

THE TROUBLE WITH HAYTI.

The British demands for the Hayti is a... New York, April 18.—The St. Paul's Washington correspondent says the report that the British Government has given as an ultimatum to Hayti that the latter Government either send the island of St. Pierre to Great Britain, pay a sum of money, or suffer a bombardment at the hands of the English gunboats now lying in readiness for that purpose, is not correct. As the British legation it is said that the home Government will not recede from their demand to Hayti, but will push it. A member of the legation says the claim is a just one, and that there is no proof wanting to establish it. Commodore General John E. Thompson, who has been keeping the State Department informed as to the course matters are taking, Mr. Torres, the Vice Consul, has come to Hayti to look after American interests, and reports the doings of the Hayti gunboats. Should the latter attempt to comply with the British orders to make a protest against such action, State Department officials are of opinion that this Government will hold the Monroe doctrine, and allow no encroachment whatever by any foreign power. Dr. Wharton, Solicitor of the State Department, said yesterday the matter was wholly a business transaction, and he hoped it would be settled amicably, but said the Government would accede to the demands of the other party he afraid it would not.
