A GOOD BUSINESS MAN.

The Sun takes up the greater part of two long editorial columns this morning, in a laudatory attempt to prove that the people of St. John need Mr. Everett's services as Mayor, because he is such a good business man. Now the business management of the Sun itself, in times past, has not been such as to make quite certain that its judgment as to Mr. Everett's business qualifications is altogether infallible. Still we will assume that Mr. Everett is a good business man and we will admit that he has given the public some proofs of his capacity in this respect. These proofs, however, have unfortunately not extended the public to any great extent, but have rather gone to the enrichment of Mr. Charles A. Everett. Perhaps the Sun might supplement its laudations on the business capacity of Mr. Charles A. Everett by informing the public as to the amount of money he has received from the Dominion Government account of money which was loaned for the Intercolonial, during the past five years.

THE ATTEMPT TO BUY OFF MR. BARKER.

The Sun would like to slide easily over the disreputable tactics of its friends, who are promoting the candidature of Mr. Barker, and, as far as possible, to let the subject pass without further controversy. But this, for obvious reasons, cannot be allowed. The Sun this morning states that the report that a Dominion office had been offered to Mr. Barker is false. Now we affirm that this report is not only true, but that it can be proved. The office offered to Mr. Barker was that of Inspector of Fisheries, now held by Mr. Venning, and the person making the offer was a man near enough to one of the ministers of the crown and to one of the candidates for St. John at the last Dominion election, to warrant the belief that he was, what he represented himself to be, his authorized agent. The Sun need not flatter itself that by the simple process of stalling up and uttering a mendacious contradiction of this report it can remove from the minds of the electors of St. John. We have no hesitation in characterizing this transaction as one of the most base attempts to interfere with a civic election ever tried in a Canadian city, and one which the electors will remember to-morrow by knowing Mr. Everett under, at the polls. The people of St. John do not want a Mayor who is the acknowledged associate of men who undertake to control civic elections by the use of Dominion patronage.

WILL THEY TRY TO BUY OFF THE OFFICE?

It is stated on pretty good authority, that an attempt will be made to-morrow, to buy the position of Mayor for Mr. Barker, by offering to him a sum of money. It is stated that the amount available for this purpose is well up in the thousands, and that one good Christian, an extremely pious man, yet rich withal, has contributed one thousand dollars for the purchase of corrupting his fellow men, and inducing them to vote for the candidate of the ring. We trust that these reports are not true, but in view of what has occurred at former elections, we desire to enforce on Mr. Barker and his friends the necessity for watchfulness and vigilance against the attempts of the enemy. The chief magistracy of St. John is not for sale, and all attempts to win it by bribery will be resisted.

MR. BARKER'S QUALIFICATION.

We are glad to see that the Telegraph has grace enough to admit its error in doing an injustice to Mr. Barker, by using only a portion of the qualification clause in the union act. The Telegraph very candidly says— Through the omission of a reporter in transcribing the section of the union act, which deals with the qualifications of the mayor and aldermen, a wrong impression may have been given to readers. Then, after quoting the clause in full as we published it on Saturday, the Telegraph goes on to say— It will be seen that the last sentence of the section above given supplies an important qualification to the preceding part. For this year it is sufficient if the name of the candidate appears as assessed. Mr. George A. Barker's name does not appear as assessed, and his nomination has been received and filed in due form. There is no legal reason that we know of why he may not, if elected, take and hold the seat as Mayor. We state this in simple justice to Mr. Barker, and in view of the extraordinary efforts that are being made to have him made to influence or compel his party. It is, we think, desirable that our citizens should have a free choice between the two candidates offering, rather than that one of them should be returned by the other being got out of the way. What the Telegraph says in regard to this is quite true. Mr. Barker's qualification is complete and cannot be impeached. The Telegraph did not think it necessary to mention that the reporter who omitted the latter part of the section, which showed Mr. Barker to be qualified,

was a son of Mr. Charles A. Everett, but we think it ought to have been stated. The omission might have been accidental, but a good many persons will be disposed to think otherwise.

THE RAID OF THE HALIFAX BANKERS.

We do not remember any event that has excited more indignation in St. John than the attempt to injure or discredit Mr. Barker, by the proceedings taken by the Bank of Nova Scotia against him before Judge Todd. Mr. Everett and his friends contend that they had no knowledge of this attempt, but it can be proved that some of Mr. Everett's principal supporters instigated it, and there is good reason to believe that Mr. Everett would not have been brought into the field at all, but for the idea that by this proceeding Mr. Barker would be prevented from being a candidate. That being the case it is highly improbable that any movement so important and so vital in its consequences to Mr. Everett would have been going on in many of his friends without his knowledge, so that it is difficult to accept his denial, unless as a mere device to keep the public in the dark as to the real facts of the case. The fact that the Bank which took these proceedings in Halifax instituted is not calculated to lessen the indignation that is felt at this bold attempt to influence the election for mayor of this city. We can get on very well without Halifax interference in our civic affairs.

NOTE AND COMMENT.

There is great lack of information in the United States, even in the Hab, regarding the resources and capacities of the Maritime Provinces of Canada. Just now a discussion has been going on in the journals of Boston regarding the utilization in Massachusetts of some of the men of Nova Scotia. It is stated that there have a carefully prepared condensed and complete description of his resources in iron, manganese, and gold, prepared by the inspector of mines, Mr. C. W. Gilpin, who is well-known among the scientific public, published in the Boston Herald and paid for as an advertisement. John Stowers of Kingston Mills, Ont., was drowned in the sluice at that place on Saturday. John Hollister a cigar maker, cut his throat at St. Catharines Ont. on Saturday. An incendiary fire broke out in the City Market Clothing Hall, 51 Charlotte street, on Saturday night at 10 o'clock. The fire was caused by a young boy, who had been playing with a match in the hall. The fire spread rapidly and the building was completely destroyed. The loss is estimated at \$10,000.
