

The Offertory in January has fallen short of what is required to meet expenditures. We hope that the members of the congregation will take care that the coming month shall show an improvement in this respect.

A massive table of bygone style, once valuable and capable of being made valuable again, has been given for the use of the A.Y.P.A., and placed in the Boys' choir room.

Also a large framed lithograph of the interior of Gloucester Cathedral as it was in the early part of the last century, has been given to be hung up in the Crypt; and a print finely executed in colours of Holman Hunt's picture "The Light of the World" has been given for the same purpose.

The Rev. Charles H. Brooks of Grafton has given to the Diocesan Library several folio volumes, including files for some years, of The Church, a Church paper published about seventy years ago.

Fourteen of the Scholars of the Cathedral Sunday School wrote in the Inter-Diocesan Examination for 1907, and of these eleven received prizes and certificates in the first class, as follows: The Gold Medal, Beatrice Lean; Prizes, Harriet Sarge and Edith Harvard; First Class Certificates, Marjory Evans, Gladys Banks, Frank Lean, John Sneath, Vivienne Ricketts, Annie Russell, Florence Stephenson, Etta Houghton. As compared with the Diocese as a whole, our Sunday School comes out easily first; St. Stephen's comes next with two prizes and four first class and four second Certificates. Stinson were heartily applauded. The organization and direction of the Cantata were ably carried out by Mr. J. M. Stinson of Parkdale assisted by Miss Gladys Banks. The proceeds go to the S.S. Children's Pier fund.
