

THIRD SESSION.

Welland, Monday, 1st June, 1868.

Pursuant to adjournment the Council met at the Grand Council Met. Jury Room in the Court House at the Village of Welland. on Monday the 1st day of June, 1868. at 4 o'clock, P. M.

The Warden in the Chair.

MEMBERS PRESENT.-Messrs. Beckett, Garner, Haney, Henderson, Hooker, Lattimore, Learn, Lee, Marshall, Members Present. Matthews, Miller, Seburn, Taylor and Treble. -14.

The Warden addressed the Council, and mentioned that at this Session the equalization of the Assessment Rolls dress. would necessarily engage their attention; also, that the anpointment of Local Superintendents of Schools and Sub-Treasurers of School Moneys would be made, and that this is the session at which moneys to meet the general expenses of the County, as also to provide for payment of instalments of principal and interest falling due upon Debentures the current year, should be appropriated; also, that moneys to meet the ordinary School Grant in aid of Common Schools in the several Townships of the County, and for the pay-

ment of Local Superintendents of Schools in said Townships are required to be provided at this session.

He also mentioned that some action with reference to "Brown's Bridge" would be necessary on the part of the Council, and stated that the Notices ordered at the Special Session in April, had all been given.

He went on to explain that, by reason of the expenditure in revising and writing anew the Registry Office Books relating to all entries previously to this becoming a separate Registration County, and the preparation of Abstract Index Books having necessarily exceeded the appropriation – the work having now been going on for about 2½ years with but one appropriation of \$4,000 therefor – and that by reason of a considerable sum being required to meet the expenditure for the "Junction Tap Drain" recently contracted for by the Council, it would be necessary to raise a temporary loan of about \$7,000 or \$8,000.

He mentioned that in all probability other matters of business would arise in the course of the Session, and stated that all such things needing their attention as might come under his notice, should be at once laid before them.

R. Dewhurst, Esquire, Proprietor of the "Telegraph," and John J. Sidey, Esquire, Proprietor of the "Tribune," now before this Council, that a By-Law will be passed at this Session of Council authorizing and requiring the stopping up, taking down and removal of the said Bridge, which Notices have been so published for at least four weeks previously to this third day of June, A. D. 1868: And whereas a like Notice

WHEREAS, the Bridge over the Welland River at that point where the Town Line between the Townships of Pelham and Thorold, touches the said River, commonly called "Brown's Bridge," has got out of repair and is unsafe for public travel: And Whereas it has been represented to this Council that the said Bridge, by reason of the erection of a Bridge a short distance further up the stream, called "O'Reilly's Bridge," and another Bridge a short distance further down, called the "Welland Bridge," and by reason of the change of travel, which a change in the channels of business has occasioned -has ceased to be used as a public thoroughfare: And Whereas the re-building and keeping in repair of the said Bridge, will be attended with a heavy expense to this County: And Whereas in view of that fact, and in pursuance of the said representation, this Council has caused notices to be published in the Newspapers printed at the Village of Welland called the "Welland Telegraph," and "Welland Tribune," as appears by the affidavits of E. R. Dewhurst, Esquire, Proprietor of the Telegraph, and John J. Sidey, Esquire, Proprietor of the Tribune, now before this Council, that a By-Law will be passed at this Session of Council authorizing and requiring the stopping up,

taking down and removal of the said Bridge, which Notices have been so published for at least four weeks previously to this third day of June, A. D. 1868: And Whereas like Notices have been posted up in several of the most public places in the Neighborhood of the said Bridge for at the least one month prior to this the said third day of June, A. D. 1868, as appears by the affidavit of Adam K. Scholfield. Esq., also now before this Council: And Whereas John Dunigan, David P. Brown, Arthur Phillips and others, have by their Petition presented to this Council, prayed that the said Bridge be not taken down, but that the same be repaired by this Council: And Whereas the said David P. Brown and Arthur Phillips, also Robert Phillips and Peter McCollum, portion of the said Petitioners, all of whom claim to be interested, have been heard in person at the Bar of this Council on the said third day of June, A. D. 1868, in support of the said Petition, and in opposition to the said intended By-Law, as well as upon the subject matter generally of taking down and removal of the said Bridge: And Whereas after the reading of the said Petition and the said Notices and affidavits, together with the other documents relating to the question, and after hearing the said parties and after duly and maturely considering the whole matter and all the evidence adduced on both sides, this Council is of opinion that the said Bridge over the Welland River called "Brown's Bridge," is unnecessary and no longer required for public travel; and that the public interest having in view the great expense to the County at large of keeping up the same, requires that the said Bridge be taken down and removed.

With reference to the Petition of the Reverend George Bell, Local Superintendent of Schools for Stamford, praying that he may be paid at the usual rate of \$4 per School per annum for supervising the two Separate Schools in his Township—one in Section No. 7, established in 1862, and one in Section No. 1, established in 1865. The Separate School in No. 7 has been in operation six years, and that in No. 1 for 3 years—equal 9 years at \$4 per school, amounts to \$36—this is the sum claimed by him.

Your Committee are of the opinion that the Local Superintendents of Schools for Townships or rural districts are bound by law to visit, to superintend and to report annually upon the Separate as well as the Common Schools in their respective Townships, and that for the discharge of these duties they are entitled to the same remuneration that may be provided for the supervision of Common Schools generally.

Your Committee would therefore recommend that the Petitioner be paid the sum of \$36 as arrears of salary due him for supervising the Stamford Schools up to the first day of January, 1868, and that the same be raised by assessment in the said Township of Stamford the current year, in addition to all other rates.

Your Committee would further recommend that in future, while said Separate Schools exist and remain under the charge of the Local Superintendent of Schools for the Township, provision be made in the usual way for payment of Supervision.

The Undersigned acting in conjunction with the Reeve and Deputy Reeve of Gainsborough, early last Spring inspected said Bridge; found covering very much worn, stringers partially rotten, so much so as to not hold spike. They advertised and sold contract of repairing to Darius Dochstater for the sum of \$220. The following is description of repairs: Length of Bridge, exclusive of approaches, 250 feet; 50 new Stringers sawed Pine from 27 to 30 feet in length, 6 x 12 inches; 3,000 feet two-inch Oak Plank well spiked down with six inch spike. The work is satisfactorily done and the Bridge in safe condition for public travel. Total cost, as above stated, \$220. The undersigned recommend the Warden's Cheque being issued in favor of Darius Dochstater for the sum of \$110, payable in current funds, or in silver as an equivalent thereto, being half the expenditure, the other half or like sum of \$110 is to be paid to the Contractor by the County of Lincoln.





