ABOUT "MARMION." While the Mail is with even more than its usual truculence endeavoring to make party capital of Mr. Crook's expense in the case we submit the only fair statement of which has yet appeared.

SOME MONTHS ago the senate of Toronto university adopted "Marmion" as a text book in English for junior matriculation for 1888. In accordance with a practice—and a very good one—of some years' standing, the education department adopted the same work as a text-book for the high school intermediate examination, in order to enable university matriculants to work in classes along with other pupils.

LAST WEEK, without a note of warning, after nearly ten thousand volumes had found their way into the hands of pupils and students, and after classes had been some time at work reading the text Mr. Crook issued a circular requiring teachers to lay it aside and indicating the possibility of its entire withdrawal.
