SATURDAY'S STORM.

One of the Severest Storms Ever Witnessed in the Month of April.

All Provincial Lines of Railway Blocked.

To say that Saturday night's storm was the worst of the season is saying a good deal at the close of a season long to be remembered for its series of notable heavy storms and blockades.

As was expected, the storm was equally severe in all parts of the province, and the railways suffered another blockade. The regular Sunday night train from St. John to the Junction, so that the morning train from St. John yesterday arrived here only at an hour behind time.

The Northern & Western railway had scarcely overcome the last blockade and now the road is drifted worse than ever before. The telegraph wires were very severely along the whole of the line.
