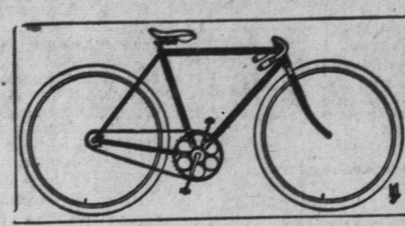

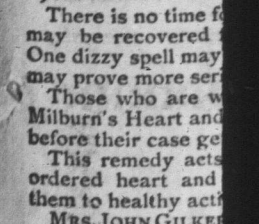

What has happened? My hon. friend from West York tells me that one important feature in that part of his bill relating to Canada is the utter abandonment of the principle of representation by population.

Why Quebec Goes Free. What now do we find? The bill does not make any material change in the Province of Quebec. The hon. gentleman who introduced it says that he found it. Why? Because Quebec gave him an overwhelming majority.

An Honest Election Impossible. Why? Because my right hon. friend knows that while by converting the power of two Governments, which by the adoption of a bill would be united and private money, and, besides, those fraudulent practices which he says are so rampant in the Province of Quebec, he would be doing a great wrong to the people.

South York Teachers Decided in Favor of Uniform Promotion Examinations Yesterday.

CURLING TONGS CAUSE A BLAZE.

Nicholls, corresponding secretary.

North Toronto. Special Whitmanite services will be held to-morrow at St. Clement's Church, Eglinton, and the congregation will be asked to provide an offertory of \$20, this being the amount required to erect a new school house.

The northern entrance of Mount Pleasant Cemetery has been much improved, and will now afford better facilities for vehicles, as well as for pedestrians. The cemetery yesterday received a visit from the Board of Trustees, who were accompanied by the Mayor from Hamilton. The visitors spoke highly of the condition of the grounds and surroundings.

Ties have been strung along the Metropolitan track in preparation for the reduction of the grade of the road.

York Lodge, A. F. & A. M., met last night and, after the conclusion of the evening's business, spent a most enjoyable hour with a number of visitors.

South York Teachers. Toronto Junction, May 19.—(Special)—The South York Teachers' Institute commenced their annual meeting in the auditorium of the High School this morning and continued it throughout the afternoon with a larger assembly than usually characterizes such gatherings.

After Inspector Forsterham had given an opening address, Miss M. E. Campbell of Forest Hill read a paper on "Teaching Simple Rules and Time Tests," and Mr. M. Holmes spoke on "Our Flag."

Through Mr. Wilson, the committee upon school curriculum recommended that, in arithmetic, problems should be classified, and that a grade taught in one class should not be taught to another. In literature 15 or 16 subjects should be specified. Grammar should be graded. His geography, so that teachers would know what was expected of them and where to end, and in Canadian history they thought it should be taught topically, rather than by chapters, and that different topics should be brought to different forms.

Mr. C. W. Flint of Scarborough read a paper on "Hindrances to Efficiency in the Schools," which might be summarized as follows: (1) Hygienic hindrances, such as heating, ventilation and lighting; (2) Want of ambition in pupils; (3) Home influences and the tendency of parents to keep children at home; (4) Frequent change of teachers; (5) Miserable plattitudes meted out as salaries; and (7) Too many subjects taught.

Want Promotions. The discussion of the day, however, was the question of "Uniform Promotion Examinations," which was supported by Messrs. Jones, Cowling, English, Thomson and Lacey. At the June session of the County Council, largely upon the arguments of Mr. Reesor, an ex-school teacher, the council passed a resolution commensurate of the system of promotion examinations and ordering their discontinuance.

All the school teachers and the inspectors of South York to-day resented this aspersion upon their system and in a mild resolution requested the County Council to reconsider their resolution of January. The reasons given for its continuance were: (1) That it prevents teachers from having hobbies. Where a teacher has a hobby and promotes his own pupils, he invariably promotes pupils on their advancement in that subject. By uniform promotion examinations, where all pupils receive the same papers and all papers are examined independent of the teacher, every subject must be taught in order that the pupil may receive promotion. (2) Pupils are taught self reliance. There is an incentive to get ready for exams, and they learn to put their thoughts in writing. (3) When pupils change their residence from one district to another, there is no difficulty in placing them in their right class. Their certificate speaks for itself, whereas when pupils come from a district where there is no uniform grading, they may be qualified for a high form on one subject, and only fitted for a low one in another, and they are difficult to place correctly.

Mr. J. Ley, County Councillor for No. 1 Division, after hearing the discussion, fully coincided with the teachers and assured them that at the June session the objectionable resolution would be repealed.

At intervals, Mr. Clark, accompanied on the piano by Miss Edgar, sang, "Soldiers of the Queen" and "Men of the Northern Zone." Miss Edwards gave the instrumental solo, "Come Back to Erin," and Miss Borland gave an instrumental solo in the evening. Dr. Gilmour lectured on "Crime and Education," and Miss Doris L. McMurtry and Miss Lillian Burns contributed to the program.

The convention will continue to-morrow.

TWO TEMPERANCE LECTURES. Lumbermen in New Brunswick Quarrelled, Result Fatal.

Fredricton, N.B., May 19.—At Green Hill, about 30 miles from Fredricton, this morning at 5 o'clock, William McLean, a lumberman for James Humble, was murdered, it is alleged, by Alfred Glover, married man, with wife and family. Both men are said to have been under the influence of liquor and McLean was stabbed to death.

Was a Heavy Drinker. St. Thomas, Ont., May 19.—Albert Smith, taximeter, well known in this city, fell downstairs in the Victoria Block, in the West End, some time during the night and was killed. He was a heavy drinker.

Cripple Couple Turned Adrift. Alliston Herald: The experience of John Allison and his wife, a decrepit couple who, until Wednesday of last week, were residents of the House of Refuge at Beeton, is not one that will serve as an example to any of our citizens.

Mace and his wife were committed to the House of Refuge from Collingwood shortly after their institution was built, and were, to all appearances, worthy objects of charity.
