1899 AMERICANS' YEAR

In Toronto, Says Mr. S. W. Galatin to The World.

This Gentleman Tells What Our Patriotic Hotel Should Be Like—He Has Had Unlimited Experience—Thinks Toronto Will Be Flooded With American Visitors Next Year.

At the Grand Union Hotel last evening was Mr. S. W. Galatin of New York, one of the directors of the great Plant system of railways and hotels in the Southern States.

Being a man concerned in nine hotels, one of which, at Tampa Bay, cost \$2,500,000, and has an opera house attached, the director knows something of palace hotels. Asked what he thought of the proposed one for Toronto, Mr. Galatin replied promptly: "A good modern house ought to be an immediate success here, about 200 rooms, four stories high, and 250,000 sq. ft. of floor space, is my idea. People have a holy horror of sky scrapers, and it has been proved in New York that they are a thing of the past."

Asked if his trip to Canada was on pleasure or business bound, Mr. Galatin explained that it was in connection with a Canadian excursion to Porto Rico. A party of 100 had applied for transportation. The majority were speculators, but he expected a fashionable rush to the island next summer.
