MORE PROBLEMS.

MARCONI UNABLE TO RECEIVE AND TRANSMIT SIMULTANEOUSLY.

Wireless Will Not Compete With Cables for Some Time to Come--Old Stations Must Be Reconstructed--Inventor Going to New York.

Halifax, Oct. 28.—The Marconi system of transatlantic communication is now fairly well established, and with very few interruptions the station at Glace Bay has been in constant operation since its opening for commercial business on Thursday.

Mr. Byron E. Walker, President of the Canadian Bank of Commerce, also took a bright view of the situation, so far as it concerns and interests this country.


