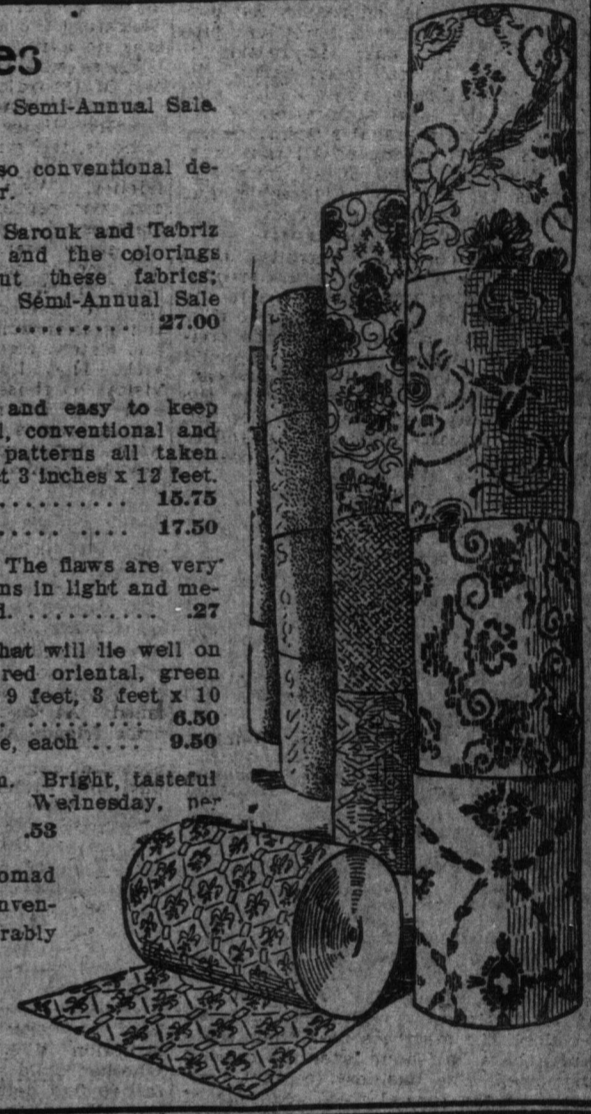

The World's Selections BY GENTLE READY FOR SPRING

House of Hobberlin Starts Shipments of Agents' Samples—Have 854 Agencies.

Altho it is mid-winter and humanity is clothed in the garb calculated to keep out the cold, Canada's big tailoring house is commencing the first shipments of agents' sample books for the spring and summer season of 1912.

The spring season begins with us early in January, said one of the managers when interviewed by a reporter of this journal.

The House of Hobberlin, Limited, control exactly 854 agencies in the Dominion. That is, there are in this many retail dealers handling their lines, and taking order for Hobberlin made-to-measure clothes.

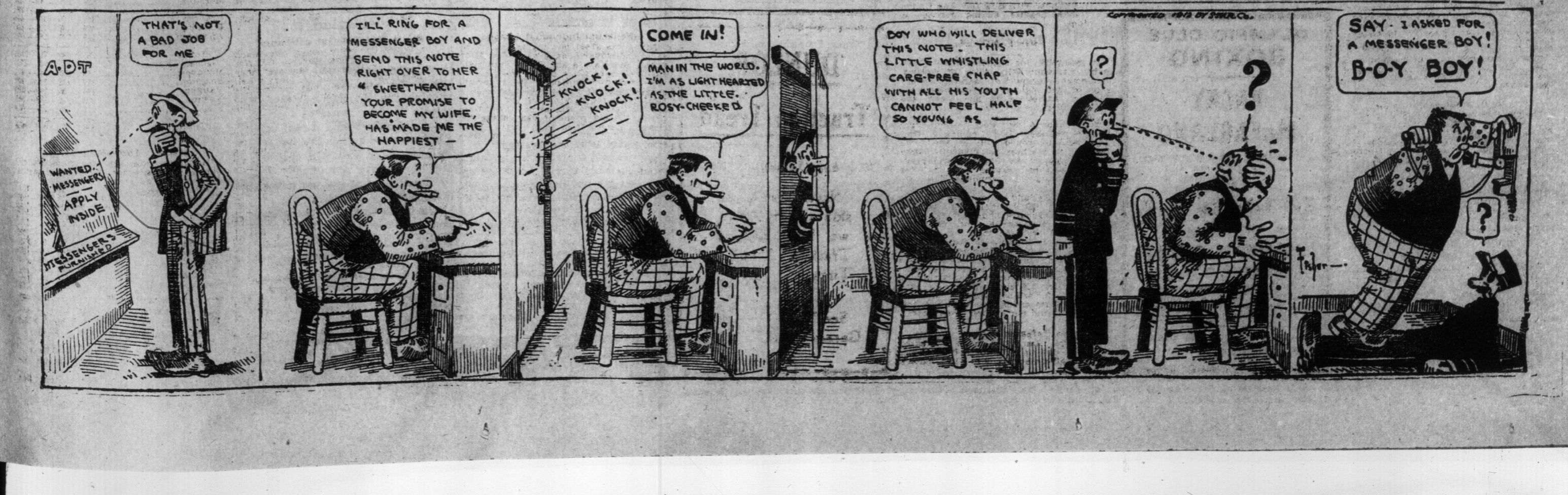

DECKERS VERSUS DROVERS CAUSED SLOTTISH TRADE

Cattle Prices Steady With Last Week—Hogs Higher at \$6.50.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Yards were 261 car loads, 146,064 cattle, 296 hogs, 1,018 sheep and 44 calves.

Trade was slow, owing to a disagreement between the drovers and the abattoirs, and some of the wholesale butchers in regard to who should bear the loss of cattle condemned by the government inspectors.

At the abattoirs, viz. the Park, Blackwell, Co., the Harris Abattoir Co., the Gunns, Limited, and the Swift Canadian Co., preference was given to the drovers.

The drovers, with the exception of three, refused to accept and the consequence was that the abattoirs got few cattle. The independent buyers, such as Mr. H. P. Kennedy, bought without making any conditions of inspection.

The Swift Canadian Company bought 50 hogs, 129 lbs., at \$6.50; 9 culls, 420 lbs., at \$5.50; 220 lambs at \$6.00; 200 lambs, at \$4.40 to \$5.65 per cwt.

CHOICE CATTLE UP IN THE MONTREAL MARKET

Prices Advance 25 to 40 Cents Per Cwt.—Hogs Steady Under Quiet Trading.

MONTREAL, Jan. 8.—At the Montreal Stock Yards, West End Market, the receipts of live stock for the week ending Jan. 8 were 1700 cattle, 1400 sheep and lambs, 278 hogs, 250 calves, while the offerings at the abattoirs for the morning for sale amounted to 500 cattle, 1000 sheep and lambs, 100 hogs and 120 calves.

The supply of medium or common cattle in the local market is ample to fill all requirements, but prices were firmer in sympathy with the above.

The feature of the small meat trade was the stronger local market for sheep and prices advanced 25 to 40 cents per pound, owing to the small offerings.

There was no important change in the condition of the market for hogs. Supplies coming forward are ample to fill all requirements and the feeling is firm, with sales of selected lots at \$7 to \$7.10.
