The Farmer's Corner.

Value of Manure.

The extravagance of farmers is one of the crying sins of the age. Cold barns cause an extra consumption of fodder from 25 to 50 per cent., all of which could be saved by having well-protected, comfortable barns. The upland soil is starved, while piles of barnyard manure lie exposed through the winter months. The cold and rain, utterly destroying its fertilizing qualities. A late number of the Maine Farmer referred to the value of liquid excrement as follows:

"Chemical analysis shows that the excrements (solid and liquid) from a cow of the average age of 8 years, in a single year yield 252 pounds of potash, 183 pounds of nitrogen and 34 pounds of phosphoric acid. Of these above the urine contains about 70 pounds of potash and 58 pounds of nitrogen. Taking the present recognized valuation of these fertilizing elements in cash—viz., potash 8 cents per pound, nitrogen 22 cents, and soluble phosphoric acid 12 cents—the manure of a cow for a single year is worth in money over fifty-three dollars—provided the latter was all saved, which is not the case. The loss of this amount to each animal to about three-fourths of the whole or over \$36. And what does this mean? It means if a farmer has ten cows or their equivalent in neat stock and allows the liquid portion of their manure to go to waste during the entire year, he is thereby experiencing an actual loss in cash of \$367.50.

Examining Your Sheep.

Farmers who have sheep, (and all ought to have them,) should watch them closely at this season of the year. Disease may spread very rapidly. If they appear to have a cold in the head or a cough, lose no time in giving them a course of salt. Frequently, mixing a little rosin with the salt. This is good for them sick or well. Ewes raising lambs, need pure water; as a general thing the dew is sufficient for sheep, but when nursing it is not, and they will likely become diseased if they have not a supply. If your sheep are afflicted with hoof disease, lose no time in preparing them with the knife. It can be cured, but the trouble is greater than the worth of the sheep. If you wish to make a cure, pare the hoof closely, and stand the foot for one minute in a strong solution of blue vitriol; repeat this until a cure is effected. When you have cured one you will likely not attempt another.

Household Hints.

CEMENT FOR MENDING TABLE KNIVES.—Cutler's cement, for fastening the blades of dinner knives in their ivory handles, consists of rosin, four parts; bees-wax, one part; brick-dust, one part. Fill the hole in the handle with the cement, heat the tang of the blade, and press in.

WASHING BROWN PRINTS.—In answer to the inquiry: "What will prevent a brown print from fading in washing?" I send the following: Get three cents worth of sugar of lead and dissolve in a quart of water. Wet the dress. Do this before the dress is washed, and it will set the color.

TO KEEP MILK FOR SIX MONTHS.—Cork in bottles and place these in a pan of cold water, which is then to be raised gradually to the boiling point. Then take out the bottles and allow them to cool before setting them in a cool place. If it is ever necessary or desirable to keep milk so long, the plan may be worth trying.

TO CLEAN ORNAMENTS.—To clean gold ornaments, dissolve a little salt ammoniac in spirits of wine and wash the gold in it; or try the following method: Mix some jeweler's rouge with a little salad oil and with a tooth-brush rub the ornament till perfectly clean. Then wash it in warm soap and water with a clean brush and dry it with wash-leather.

TO WASH BLANKETS.—Have plenty of warm water, in which you have previously melted, say, a quarter of a pound of white soap, free from rosin, stirring well until it is a lather; add to this one teaspoonful of magical mixture, stir again, put in your blankets and turn them around in it for ten minutes, keeping the boiler on the range, but do not allow it to boil; take them out in clear water and rub them, rinse them in a water slightly bleached, wring and soap and shake them until the water is out of them, then let them get perfectly dry and press them under damp mauls. It will require two persons to handle them.

MANY PEOPLE are puzzled to understand what the terms "fourpenny," "sixpenny," "tenpenny," mean as

applied to nails. "Fourpenny" means four pounds to the thousand nails and so on. It is an old English term, and meant at first "tenpenny" nails (the thousand being understood); but the old Englishman clipped it to "tenpenny," and from that it degenerated until "penny" was substituted for "pounds." So when you ask for fourpenny nails nowadays you want those which will weigh four pounds. When a thousand nails weigh less than a pound, they are called tacks, etc., and are reckoned by ounces.—*Methodist.*

In a Pennsylvania town an owl took possession of a box in which a pair of martins were building their nest, and when they returned at night, would not let them enter. The martins flew away and soon returned with a whole army of companions, who went to work and plastered the entrance to the box tightly with mud. When the box was opened a few days later, the owl was found fastened to the wall by an "ornithological episode."
