

Report of Session for 1895.

Dear Brethren and Fellow-Workers.

Your Session in once more presenting their annual report would record their deep sense of the abiding mercies of God to us in sparing our people, in adding to our membership, and in the increasing attendance at public worship.

Out of our large membership we have only lost 3 by death during the year that is past, Mr. John Steen Mrs. S. Ritchie, and Miss Oliver.

Our membership, which was 281 last year, after purging the roll still retains 306 members. 3 were removed by death and 6 by certificate, 25 were added on profession of faith and 9 by certificate, leaving a net gain of 25 during the year.

All the ordinances of the sanctuary have been well attended; but the Session would urge upon its members the duty of more actively supporting the mid week services and more active participation therein so that our prayer meetings may be the means of strengthen. ing every worker and specially staving the pastor's hands.

The Session would also urge upon the Congregation the duty of aiding the services of the sanctuary song by heartily joining in themselves, and by securing for the leader the best talent the congregation contains.

We would express our sympathy with those who are bereaved and commend them to the unfailing com. fort of the word and spirit.
