OTTAWA, Jan. 7.

It is probable that there will be an earlier Session of Parliament than has been anticipated.

Postmaster General is at present considering the matter of an amended postal regulation between the Dominion and France. Of late there has been a source of inconvenience. 20 cts. is now charged on letter over quarter of an ounce posted for Canada in France, and newspapers in proportion. The Postmaster General and his deputy will shortly visit France to complete arrangements.

A lawsuit about Three Cents.

Mr. Robert C. Adams, of Carleton, paid his ferry fare for both ways on coming over from Carleton last Monday, as he had been in the habit of doing, and on his return in the evening the collector told him that instructions had been received to take but one fare, and that he must pay his three cents. "If Collector Dixon took six cents from you in the morning," said Collector McIntosh, "he violated the instructions, but that is no reason why I should violate them." Mr. Adams said he would not pay, and asked to be allowed to go ashore. The request was refused, and Mr. Adams returned in the boat, was given permission to land, and hired a horse to take him home by way of the Suspension Bridge. Next morning he sent the stable-keeper's bill to the railway office, and intends bringing an action against the company if it be not paid. Collector Dixon denies

having taken six cents from Mr. Adams, and the trial will be the liveliest three-cent affair that has occurred for some time.

TIMELY TOPICS.

In Nova Scotia Hon. Daniel McDonald, Commissioner of Public Works and Mines, has been sworn into office as Attorney General.

Hon. Robert Robertson, who has latterly occupied a seat in the Government without office, returns to his old position as Commissioner of Works and Mines.

He was old enough to know better. - N. Y. Mail.

According to the statistics published in one of the New York papers the debt of New York is believed to be more than \$150,000,000. It has been impossible to arrive at the exact amount. Some state it to be as high as \$175,000,000. This is about fifteen per cent. on the taxable property of the city. The annual expense of the City Government, including interest on the public debt, requires a tax of three per cent. This is rather a discouraging state of affairs for the new administration of municipal affairs.

The following curious occurrence is vouched for by a contributor to a Polish paper, the "Magid": "At Troslaw, a few days ago, a blind lad was walking with his father, when two boys happened to be throwing stones in the road. One of the missiles struck the lad deprived of sight, and caused him intense pain.
