THIRTIETH SESSION.

Being the Thirteenth under the Synod Act of Incorporation of 1874.

FIRST DAY.

The Synod was convened at London on Tuesday, June 28th, 1887.

Divine Service was held in St. Paul's Cathedral Church at 10 o'clock, a.m.

The Holy Communion was administered to the Clergy and Lay Representatives by the Lord Bishop, assisted by Ven. F. W. Sandys, D.D., Archdeacon of Kent; Rev. Canon Innes, M.A.; Rev. Canon Mullholland; Rev. Canon Hincks, and Rev. Canon Hill, M.A.

The sermon was preached by Rev. Principal Fowell, M.A., from Isaiah liii.

The Synod assembled at 2.30 o'clock p.m., in the Chapter House for business.

The Lord Bishop in the chair.

The appointed prayers were said by Ven. Archdeacon Sandys, D.D.

The rolls of the Clergy and Lay Representatives were then called by their respective Secretaries, when 76 Clergymen and 87 Lay Representatives answered to their names.

The ballot papers were, in accordance with the Canon, distributed to the members of the Synod as their names were called.

Report of Committee on Certificates and Assessments.

The report of the Committee appointed by the Bishop to examine the certificates of Lay Representatives, and the assessments of congregations, was presented by the Honorary Lay Secretary, as follows :

The committee appointed to examine the certificates of the Lay Representatives report the number of certificates to be 208, and the number of Representatives elected to be 266.

The committee find the certificates to be correct with the following exceptions :

1. Seaforth returns two delegates, but the chairman states there is no register and does not give number of votes.

The committee cannot certify who is therefore entitled to sit as delegate.

2. Muncey—In this mission no elections were held this year, owing to the absence in England of the clergyman, and therefore last year's delegates hold their seats.

3. Hanover—In this mission the chairman reported Mr. F. Penton elected delegate for Hanover. Mr. Penton writes to say that this is a mistake, that he was not elected, but that Mr. A. E. Goodeve is the delegate duly elected. As Mr. Penton is the churchwarden, and as the chairman is absent from the Diocese, the committee recommend the Synod to allow Mr. Goodeve to take his seat.

The following new congregations have been formed and the committee recommend their assessment at \$2 each, Berkley, Egremont, Granton, Kimberly, Langton, North Bruce, Trowbridge.

The Bishop's Address.

His Lordship then delivered his annual charge to the Synod, as follows :

REVEREND BRETHERN AND BRETHERN OF THE LAITY :—

On assembling again, after the mercies of another year, it is meet and right to begin by thanking God for all His manifested goodness, both towards us and the land in which we live.

You will be thankful to hear that an examination of our financial report, as rendered by our Secretary-Treasurer, reveals the pleasing fact that the past year, though pre-eminently one of transition and trial, has exhibited in some directions a material and encouraging advance. It is quite true indeed that this advance has not been uniform and we have even to note two instances in which our receipts have fallen short of 1886, yet, after weighing the causes which have been at work to produce such results, we still have every reason to be thankful for the general statement of the year. In saying that the past year has been one of "transition," I mean that two kinds of parishes have been passing through a state which is more or less trying to themselves and the Diocese at large. In the *first* place there are those which, having nobly relinquished all external aid, are now for the first time experiencing the gravity of absolute independence; these may possibly imagine, though the supposition is incorrect, that they require all their resources to meet the many exigencies of their new existence, and that therefore they have but little to contribute to the general fund. Justice, however, compels me to say that this principle has not obtained with all, but that on the contrary some have given more, thus proving that which I have before strongly affirmed, that just in proportion as parishes exercise the Divine grace of self-sacrifice will their power to help others intensify and expand. Indeed, if anyone would wish to see a mill-stone round the neck of a church, they will see it in almost every instance where a rich endowment has obviated the necessity of sacrifice, and has crushed out, through its benumbing power, all those tender graces of sympathy and love which are more vital to its spiritual growth than the fabled wealth of Ormus and of Ind.

In the next place, there are other parishes which, though not cut off from all Diocesan aid, have had their grants so largely

reduced that no doubt they fear their ability to meet the increased demands which their altered circumstances necessitate.

Another element which greatly influences our balance is that of 'Special Donations,' which from their very nature are irregular. Last year a member of St. Paul's, London, munificently gave \$1,000; a member of St. John's, London Township, \$100 to our funds above and beyond all our collections in ordinary; sums which swelled the totals, without being regular sources of income.

And yet I know not any reason why a deepening, expanding sense of God's goodness toward us should not bring in a perfect river of thankful offerings to the honor of His name and glory of His cause. Gratitude's sweetest voice is a tireless, ceaseless activity; showing itself forth not only with our lips, but in our lives; and therefore I would hail with devout satisfaction more of such like offerings—coming spontaneously from grateful hearts as the joyous expression of their indebtedness to God.

And here I have pleasure in mentioning an act, not only graceful in itself, but worthy of all imitation; I refer to the princely munificence of Mr. Thos. Trivett, of Exeter. This gentleman has not, like so many others, left his benefactions to codicil and will; he has become his own almoner, and is now about, with his own hands, to present to the Church of England in Exeter, a gift which cannot but elicit your praise. He offers generously to erect at his own expense a commodious church, finishing it in all respects, even to stained glass windows. The chief burthen which he leaves to the congregation being that of providing a new lot, organ and furnace, which in these days of costliness will sufficiently tax the energies of the parish.

In concluding this subject, permit me to say, that if we would advance the Kingdom of our Lord in this or any other Diocese the one great truth we need to have burnt into our hearts, and into the hearts of all our people is:—That the Church of Christ is not a human but a *Divine* institution; that she came forth from God and goes to God; that she was conceived in His mind, created by His power, redeemed by His blood; is sustained by His grace and will finally be received into His presence. Too often the Church forgets that her strength is neither in the smiles of the great, nor the affluence of the rich, but in her living Head, in whom all fulness dwells. Business men, anxious for some great charter of liberties, do not waste their time at some roadside village; their goal is the capital, where the whole governmental power of the nation dwells, and thither they haste as fast as steam can take them. The church however lingers upon the road. She seems to have forgotten where is her seat of government. She takes a title to act from society and

the world at large and begs for alms where her Lord would make her rich. The power that rules this world—that rules all worlds—is in her risen Head. Let Christians therefore hasten to Him, and in His fulness find their everlasting strength.

If a church is to be planted, souls to be saved, money to be obtained, where lies the secret of success? Surely not in popular favor, in human strength and will, but in His solitary blessing who is exalted as Head over all. If the church would only exercise more faith in His unchanging love, more faith in His priestly sacrifice, more faith in His abiding presence, she would soon put on her beautiful garments and shine in the brightness of her Lord.

THE COMMUTATION FUND.

The proper adjustment of this fund, which has so long exercised the minds both of the clergy and laity of the Diocese, and been the fertile cause of so much trouble and animadversion, will, I trust, through the blessing of God, be happily effected this year. It has long been felt, and with great justice, that men who have borne the burthen and heat of the day—who have long and faithfully discharged the many and arduous duties of their calling—ought, especially in advancing years, to receive something more than the mere regulation allowance, which, however small, is all that the state of our funds will at present permit. The absolute justice of such a claim has not to my knowledge been denied by any, the only question has been, by what process could such a desirable augmentation be effected? The answer given by some to this question has been, that all the moneys accruing to the Diocese on the death of commuted men might legitimately be applied to this object; others have conscientiously objected to this plan on the ground that the expansive power of the Diocese would thereby be seriously curtailed. Last year the Synod directed the Executive Committee to take the whole question of the disposition of the surplus commutation fund into full consideration, and to report thereon to the next meeting of the Synod, and I am happy to say that as far as I can gather, the sub-committee, especially appointed for this work, has at least most conscientiously endeavored to master all the difficulties of the question, and to bring in a canon which will, I trust, when fully explained, meet the theories and views of all. The principle of the proposed canon is: That in the administration of Diocesan funds for the maintenance of the clergy, seniority of service is to be recognised. In order to effect this, the fund now known as the mission fund, the sustentation fund and the surplus commutation fund will be united, and a scale of grants such as follows be adopted:—

Subject to the proviso in Clause 4.

Proviso I. That if the available income of the Clergy Maintenance Fund be at any time insufficient to provide incomes according to the foregoing scale, then a *pro rata* reduction, to meet such deficiency, may be made by the Maintenance Committee, of all incomes except those of Deacons.

Proviso II. Provided that the seniority of the Clergy shall be calculated by the number of years of active service in the Diocese actually completed on the 30th June in each year.

That no Deacon receiving \$600 per annum, or Priest \$800 per annum, at the time of the passing of this Canon, shall be adversely affected by its provisions. No clergyman shall be entitled to receive from the Fund a sum exceeding \$400 per annum.

That there may be differences of opinion on the various clauses of the proposed Canon, I am free to admit, but I trust all will see in it, an earnest, manly effort to grapple with the many and serious difficulties of the case; and that now our sympathizing laity will unite their influence to pass some such measure as this, whereby the means of some of the most devoted, faithful and self-denying men in the church of Christ may speedily and materially be augmented. I now know something of their homes, their parishes, their work, how much they do, how little they complain, and therefore, if there is anything you can do with ready hands and loving, sympathizing hearts to cheer their path and place them beyond the inexorable demands of want; that something, I am sure, you will gladly do. and the gratitude of many a Christian worker, now harassed and perplexed, will be no mean part of the recompense of your reward.

WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

This is one of the oldest and most useful Funds in the Diocese. The bylaw by which it was first formed and administered took effect from the 1st day of November, 1857. In the year 1860, the year I had the honor of entering this Diocese, I find that the whole Fund as invested amounted to \$11,414.49. To-day it stands at \$60,315.30. Upon this Fund there are now 26 beneficiaries, drawing \$5,050; but as the whole income derived from the Fund last year was only \$5,215.76, and as at any time still further calls may be made upon it, prudence would dictate our doing all in

our power to increase its needed efficiency. The sources from which this Fund is replenished are threefold: First, the yearly subscriptions of the Clergy, which now go directly to its credit; secondly, the two Diocesan collections, one of which dates from the origination of the Fund, the other from the year 1873; and thirdly, the various bequests which have from time to time been made to it by the good will of its friends, whose generous example, let us readily believe, will be followed by others. As these three sources are, however, apparently inadequate to advance the Fund at a sufficient ratio, I now commend it to your notice, in order that by due oversight and care you may obviate any future necessity for abridging the present moderate grants made to the widows and orphans of deceased clergymen.

HURON COLLEGE.

I desire to say that under the able and judicious management of the present Principal, the Rev. R. G. Fowell, whose presence among us is a valuable addition to our staff, Huron College is fast attaining a highly prosperous and satisfactory condition. Deeply interested himself in the welfare of the young men, the Principal is throwing all his energies into the great work before him with the most commendable zeal and with the most beneficial results. And I doubt not, should God in His infinite kindness spare him, the College will ere long take a very high position among the theological institutions of our country. During the course of the past spring, the efficiency of the College has been further increased by the appointment as tutor of the Rev. David Williams, of Lampeter College and Oxford. I may add in this connection, that our valued and honored friend, the Very Reverend Dean Boomer still survives, in what is for him comparative health. As one who always faithfully and lovingly taught in this College the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and illuminated by his walk the principles which he upheld, his name will ever be gratefully remembered within its walls. May his Heavenly Father ever sustain him and increase each day the measure of his faith.

For the information of the Synod I desire to state that the Council of Huron College will in future require of all those seeking admission as students:

First—That they shall obtain a certificate from a medical examiner as to their physical ability for the arduous duties of the Christian ministry.

Secondly - That they shall satisfy a Committee of Preliminary Enquiry as to their financial position and other personal matters, in order that their future usefulness may not be impaired by any of those distressing weights which too often hinder otherwise useful men from running the race that is set before them.

Thirdly—To pass a matriculation examination before being admitted on the list of probationers.

Thus with God's blessing every effort will be made to increase the usefulness and efficiency of the College; to enable it not only to claim but unreservedly to receive, the generous sympathy of the Diocese at large, as the consecrated instructress of a noble band of youths, intellectually endowed on the one hand by the Ministerial gifts of the Spirit, and graciously enriched on the other by the fulness of His presence; able and willing to preach with power among us the riches of God's love in Christ.

THE PRESSING NEED OF THE CHURCH.

The great need, not only of this Diocese, but of the Church at large, is a deeper Christianity; a closer, more vital union with its living Head. The professing Church, which, in the days of the Apostles, lived on the line of equatorial blessing, where all the sunlight, warmth and glory of her Redeemer's presence rested on her, has in these days wandered north, and is now like the Esquimaux, living amid the biting chills of ice and snow. The result is awfully apparent. Instead of a mighty, fiery life, we have a miserable, half-frozen out Christianity; ministers that should be "a fire set on fire," paralysed with cold; congregations more dead than alive—great lumps of solid ice instead of streams of living water; the death-like silence of the north instead of the minstrelsy of the south. What can live in the inhospitable north? The noble Franklin and his companions froze to death there, fruit trees and flowers die there, and yet the Church is trying to grow there the garden of the Lord. The holy fruits of righteousness will not grow at so great a distance from the sun. What the Church needs is a great southern migration—an irresistible centripetal energy drawing her back again to her Redeemer's side, where light and heat for ever have their home.

We hear in these days, much of the unity of the Catholic Church. It has been well remarked, that as the spokes come nearer the centre of the wheel, they come nearer each other, and that thus it is only as Christians come nearer the living, central Christ, can they possibly approach each other and realise the unity of faith. Christianity can never accomplish a real, vital union unless through the one centre, Christ. The distant radii are travelling farther from each other every minute; those approaching the centre are drawing nearer every moment. In conclusion, I would say, live in the very immediate presence of Christ; in holy abiding union with Him, and then each day you will realise His power; the unity of His faith, and the oneness of His body. If a congregation is living near its spiritual centre, and its minister afar off, at the extremity of a prolonged radius, or *vice versa*, the two cannot possibly agree; they are walking

on different planes, and see everything from a different light. If, however, they will unite in the immediate presence of their Lord, they will have immediate fellowship one with another; and the blood of Jesus Christ cleanse them from all their sin.

ST. PAUL'S CATHEDRAL.

I desire to inform the Synod that I have completed arrangements with the Rector and Vestry of St. Paul's Church, London, by which that church will become the Cathedral Church of the Diocese. The basis of settlement will be that known as the "Montreal Agreement," by which the separate qualities of Cathedral and Parish Church are strictly and accurately defined. The church, according to this arrangement, will be in its cathedral capacity at all times of Synodical service, and on occasions when Episcopal functions are being performed; also on certain festival seasons as Christmas, Easter, etc. The Canons, when present, will be assigned their appropriate places by the Bishop, and the church be in its cathedral, to the exclusion of its parochial, capacity on all and every occasion defined by the compact.

I wish particularly to impress upon the Diocese that this arrangement is not intended to supersede or destroy the long-cherished plan of a separate Cathedral according to the Act of Incorporation by which the present Chapter is constituted. On the contrary, it is only made as an interim arrangement until such time as the path shall be opened for the prosecution of the original design. A clause expressive of my ability to make any further change is inserted in the deed of agreement.

THE CENTENARY OF THE CANADIAN EPISCOPATE.

At the last meeting of the Provincial Synod, it was arranged that simultaneous services should be held throughout all the Dioceses of the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada, commemorative of the foundation of the Colonial Episcopate, in the year 1787. It was also agreed that the offertory of each Diocese should be devoted to the building of a Cathedral in Halifax, the city in which the Episcopate was first founded a hundred years ago. The date assigned for these commemorative services was the 19th of June, but I must confess that the time wholly escaped me, and that when reminded of the fact, it was too late to rectify the mistake. I have therefore sent word to the general committee that, God willing, I will notify the Diocese, and appoint the service for the last Sunday in July. I think in the end this will prove to some of the Clergy a practical benefit, as it will enable them to procure certain details concerning the history of the Canadian Episcopate which may not be at their command to-day.

THE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY.

Permit me again to draw your earnest attention to the rapidly increasing usefulness of this noble adjunct to our Diocesan work. Established, as is well known, in the city of Ottawa, in the year 1884, after the model of the great *Women's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions* in the Protestant Episcopal Church of the United States—a society which has done, and is doing, an almost incredible amount of good—it has since received the sanction of all our Bishops, and is now in full operation in every Diocese in this Ecclesiastical Province. In the face of the following considerations I cannot too earnestly recommend the society for your vigorous adoption and support :

First. That to ignore the invaluable agency of Christian women in the spiritual work of the church is a most serious, if not fatal, mistake. I have now confirmed throughout the Diocese some thousands of candidates, the vast majority of whom were young women, apparently in the full vigor of health and activity, and therefore, if their profession of the name of Christ was not an idle form, there ought surely now to be found many an earnest woman in every parish only waiting for some avenue of usefulness where her faith may grow and her hands may work. The principles which are to guide, and the laws which are to regulate the Auxiliary are now all distinctly formulated, having received the full approval of the Venerable Metropolitan of Canada, and therefore, now, nothing remains but to find in every parish earnest and self-sacrificing workers to carry them out to a speedy and successful issue.

Secondly. The almost bewildering vastness of the work before us—at home, in the north of this continent—and abroad, in the great field of foreign missions, calls for a far more vigorous life and self-sacrificing spirit than any which we have yet exhibited. Great as is the work being done by the mother church of England, or by the sister church of the United States, yet so much remains, that to be half hearted is a shame ; to do nothing is a sin. Notwithstanding all that has been done for India, there are yet more aboriginal races wholly untouched by any Christian teacher. Among the five millions of Papuans in New Guinea there are only to-day three Protestant Missionaries. So vast is the population of China that it is computed if the world passed before us in single file every twelfth individual would be an inhabitant of China, and yet of this inconceivable host only about 100,000 attend the services of the reformed faith. The income of the Venerable Society for the propagation of the Gospel for the last year was £105,711 ; that of the Church Missionary Society, nearly £199,000 ; yet of this total amount, £304,711, our church only contributed a trifling sum, and this in the face of the fact that we have no Foreign Missionaries

of our own in the field, and no outside burthens except the small allowances we make to the North West Dioceses of Canada.

In this connection, I am happy to state that, God willing, next spring one of our body will be going forth for actual duty in the foreign field. The Rev. Cooper Robinson, whom I ordained Deacon last autumn, has opened communications with the Bishop of Japan and expects to leave at the time stated for the distant scene of his labors. He will go forth, I am sure, with our earnest prayers and loving sympathies, not only that he may be abundantly sustained himself, but that his departure may be the earnest of a goodly band yet to follow, who, in lands beyond the seas, will demonstrate our interest in the great evangelization of the world.

And as for duties nearer home ; the yearly wants of our own fast increasing Diocese ; the missionary fields of Algoma, with its Benevolent Jubilee Fund and other kindred calls, all of which I would recommend to your notice ; the great Northwest, pleading, but almost in vain, for help, constitute so many more persuasive arguments why we should help on this and every other Auxiliary, which will enable us to be more efficient in the doing of the Master's will.

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND TEMPERANCE SOCIETY.

I am constrained again to address you on the great subject of temperance reform. You are aware that the principles which have been adopted in this Diocese as the basis of our action, are those of the Church of England Temperance Society ; a society which, by the advocacy of optional pledges, is surely competent to overcome the prejudices of all. There are some, from conscientious motives, no doubt, unable to go the whole way of total abstinence, who yet are quite willing to accord their full sympathy to any well-directed effort on the lines of temperance reform. They feel there is something they *can* do, even if they are not foremost in the van ; they can help on and encourage others, and show both by word and deed their true affection for the cause. The one thing that we clergymen can not do in the face of the awful carnage drink is making, is to do nothing. Something *ought* to be done, something *must* be done to arrest its progress, and therefore if a clergyman cannot go the whole way of total abstinence, I would say, let him at least urge upon his people the secondary pledge, which, I understand, has been of enormous value in encouraging temperance reform. But to do nothing ; to shrug one's shoulder as this great river of human sorrow rushes madly by, and say, " We cannot help it ; people ought not to give way to such blind passion," is to incur a great and terrible responsibility from which we should all be free. Most emphatically would I urge the formation, in every parish of the Diocese, of the Church of England Temperance Society, with its dual pledge, its

Christian character, and its vigorous life. Most earnestly also would I recommend the establishing, throughout the Diocese, of children's temperance bands, appropriately known as Bands of Hope. The children of to-day are to be the men and women of to-morrow ; and if there are any strong and wholesome principles which should be dominant among those who follow us, let us by every means engrave them upon their minds while yet in the fresh and docile period of youth. The coral insect, to use the illustration of another, is a poor and fragile creature in itself, but as each coral has died, it has left its tiny body as its contribution to the growing reef beneath the sea ; and to-day that reef can stay the tides of the Pacific, and mock the terrific fury of its waves.

THE QUEEN'S JUBILEE.

At a time like the present, when the whole empire is laying its homage at the feet of the Queen, and acknowledging the justice, the integrity and the righteousness of her reign, we, too, will take our part and join our humble voices with all those who, not only within, but beyond her realm, to-day rehearse her praise.

Characters, like the works of man, are tested by time, and many a brilliant reputation, built up in the sunlight of prosperity and peace, in the night of affliction passes, like a star into eclipse, from the obscurity of which it can never emerge. The noble woman who to-day sits on the throne of her fathers has had her character tested by the vicissitudes of half a century. She has had under her all kinds of administrations, Conservative, Reform, coalition ; she has governed in times of profoundest peace, and during the fiercest of sanguinary wars ; bowed down herself with the grief of a widowed heart, she, as has been truthfully remarked, has courted the shadow rather than the sunlight, and yet after fifty long eventful years she comes out with her character, if possible, more honored and esteemed than at the first. To-day, however, let me draw your attention particularly to her religious influence in the spreading of the Redeemer's Kingdom, and in the establishment of His Church. In public and in private she has uniformly acknowledged God, that by Him kings reign and princes decree justice. She has subordinated her throne to that "King whom God hath set in Zion, whose dominion is an everlasting dominion, and whose kingdom ruleth over all." Other monarchs have sought to secure the stability of their thrones by colossal armaments, and by the multiplication of the instruments of death ; our Queen has sought to secure hers by the recognition of God and the enthronement of the Prince of Peace. When handing to the Indian potentate a copy of the Bible, she said that that Book was the source of England's wealth and prosperity. The knowledge and

the recognition of this truth has been of more value to her throne than all the armaments and chivalry of Europe.

The pride of Napoleon led him to utter the blasphemy that God was on the side of the army that had the greatest parks of artillery; the reign of our Queen has confirmed what those of others before her demonstrated, that God is on the side of that nation that most honors and upholds His word. Churches—to say nothing of nations—have sometimes forgotten this; the Queen has remembered it, affirmed it, acted upon it; with her it is not a dreamy sentiment, it is a living creed.

On such a woman, and on such a Queen what honors can you now bestow? I will ask you to prepare an address which will embody our respect for her person, her character and her throne, and which, however humble, will contribute its part in cementing those bands of union which clasp this free virgin land of ours to the throne and realm of England.

OBITUARY NOTICES.

I have to record that the following distinguished members of the ministry have passed from the scene of their earthly trials to the blessed presence of their Lord.

The late Right Rev. John McLean, Bishop of Saskatchewan, was not only well known, but highly honored and loved by many in this Diocese. Ordained and appointed curate of St. Paul's, London, in 1859, he labored with great acceptance in this city till 1866, when he removed to the Northwest as Archdeacon of Assiniboia. In 1874 he was consecrated to the See of Saskatchewan. A man of the most wonderful tireless activity, he was a noble model of devotion and zeal. In the vast plains of Saskatchewan, where he doubtless endured great privations, he labored most unremittingly, preaching everywhere with great power the glorious Gospel of the grace of God. His sorrowing widow will have our condolence and sympathy and the whole Canadian Church will long retain him in her memory as one of the greatest and noblest of her sons.

I shall mention also the late Right Rev. Hibbert Binney, Bishop of Nova Scotia. A man of profound erudition, with a heart all full of tenderness and sympathy towards those who were really in distress, he had, I understand, the deep respect and unfeigned attachment of his whole Diocese. And though his views differed in some respects very widely from my own, yet I take a pleasure in saying every kindly word I can in memory of one who was so widely and deservedly esteemed by the Church.

The Venerable Archdeacon Ellwood, late rector of Goderich, will long be remembered among us as one who from the kindness and geniality of his nature had endeared himself to all. Appointed to Goderich in 1849 he set a good example to many of his younger brethren of continuity and fixedness of purpose, for where he went in 1849 there he laid down and died in 1887—a true missionary who, having done his work, fell asleep in Jesus at the post where his Master had placed him. This Synod will extend to his family its loving sympathy and regards.

The Rev. Adam Townley, Honorary Canon of Holy Trinity Cathedral, will long be held in fond and loving memory. Perhaps no one in the Diocese was more widely known or more deservedly esteemed. Of a most affectionate nature himself, he had always the courage of his own convictions, and never failed with all the warmth and vehemence of his spirit to do battle for those principles which were nearest to his heart. Like the late Archdeacon Ellwood, he too remained at his post till the Lord removed him to a higher sphere; and I am sure you will deem it only a chastened pleasure to extend to his sorrowing son your heartfelt sympathy and love.

CONFIRMATIONS.

During the year I have held 57 confirmations, confirming at them 496 males and 846 females, making a total of 1342. The whole number confirmed since my consecration in 1883 is 5716. I may add that I have written out all the names of those confirmed this last year, and intend them, God willing, to be with our public records for the use of the Diocese.

A summary to date of Rev. Mr. Young's work during the twenty months that he has been acting as Commissioner shows 212 stations visited, 24 new stations opened, 11 new missions actually constituted and several others in contemplated formation at an early period, while 16 Parishes that formerly received aid from the mission fund are now self supporting.

It must also be borne in mind that the results of this work are mainly permanent and not transitory, and that provision has been for the early decrease of many existing grants in the ability of Parishes to become more self-supporting.

Reviewing the whole work of the Commissioner, the Committee desire to congratulate the Synod on the kindly support and encouragement which Rev. Mr. Young has received from the Diocese during his visitations.

PARISH ASSESSMENTS.

Under the provisions of Canon 29, a very large amount of the Parish assessments for stipends of the Clergy has been paid in or accounted for to the Secretary-Treasurer.

The accounts show that \$10,227.44 have been received from the Parishes and paid out to the respective clergymen.

DIOCESAN INCOME.

While the total contributions of the Diocese are slightly in excess of last year the Committee have to report that there has been a falling off in the amounts available for Diocesan work. The decrease in this sum amounts to \$1,010.99, this may be chiefly accounted by the fluctuation in special donations extraneous to the ordinary income of the Diocese. Last year these gifts amounted to \$1,175.35 whilst this year only \$176.93 was received, a difference under this head alone of \$998.42.

The Committee are glad, however, to notice that the quarterly collections to the Mission Fund shew an increase this year of 388.71. There is no doubt also but that our income suffered greatly from the excitement and disturbance consequent upon the elections for Parliament taking place just at the period when most of our annual subscriptions are made in the different Parishes.

THE MISSION FUND.

The overdraft of this fund has been slightly increased this year. It is confidently expected that the results of the reorganization and assessments, the full effect of which will only be realized this year, will almost if not altogether extinguish this debt, and the Committee feel that there is a most cheering outlook for the future work and progress of Church extension in the Diocese.

The Committee deem it their duty to point out to the Clergy that, in accordance with the Canon, the omission to make these collections imperils most seriously their position on the Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

The clause is here appended:—

3. "That in order to entitle widows and orphans of any clergyman to enjoy the annuity hereinafter provided, he must, from his ordination or entrance into the Diocese, have become and continued to be an annual subscriber of at least five dollars to the funds of the Synod, or have become a life member of the former Church Society of the said Diocese, and have made all the collections and subscriptions called for the Synod, unless excused therefrom by a written dispensation from the Lord Bishop, giving the reason for such dispensation being granted, which dispensation shall be forwarded by the clergyman holding the same to the Secretary-Treasurer, who shall record it in a book to be kept for that purpose, which book shall be submitted to the Committee for inspection at the meeting in June. That the sums required by this section to be paid by clergymen, be paid on or before the first day of March in each year to the Secretary-Treasurer, to be entered by him in a book to be kept for this purpose, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary-Treasurer to lay before the Standing Committee, at the meeting in the month of June in each year, a list of the names of those clergymen who have not complied with the requirements of this section."

The Committee would also call attention to a practice which has arisen, and which causes serious inconvenience in the management of the finances, the retaining by Church Wardens of collections for the funds and failing to remit them to the Synod office until the close of the year.

There can be no defence to such a course of dealing with funds contributed through the offertory for specific purposes, and it is the bounden duty of the Wardens to transmit the collections without delay.

WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

Pensions amounting to \$5,050 were paid during the year.

The pension list of 26 remains unchanged.

The half-yearly collections are slightly in advance of the previous year.

One hundred dollars has been added to the Capital during the year, making a total of \$60,415.30.

SUPERANNUATION.

Superannuation allowances amounting to \$5,190.90 were paid during the past year. One superannuated clergyman, Rev. Canon Townley, has been removed by death. The number now on the list is 13.

The Committee regret to find any congregation omitting the annual collection in October for Algoma, as it is only from this source that the Diocese is able to keep its pledge of \$700 per annum to the stipend of the Missionary Bishop of Algoma.

WOMEN'S AUXILIARY.

The Committee are much pleased to learn of the successful year's work of the Diocesan Branch of this valuable adjunct to the Board of Missions, and they sincerely trust that its zeal and usefulness may not be confined to the Field of Foreign and Domestic Missions only, but may be extended and utilized for the benefit of all Diocesan Missionary Work.

If this were done, and a branch of the Auxiliary formed in every Parish working in connection with the Parochial Association, the Committee are convinced that the results of their united efforts would be beneficial to all the objects sought to be aided.

THE SEE HOUSE.

The Committee have to report that the subscriptions towards this necessary expenditure are almost altogether neglected by the various Parishes; up to the present date only \$695.03 has been received from the whole Diocese, leaving a debt of \$14,591.68 still to be provided for.

The Committee would recommend the Synod to devise some method of meeting this liability.

ACCOUNTS.

The printed audited accounts shew, as usual, the position of the various funds.

SYNOD ASSESSMENTS AND CERTIFICATES OF LAY DELEGATES.

The attention of the Committee has been called by the Hon. Secretaries of Synod to the very irregular manner of sending in the certificates, and of paying the Synod assessments.

The Committee would recommend that hereafter all certificates, unless of re-election, shall be sent to the Secretaries of Synod six days after the election, as provided by the Constitution, and that all assessments (unless in cases of dispute when referred or appealed to the Synod) shall be paid within the same time. The failure of compliance with the above conditions to be deemed a forfeiture of right to a seat in the Synod to the delegate so in default.

The Committee would also call attention to the large amount of unpaid Synod Assessments, and would desire to express their strong conviction that

LONDON RECTORY SURPLUS.

By mutual consent of the parties interested, acting in a friendly suit, a special case was prepared for submission to the courts. The case has been heard, and judgment given, by Mr. Justice Ferguson, declaring the Township Rectors entitled to participate in the surplus. The judgment has been carried to the Court of Appeal, where it now stands for argument and final decision.

MATTERS REFERRED TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE BY SYNOD OF 1886.

1. Report of Sunday School Committee. No action taken.
2. Disposition of Surplus Commutation Fund. This matter has been fully considered by a sub-committee, and a Canon dealing with the Fund has been prepared for submission to the Synod, and will be found in the convening circular.
3. Petition of Mrs. Dillon. The Committee thoroughly investigated this claim, but as Trustees of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund were unable to approve of Mrs. Dillon's petition to be placed on the Fund, legal proceedings have been commenced by Mrs. Dillon against the Synod, and the Committee have taken the necessary steps to defend the suit.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

The report of the Sunday School Committee was read by the chairman, Rev. Canon Innes.

SUNDAY SCHOOL COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

Your Committee beg to report that the report of the Sunday School Committee, adopted at the last meeting of Synod, was referred to the Executive Committee to carry out, but that Committee has taken no action, consequently we have at the present time no suggestions to make and only to report upon action that has been taken during the past year.

1st. That in furtherance of our work a Sunday School conference was held in the Cronyn Hall on the 26th, 27th and 28th of October last, at the opening of which His Lordship the Bishop kindly preached the inaugural sermon, and presided at every session held. Very excellent papers were read by several clergymen and one by a layman of the city of London. Your Committee regrets that although full notice was given and everything done to promote the attendance of laymen who are interested in Sunday School work very few indeed were able to attend, and we would respectfully suggest to our lay brethren that if these conferences are to accomplish their chief end a deeper practical interest must be taken by them. It is hoped that on a future occasion there may be, not only a larger attendance of clergy, but also of lay Sunday School workers.

2nd. A draft of a constitution was prepared by your Committee and submitted to the Executive Committee, printed and circulated, but no action has been taken.

2. On Religious Instruction in the public schools of Ontario

On motion of the Rev the Provost of Trinity College, seconded by Mr. A. H. Campbell, the following report was adopted by the Synod of the Diocese of Toronto, 16th June, 1887 :

The Committee on Religious Instruction in the Public Schools beg to report that they have held several meetings during the year, and have had under their careful consideration the various objections taken to the Book of Scriptural Selections. The whole Book has been thoroughly examined for this purpose.

Your Committee is of the opinion that the only safe principle upon which such selections can be made is that of retaining, in all cases, the selected passages intact and unmutated from the Holy Scriptures. And further, that the absence of the Scriptural references from the Book of Selections (most of which were removed after the Book left the hands of the Revising Committee) is much to be regretted.

They find that especially in the case of the selections from the poetical and prophetic books a large number of omissions have been made, such as would not have been possible had the attention of the Revising Committee been called to them by the Scriptural references.

Having regard to these considerations, and to the fact that the Book has failed to commend itself to a large portion of the people, your Committee is of opinion, that for the reading of the Bible itself in the Public and High Schools enjoined by the regulations of the Education Department, an authorized calendar of readings, selected by a joint committee appointed by the various religious bodies of Ontario, should be issued by the Government. All of which is respectfully submitted.

COPY OF PROPOSED RESOLUTION FOR SYNOD.

That whereas the Provincial Synod did at its session in September last pass the following resolution and did also at the same time appoint a Committee of two from each of the Dioceses, in the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada, to consider the whole purpose of the resolution and report thereon at the next meeting of the said Provincial Synod:

RESOLUTION.

"That the Upper House be respectfully requested to concur with the Lower House in the appointment of a special Committee to consider the advisability of procuring the incorporation of the Provincial Synod, and also to consider the whole subject of the relative positions of the various Dioceses of this Ecclesiastical Province of Canada with the Provincial Synod, and if required recommend such Legislation as shall so extend the powers of the Provincial Synod, that it may be enabled to legislate for the Canadian Church as a whole in all matters pertaining to Church Government, a uniformity of Canons and of discipline of the Clergy and Laity. And further to consider and advise what Legislation may be necessary in the several Dioceses to bring about the beneficial result of an entire and United Church in the Dominion of Canada. The Committee to report at the next meeting of the Synod."

And Whereas it is advisable to facilitate the work of the said Committee of the Provincial Synod, by ascertaining the views of the various Diocesan Synods on this important matter: *Be it therefore resolved*, "That this Synod do now appoint a Committee of 15 to fully consider the relations now

existing between the various Dioceses and the Provincial Synod, and also, the possibility of uniting the whole Church of British North America under one Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction and further consider how far the interests of the Church in this Diocese may be affected by the objects embraced in the resolution of the Provincial Synod."

The said Committee shall be also authorized to confer with any similar Committees that may be appointed by the other Dioceses.

CANON ON THE DOMESTIC AND FOREIGN MISSIONARY SOCIETY OF THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND IN CANADA.

1. It shall be a standing instruction to the Secretary-Treasurer to pay from the _____ of the Diocese the travelling expenses (or a portion thereof) of the Bishop and the two clergymen and two laymen nominated by this Synod members of the Board of Management of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada, as required by Art. 4 of Canon XIX., Provincial Synod, while attending the meetings of the Board; the appropriations for such expenses in any one year never to exceed

2. There shall be in this Diocese a Corresponding Committee in connection with the Board of Management of the Society, as required by Art. 7, Canon XIX., Provincial Synod.

3. This Committee shall consist of the Bishop of the Diocese, who shall be Chairman and Convener, the clerical and lay members of the Board of Management resident within the Diocese, together with two clergymen and two laymen to be elected annually by the Synod, and to continue in office till their successors are appointed.

4. In the absence of the Bishop, the meeting shall elect a Chairman for the time being.

5. Three members of this Committee shall constitute a quorum.

6. The Committee shall elect a Secretary, who shall be a Corresponding Secretary in connection with the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society, and whose duties shall be:

(a) To aid and promote in the Diocese and in each congregation the work of the Board of Management and the aims of the said Society.

(b) To place in the hands of the Bishop or his commissary, a list of the congregations who many have failed in any year to send in within 28 days a response to the Ascensiontide and Epiphany appeals.

(c) To act as the Bishop's Secretary in communicating with the clergymen of such congregations, and to carry out any directions which the Bishop may give him with the view of securing that the Society shall have a hearing regularly in each congregation at Ascensiontide and Epiphany, and that each congregation shall have the opportunity of con-

(e) To report annually to the Synod of the Diocese the congregations that have contributed to the funds of the Society, together with the amounts contributed, naming also those congregations that may have failed to contribute anything, and furnishing as well, if possible, the reason for such failure.

The Canon as amended and passed :

Canon XXIX. On the Expenditure of the Clergy Maintenance and Mission Fund.

Preamble.—Whereas it is expedient, in the administration of Diocesan Funds for the maintenance of the Clergy, to recognize seniority of parochial service in the Diocese, be it therefore enacted as follows, viz :—

1. There shall be a fund known as the Clergy Maintenance and Mission Fund, which shall consist of the proceeds of such invested funds and general offerings of the Diocese as are available for the purposes of this Canon.

2. That the duty of maintaining the Clergyman and providing him with a residence shall rest primarily upon the parish receiving his services.

3. That no Clergyman shall be a recipient from the Clergy Maintenance and Mission Fund whose parish is deemed able to support him according to the scale hereinafter provided.

4. That every Clergyman shall be entitled to receive from the Clergy Maintenance and Mission Fund such a sum as, with the amount for which, as is hereinafter provided, his parish is assessed, shall suffice to bring his stipend to the amount required, as in the scale hereinafter provided ; but no Clergyman shall receive from this Fund a sum exceeding \$400 per annum.

5 That at the September meeting of the Executive Committee there shall be appointed, annually, from the members of said Executive Committee, a Committee, to be called the Maintenance and Mission Committee, whose duty it shall

be to assess all them able to contribute to the maintenance of each parish for a period of three years, provided that the assessment then be revised. Any other business a

be to assess all the parishes in the Diocese for such sums as the Committee deem them able to contribute towards the maintenance of their Clergymen. The assessment of each parish, when made, shall continue unchanged for a period of three years, provided that if there be a change of incumbency the assessment may then be revised. The Maintenance and Mission Committee shall attend to such other business as the Executive Committee may from time to time direct.

6. That the Maintenance and Mission Committee shall consist of the Bishop, who shall be chairman, and five Clergymen and five Laymen, of whom three of each order shall be elected by ballot by the Executive Committee, and the remainder be nominated by the Bishop. Five members of the Maintenance and Mission Committee shall be a quorum.

7. That within one month after the assessment has been made, the Secretary-Treasurer shall notify the Incumbent of each parish assessed, of the amount of such assessment, such notice to be communicated by him to the Churchwardens. All appeals against assessments shall be signed by the Churchwardens and forwarded to the Secretary-Treasurer not later than one month from the date of such notice. All appeals shall be considered by the Maintenance and Mission Committee, and, if not allowed by them, shall be submitted, with their report, to the Executive Committee at the meeting next ensuing.

8. Whenever it shall be found by the Maintenance and Mission Committee that a parish is more than three months in arrear in the payment of its assessment or that a Clergyman receiving a grant from this Fund the Bishop may, on the recommendation of the Executive Committee, remove the Clergyman in charge of such parish, and shall not fill the vacancy until the arrears are paid and satisfactory assurances are given that the assessment amounts will be duly paid in the future.

9. That the scale of grants shall be as follows :—

In each case such an amount as shall, with the parish assessment, make up the stipend per annum as follows :—

Proviso I. That the above incomes for Priests shall be subject to the proviso in clause 4, and that in the assessment of parishes the provision of a house shall be regarded as equivalent to \$100, except in the case of Deacons.

Proviso II. That if the available income of the Clergy Maintenance and Mission Fund be at any time insufficient to provide incomes according to the foregoing scale, then a *pro rata* reduction, to meet such deficiency, may be made by the Maintenance and Mission Committee, of all incomes except those of Deacons, and Priests entitled to receive less than \$800 per annum.

Proviso III. That the seniority of the Clergy shall be calculated by the number of years of active parochial service in the Diocese actually completed on the 30th June in each year.

10. That only such Clergymen as are ordained by the Bishop of the Diocese, or, having come from another Diocese, have been ordained not more than three years, are not more than thirty years of age, and have not received an outfit therein, and are appointed to a parish necessitating the keeping of a horse, shall receive the sum of \$100 as an outfit, and this sum shall be given upon condition

that at least three years' service be given in the Diocese by the Clergyman receiving the grant.

11. That no Deacon receiving \$600 per annum, or Priest \$800 per annum, at the time of the passing of this Canon shall be adversely affected by the provisions of sub-sections *a, b, c*, of clause 9.

12. That the Canon shall come into force on and after the first day of July, A. D. 1887, but in the case of parishes and missions not assessed at date shall be operative only upon the final completion of their assessments.

13. That Canon XXIX. be and is hereby repealed, and that this Canon be numbered XXIX.

Provided always, that if such suspension or removal be for less than three years or be revoked within three years, the sentenced clergyman may revive his claim on the Widows' and Orphans' Fund by paying to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod all arrears of entrance money or annual subscriptions due by him at the time of or subsequent to the passing of sentence.

Should a Clergyman, sentenced to suspension or removal for a stated period not exceeding three years, die while under sentence, his widow and family shall be entitled to enjoy the benefits of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund on payment of all arrears, as required in the preceding clause. But this clause shall not apply to any case in which sentence has been passed without such express limitation.

No Clergyman who has been sentenced to suspension or removed from the exercise of Clerical functions for an indefinite period shall be restored to the exercise of such functions in this Diocese until a commission of five Clergymen—to be appointed by the Bishop from the Clerical members of the Executive Committee—or a majority of them shall, after due inquiry, have reported to the Bishop that in their opinion the sentence passed on such Clergyman may be revoked without injury to the interests of the church.
