Dr. Ernest Besines lately made a report to be French scademy upon the reappearance of eprosy in Europe. The disease, he says, has had a disquieting development in Spain, chiefly in the province of Valencia, whence large quantities of fruit and greens go to Paris and other French cities. But the disease, he maintains, can only be transmitted from man to man directly; it does not either travel by the ground or by water or air. Neither is it hereditary. The bacillus of the disease is similar to that of tuberculosis; it may even be the same species. The best means to prevent infection consists in proper attention to hygiene, cleanliness, and careful diet.
