Author of "Memorials of Edinburgh in the Olden Time," "Prehistoric Annals of Scotland," "Prehistoric Man," etc.

He was an honorary member of the Society of Antiquaries of Scotland; London Anthropological Institute; Edinburgh Philosophical Institution; British and American Associations for the Advancement of Science; Canadian Institute; Royal Society of Canada, etc., to whose journals he contributed many most valuable papers. He also contributed many well-known articles to the 8th and 9th editions of the Encyclopedia Britannica.

It was his own great misfortune, and in a measure that of the whole world, that many of his works and all his own manuscripts were destroyed in the conflagration of the Toronto University, on the 14th Feb., 1890.

The able manner in which the volumes are edited and printed reflects high honor on the intelligence, public spirit and liberality of all concerned in this production.
