee on the Constitution as amended be submitted to the annual meeting of members to be held on Wednesday, Aug. 22nd, 1894.” Carried.

The Secretary reported that the Ontario Eight, in 1891, 1892 and 1893, had won the London Merchant’s Match and that no action had been taken by the Council with regard to presenting the successful competitors with medals. The Ontario Eight were also winners in 1888 and 1889, and medals were presented to the team for these years. Ontario did not win the match in 1890. The successful competitors in 1891, 1892 and 1893, expected that medals would be presented to them, following the custom of former years.

The meeting then discussed the matter, when it was

Moved by Major Macdonald, seconded by Lieut. McVittie,

“That a suitable medal be presented to each member of the winning teams in London Merchants’ Match, for the years 1891, 1892 and 1893, with a bar or clasp for each year a competitor is on the winning team. Each member of a successful team to receive one medal only, and a bar or clasp for each year he is on the team. That the following be a committee with power to select and purchase the medals and clasps:—Major Orchard, Staff-Sergt. Harp, Staff-Sergt. McVittie, and the Secretary.” Carried.

Moved by Lieut. Pringle, seconded by Staff-Sergt. Harp,

“That the following stand as a notice of motion:—That at the Annual Matches of 1895, the following Special Prizes be given for competition, viz: 1 Bronze, 1 Silver, and 1 Gold Medal, and 1 Gold Badge to be awarded as follows:—

To the highest aggregate in first day’s shooting—Bronze Medal.

To the highest aggregate in first and second day’s shooting combined—Silver Medal.

To the highest aggregate during all the days shooting during the match—Gold Medal and Gold Badge. The first score made in the 800 yards Extra Series Match after the first day of the meeting to be counted in aggregate of the three days shooting.

An entrance fee of 50 cents, exclusive of ordinary entrance fees, to be charged.”

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The President announced that he had much pleasure in donating \$100 to the funds of the Association.

Moved by Major Macdonald, seconded by Lt.-Col. Jones,

“That the thanks of the Association be tendered to the President for his handsome donation to the funds of the Association.”—Carried.

Meeting adjourned.

On account of this and other expenditures the Association was about \$800 in debt.

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TWENTY-SIXTH  
ANNUAL PRIZE MEETING

OF THE  
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

HELD ON THE LONG BRANCH RIFLE RANGES, TORONTO,

*21st August, 1894, and following days.*

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I.—AFFILIATION.

1. The affiliation fee is \$5 (payable by 16th August), irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, which entitles an Association to a Silver Medal, and free entrance for team prizes in the "Walker Match."
2. Competitors on affiliated teams must have been members in good standing of such Association for at least thirty days previous to the match and no competitor can enter as a member of more than one Association

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II.—MEMBERSHIP.

1. The fee for membership is \$1, irrespective of entrance fees; and all competitors must be members of the Association.
2. Free membership will be granted to any competitor who has never won a prize at any Provincial, Dominion or National Rifle Association Match, and such persons shall be entitled to enter all matches without payment of membership fee.

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III.—ENTRIES.

Entries, accompanied by the fees, for the first eight matches, must be made (upon forms to be obtained from the Secretary) on or before Thursday, 16th August, 1894; other matches during the three days of the meeting

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IV.—POST ENTRIES.

1. Post entries (*10 per cent. extra*) will not be squadded until the regular entries have been provided for.

2. Should the holders of such tickets find it impossible to shoot before the close of the competition, the Council will not hold itself responsible; in such case the entrance fee will be returned.

3. No post entries will be made for any competition after the firing for such competition has commenced.

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#### V.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

1. Competitors *who are prevented from being present* at the Meeting can have the entrance fees they have paid refunded after the Meeting, provided that they return their firing tickets to the Secretary.

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#### VI.—TRANSIT.

By arrangement with the Grand Trunk and Canadian Pacific Railways, competitors will be carried to and from the Meeting at one fare for the return trip upon applying to the station agent at the starting point for a certificate, which is to be signed at Toronto by the Secretary of the Association as proof that competitors attended the meeting. These reduced fare tickets will be good from August 18th until three days after the close of the Matches.

Competitors from west of Toronto desiring to compete also at D. R. A. Matches, will be sold single tickets to Ottawa, allowing stop over privileges at Toronto.

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#### VII.—QUARTERS.

1. Competitors desirous of camping on the ranges may obtain a tent and ten blankets on payment of \$1.50, or a tent alone for \$1.

2. Good meals at reasonable prices can be obtained at the Competitors' Pavilion on the Ranges.

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#### VIII.—EFFICIENCY.

Non-Commissioned Officers and men competing in the "Canada Company," "Tait-Brassey," and "Gzowski" Matches will be required to produce Certificates from the Commanding Officer or Adjutant of their Corps, stating that they are regularly enrolled and efficient members of the same.

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#### IX.—RIFLES.

The Rifles shall be:

1. Snider or Martini-Henry Rifles of *bona-fide* Government pattern, and bearing the Imperial Government viewer's mark.

2. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs.

3. Sights must be strictly in accordance with Government pattern, and may be *temporarily* coloured with black or white, so long as no application of a permanent nature is used; one permanent centre line for the Snider and three lines for the Martini-Henri will be allowed. The sliding bar may be reversed; *temporary* marks or lines removable at pleasure may be used. No paper or paper sights pasted on sliding bar will be allowed.

4. Any pad or shoe for the heel-plate of the butt, admitting of removal, and thereby allowing of variation at pleasure in the length of the stock, will be disallowed.

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#### X.—UNIFORM.

Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and men competing for prizes restricted to the Militia, must appear in the authorized full dress or undress uniform of their Corps. Officers need not wear sword belts, nor Officers of Rifle Corps cross belt. Cap covers may be worn. Uniforms to be fastened, and the heel-plate of the rifle to rest against the outside of the uniform when firing. Waist belts must be worn except when firing. In the Gzowski Match the above rules shall not apply as special details for dress are issued.

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#### XI.—AMMUNITION.

In all competitions except the Revolver, the cost of ammunition is included in the cost of entries. The Register Keepers will furnish competitors with the necessary number of rounds at each range. No other ammunition shall be used.

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#### XII.—SIGHTING SHOTS.

One Sighting Shot must be fired at each range in all the Regular Matches (Nos. 1 to 7 inclusive), but will not be allowed in the Revolver and Extra Series Matches. The cost of the Sighting Shot is included with the entries.

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#### XIII.—POSITION.

In the "Standing Position" the whole of the left hand and wrist must be in front of the trigger guard and the left elbow clear of the body. "Kneeling Position" to be the ordinary Military Kneeling Position. No competitor will be allowed to sit on the side of his foot, instead of on the heel, and no article of any kind shall be placed under the instep. Any Position—If back position is used no artificial support to the body external to the clothing will be allowed.

XIV.—TARGETS.

1. The size of the targets will be for the regular matches :—

At 200 yards—

4 feet square ; Bull's Eye, 8 inches in diameter ; Inner, 20 inches in diameter ; Magpie, 32 inches in diameter ; Outer, remainder of the target.

At 400, 500 and 600 yards—

6 feet square ; Bull's Eye, 2 feet in diameter ; Inner, 3 feet in diameter ; Magpie, 4 feet in diameter ; Outer, remainder of the target.

At 800 and 900 yards—

6 feet high by 12 feet wide ; Bull's Eye, 3 feet in diameter ; Inner, 4 feet 6 inches in diameter ; Magpie, 6 feet square ; Outer, remainder of the target.

For the "Revolver" Match—

The Standard Revolver Target will be used. Diameter 12½ inches ; Diameter of Bull's Eye, 1¼ inches. Remainder of Target divided into 6 rings, each ring to count from 1 to 6 points, Bull's Eye, 7 points.

XV.—SIGNALLING AND SCORING.

1. Hits will be signalled at the butt and entered on the firing ticket according to the following scale :—

Inner . . . . .	Red Arm . . . . .	4 "

Ricochet . . . .	Black Bar . . . . .	R

2. When two shots strike the target simultaneously, both hits will be marked, and that which has the highest value will be given to the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire.

3. In the event of the Marker accidentally displaying more than one signal arm, he shall immediately correct the error, and the marking as finally signalled cannot be questioned ; no competitor shall be allowed to claim more than the actual value of his shot by reason of such an error in signalling ; but if a shot is not signalled, the competitor shall be entitled to challenge it, and the Range Officer shall telephone to the Non-Commissioned Officer at the butt to examine the target, and the result of such examination shall be final.

4. The competitor thus challenging a shot must deposit the sum of fifty cents, which will be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.

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5. If on a target being raised the *spotting disc* appears manifestly to disagree with the *signal arm*, the Register Keeper shall stop the firing at the target, and report the circumstances to the Range Officer, who shall decide the shot after enquiry of the Non-Commissioned Officer in charge at the butt, but no deposit will be required, nor shall there be any appeal from the decision given.

6. All claims for shots must be made before another shot is fired at the target in question.

7. All alterations of the register must be initialed by the Range Officer, but no alterations, except in the case of a clerical error, shall be made without his having first telephoned to the butt.

XVI.—PENALTIES AND FINES.

*Disqualification.*

1. Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own ; or
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so ; or
- (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target ; or
- (d) Who shall offer money or a bribe of any kind to an employé of the Association, under any pretence whatever ; or
- (e) Who, being cognizant of any attempt to defraud the Association, shall fail to report the same with due diligence to the Council or to the Executive ; or
- (f) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Executive Committee may consider to be discreditable ; or
- (g) Who shall be reported to the Council or Executive Committee as having elsewhere been guilty of any of the aforesaid offences ;

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council or Executive Committee, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be forever disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association.

*Exclusion from further Competition during the Meeting.*

2. Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up ; or
- (b) Who shall discharge his rifle on the ranges, except in accordance with the regulations for shooting ; or
- (c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except on the firing points in use, and within the hours of shooting ; or
- (d) Who through his own want of care shall accidentally discharge his rifle ; or
- (e) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous ; or
- (f) Who shall refuse to comply with any order that may be given by the officer in charge of the firing point to which he is detailed ;

shall upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the Meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

*Disallowance of Score.*

3. Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize; or
- (g) Who shall infringe any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the Meeting while shooting for any particular prize; or
- (c) Who when competing for an aggregate prize shall omit to enter, or enter incorrectly, his previous score or scores on the ticket provided for the purpose;

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, have his score for that particular prize disallowed.

*Fines.*

- 4. Any competitor who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target shall be fined one dollar.

XVII.—TIES.

Ties will be decided as follows, except when otherwise specially laid down. In each case should sub-section 1 prove inapplicable, or not decide the tie, then by sub-section 2 and so on, taking the sub-sections in succession until the tie can be decided.

IN INDIVIDUAL COMPETITIONS.

- 1. If at more than one distance, by the range totals in order of distances, commencing with the longest.

- If still a tie. 2. By the fewest ..... *Outers.*
- “ 3. By the fewest ..... *Magpies.*
- “ 4. By the fewest ..... *Inners.*
- “ 5. By the value of each shot in inverse order.

In case of absolute ties :

- (a) If for Money Prizes, by division.
- (b) If for prizes in kind, by shooting off.
- (c) If for Prizes partly in Money and partly in kind, by dividing the money and shooting off for the Prize in kind.

These sub-sections apply also to competitions at single distances.

Note.—In the case of ties in which all concerned will win money prizes of equal value, and in the case of absolute ties not decided by shooting off, the winners' names will be arranged in a bracket.

IN TEAM COMPETITIONS.

- 1. If at more than one distance, by the aggregate range totals in order of distances, commencing with the longest.
- 2. By the fewest ..... *Outers.*
- 3. By the fewest ..... *Magpies.*
- 4. By the fewest ..... *Inners.*
- 5. By the total of each round in inverse order.
- 6. By the highest scorer in each team shooting off.



## XVIII.—PRIZE WINNERS.

Winners of Prizes must apply at the Treasurer's Office on the Ranges for them, and on receiving the amount of such prizes sign a receipt for the same.

## XIX.—GENERAL REGULATIONS.

The meeting will be under the direction of an Executive Committee, composed of five members of the Council, three of whom shall form a quorum, whose decision shall be final and binding in all matters submitted to them for their consideration; but they may, at their discretion, refer any questions to the decision of the Council, in which case the decision of the Council on such questions shall be final.

The Executive Committee will meet each day at gun for "cease fire" noon and evening.

1. All competitors will be subject to the Executive Committee, Officers or Non-Commissioned Officers in charge of their respective ranges or squads, the Camp Police, and the General Regulations for the conduct of the meeting.
2. Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the General Regulations of the meeting, as also with the conditions attached to the prize or prizes for which they have entered, *as the plea of ignorance of such regulations and conditions will not be entertained.*
3. They must refer to the Notice Boards daily, and ascertain whether any orders have been issued which alter or affect the original details.
4. They must be present at their proper firing point, ready to fire at hour named on their firing tickets and deliver the same to the Register Keeper. Blowing off and all other preliminaries must be done beforehand. Unless a competitor produces his firing ticket at the firing point, he will not be allowed to fire. Should a competitor lose his firing ticket, omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, and so *by his own neglect* miss the opportunity given him of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, he shall have no claim on the Association thereunder.
5. The Matches will take place, if possible, at the time named. Any deviations from the rule will be posted on the Board at the Secretary's Office. Temporary discontinuance on account of bad weather will be at the discretion of the Executive Committee.
6. The firing will begin daily at 8.30 a.m., and cease at 6 p.m.
7. Two guns will be fired for the firing to commence, one ten minutes before the named hour, to warn competitors to move to the firing points; the second being the signal that firing is to begin. Two guns also at the "Cease Fire," one ten minutes before the named hour, after which no competitor will be allowed to begin his score; the second as a signal that all the scores begun before the first gun, are completed.
8. Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.
9. No hair triggers will be allowed.

10. Slings may be used as an assistance at all matches; but in those restricted to the Militia the slings must be of regulation length (viz., 54½ inches, not including the tongue or buckle) and pattern, and attached to the rifles, as in government arms.

11. "Blowing off" shall not be allowed at the firing points, or after competitors have taken their position for firing. Pits will be provided at places near the firing points where competitors can "blow off" *before joining their squads* on presentation of a "blow off" ticket, which will be sold for five cents each and will include the cost of *one* round of ammunition to be obtained from the person in charge, on delivery of the ticket.

12. Competitors may clean out their rifles during a competition between distances only.

13. No two competitors shall fire with the same rifle in the same match; nor shall a competitor change his rifle during a match, unless it becomes unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified by the Range Officer.

14. Every competitor must enter and shoot under his own name, and unless otherwise specified, not oftener than once for any prize.

15. No member of a squad or firing party shall absent himself without leave during firing. Any competitor delaying the squad will be passed by.

16. No competitor shall load his rifle until he has taken his position at the firing point.

17. In all competitions except "The Gzowski" competitors will be formed up by threes, according to the numbers on their firing tickets, viz., the lowest number on the left, the highest on the right, the intermediate numbers in the middle, and fire shot and shot *alternately*, commencing from the left. Only competitors firing will be allowed within the firing ropes. No person, except the Register Keeper, or Officers on duty, will be permitted to speak or offer any advice to a competitor after he has taken his place at the firing point.

18. Where only one competitor is present he must fire his shots without undue delay; but the Range Officer or some one named by him must witness the shooting and countersign the Register.

19. Register Keepers are required to call out the value of each shot fired, and the competitors must see that their scores are correctly entered on the Score Board, so that any objection to the score recorded may be investigated before the next shot is fired. The Range Officer is required to see that each score recorded on the firing ticket corresponds with that on the Score Board.

20. In individual competitions, a competitor may use a binocular or telescope, *not mounted on any kind of stand*, provided his doing so does not delay the firing.

21. Names of individuals comprising teams must be handed in to the Secretary on the cards supplied for the purpose, as follows:

The Canada Company—Not later than 10 a.m. on Tuesday the 21st August.

The Walker Match—Not later than 12.30 p.m. on Wednesday the 22nd August.

The Tait-Brassey Match—Not later than 5 p.m. on Wednesday the 22nd August.

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22. In all team competitions (the Gzowski excepted) the Captain or Officer in command of a Team, and in individual aggregate competitions (the Mulock and No. 1 Extra Series) the competitor must hand in to the Statistical Office, a claim card with the scores made by the Team or individual, as the case may be, duly completed and signed within one hour after the conclusion of the match, otherwise the score will not be allowed.

23. Any competitor protesting against the ruling of a Range Officer, or feeling himself aggrieved in any way must make a statement of his grievances in writing, giving the names of two or more persons who can bear him out in his statements, and hand it to the Secretary; but the firing must not be delayed for that purpose.

24. No practice will be allowed on the ranges during the continuance of the meeting, either before or after the day's firing.

2ND EVENT, VOLLEY FIRING—5 rounds advancing and 5 rounds retiring.

ENTRANCE FEE FOR BOTH EVENTS—\$5 each team, including ammunition. The aggregate score in both events to count.

First Prize, \$40 and the "Gzowski" Challenge Cup; Second Prize, \$30; Third Prize, \$25; Fourth Prize, \$20; Fifth Prize, \$15; Sixth Prize, \$10. Total, 6 Prizes. \$140.

The "Gzowski" Challenge Cup presented by Colonel Sir Casimir Gzowski, A.D.C. to the Queen, (value \$200), will be awarded to the Team making the highest aggregate in both events. To remain in possession of the winning Corps for one year.

## REGULATIONS.

1. Each Team must parade under the command of an Officer, who need not necessarily belong to the same Corps; the whole to be under the command of an Officer appointed by the Executive Committee.
2. In the Skirmishing Event targets will be exposed to view for fifteen seconds for each round, and one shot only must be fired by each man, during each exposure of the targets; sights may be adjusted at any time, but rifles must not be loaded until the targets appear.
3. In the Volley Firing Event targets will remain stationary until the ten rounds are fired. One to three points will be deducted for each bad or indifferent volley at the discretion of the officer in command of the whole.
4. Ricochet shots will be counted the same value as direct hits.
5. The targets will be 6 feet square and have on them three black silhouette figures representing men firing in the kneeling position. The bottom of the target will be placed on a level with the crest of the parapet. Hits on the target on or touching the figures will count as three points each; hits not touching the figures will count as one point each.
6. When the number of hits on the target exceeds the number of shots allowed in the competition, three points will be deducted for every such hit in excess of the number of shots allowed, unless it be proved that such hits on the target could only have been made by competitors on the team firing more than the authorized number of rounds, in which case that team will be disqualified.
7. Ties in this match will be decided as follows:—For money prizes by division. For the "Gzowski" Challenge Cup, in favor of the Team making the highest score in the Volley Firing. If still a tie, then the Cup is to be held by each Corps, whose Teams are tie, for an equal period of the year.

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
