Up to 1005 she had expended about \$4, 500,000. This expenditure brought such satisfactory results that the state decid-ed on a more extensive scheme and float-ed a bond issue of \$50,000,000 which is to be spent in seven years. Altogether there is being spent annually in the United States on good roads improvements, about \$95,000-000.
