HELD AT PORTAGE LA PRAIRIE, JUNE 11TH, 1891.

REPORT OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF WESLEY COLLEGE.

During the year just closed the work of the College in all its departments has been marked by signal success. We are glad to be in a position to state that this year, as last, has shown a marked increase in the number of students in attendance at college, and from information received we have reason to believe that the number will be considerably increased during the coming year, thus showing a steady and rapid increase from year to year.

We present herewith the financial report prepared by the Bursar, the Rev. Principal Sparling, and, also the report of the Faculty, by Prof. G. J. Laird; and in doing so, we can only reiterate and re-emphasize the words contained in our last annual report to this Conference, and express our hearty appreciation of the valuable work done by the Rev. Dr. Sparling, and the competent staff of professors associated with him in the work of the College.

The report of the Bursar presents a most satisfactory and highly gratifying financial condition of our College Fund, and one which reflects great credit, not only upon the people of this country in helping with such a liberal hand our educational institution, but also upon the Rev. Dr. Sparling, for his untiring and indefatigable efforts on behalf of the college. It will be seen from the report that out of \$10,276.57 required for the past year, the college has received \$9,824.30, leaving a small deficiency at the present time of \$452.27, which it is expected will be fully met before the first of September next, the closing of the financial year.

Out of the Conference Districts six have reported a surplus in excess of the amount of their appointment, and four have reported a small deficiency. It is to be hoped, in some cases, at least, that this will be reduced before the close of the year. It must also be remembered that owing to the change of our financial year, from 1st June to 1st September, the year for which the above figures are given, covered a period of fifteen months, instead of twelve, so that as compared with the ordinary year, there is in reality a surplus of some \$600, instead of a deficiency, as appears in the report.

According to the announcement in our last report to Conference, the college has during the past year entered into its new quarters, in the large building on Broadway. As a consequence, the work has been carried on with a greater efficiency, and we earnestly hope that before the expiry of our present lease, such steps will be taken as will put us in possession of a building of our own commensurate with the necessity of the work, and worthy of our great and common cause.

The report of the Faculty, by Prof. Laird, contains complete information as to the internal work of the college in its various branches, and we commend it to the careful perusal of all who desire the fullest information in that particular.

We would call especial attention to that clause of the report with reference to the arrangement entered into between the colleges for a system of intercollegiate work, and desire to express our thanks to the principals and professors of the other affiliated colleges for the great advantages thus conferred upon our students. We are pleased to say that it will not be necessary for this Board to ask the Conference for any increase in the amount required for college purposes for the ensuing year;

and we would therefore ask that the sum of \$6,500 be placed in the estimates to be raised by the various Districts for that purpose.

Again, as in the previous year, the Board desires to call the special attention of the Conference, and all friends of the college, to the necessity of increasing activity and renewed energy in behalf of the college, not only in the matter of raising money, but in the securing of students, and in every legitimate way advancing the interests of the college.

Expressing our united thanks to the ministers of this Conference for their loyal and hearty support, and to the laymen throughout the country for their exceptional liberality in the past; and ever remembering Him who is the inspirer and hearer of our prayer, that in the future, as in the past, the same spirit of noble self-sacrifice and enthusiasm may characterize all our people, until Wesley College will occupy a position equal in every respect to any other educational institution of our land.

To the Board of Directors of Wesley College:—

GENTLEMEN,—Your Faculty, in regarding this their third annual report, have great pleasure in stating that, both as regards the attendance and work done, the past college year has been a very satisfactory one.

We have had, during the past year, the advantages of a much more suitable and commodious building than heretofore, and in consequence have been able to pursue our work to much better advantage not only to ourselves, but also to our students, the general health of whom, throughout the year, has been all that could be desired.

The attendance this year has been very good. As you will no doubt remember, the total number of registered students during our first, and what may be termed experimental, year, was eight. During the second year there registered thirty-four students, quite a number of whom were in attendance but a small part of the year. During the session of 1890-91 we had in attendance thirty-nine students, which, with one not in attendance, made forty in all. Most of those in attendance were with us throughout the whole of the session. These were distributed amongst the various departments of college work, as follows:—

Of these, seven were Conference students, three non-Conference students taking Theological work, and twenty-nine ordinary students.

We may also, as a Faculty, congratulate ourselves upon the excellent stand taken by some of our students at the late University examinations. To these examinations we sent up twenty-three students, thus ranking second in the list of colleges affiliated with the University. Three of our students passed successfully their final examination in Arts, and had the degree of B.A. conferred upon them at the late Convocation. Of these,

two graduated with the highest honors in Natural Science, and one with honors in Classics. In the Junior year two of our students appear among the list of scholarship winners. In the Previous year, though none of the honors of the University were obtained, yet but a single failure in but one subject was credited to us. Some of our Preliminary students have not been so successful as we would wish, but this was chiefly owing to lack of proper and sufficiently long preparation. We find it almost impossible to cover the ground required for the Preliminary examination in one year, since nearly all our students have hitherto come to us without any, or at most, very imperfect knowledge of Latin, Greek or French, and have in addition been backward in Mathematics. In future it will be necessary for such students to spend two years over the Preliminary work. In fact this is now done by the other affiliated colleges. The necessity of giving longer time to Preliminary work is rendered more imperative, from the fact that during the present year the requirements for the Matriculation examination have been changed so as to bring them into harmony with those of the various universities of Ontario, and in consequence the standard has been considerably raised. When it is remembered that ours is but a three years' course, it will be conceded, we think, that the step taken by the University of Manitoba in reference to the Preliminary examination, is a step in the right direction. The shorter the course the more necessary is it that the groundwork be thoroughly and securely laid. Then the student will be in a position to derive that benefit from his college course which it is intended to give, and which a proper preparation can alone fit him for receiving.

We are glad also to announce that the College Library has been considerably augmented during the year. In addition to his magnificent donation of last year, the Rev. Dr. Young has supplemented it this year by the gift of the latest edition of the Encyclopædia Britannica in condensed form. He has also further supplied the college with magazines for the use of students. Mr. James Ferrier, of Montreal, has nobly seconded Dr. Young's efforts to build up a library worthy of Wesley College. Nearly three hundred volumes were presented by him, among these being a complete bound set of the Methodist Magazine from its commencement to the present time. Other smaller donations have been received from friends of the College. A reading-room, supplied with the local and provincial papers and standard magazines, is still much needed.

For the benefit of those members of the Board not residing in Winnipeg, we would in closing, state that we have endeavored to further the system of Intercollegiate lectures as far as possible. To this end, during the past year, we have taken charge of the department of Higher Mathematics for Manitoba College, while in return, that College has done our work in the department of Honor Classics and part of that in the Mental and Moral Science Course. The whole of the Natural Science Course, with the exception of Preliminary Botany (which does not belong to University work proper), has been taught in common by the Science professors of St. John's, Manitoba, and Wesley Colleges. For the purpose of combined teaching, central rooms were obtained and fitted up, and a small sum of money was granted by the University to cover expenses. The above mentioned institutions contributed their scientific apparatus, and by this means a more satisfactory course has been given this year to students of Natural Science, than had ever been previously given in the history of the University.

REPORT OF THE SABBATH-SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee on Sabbath-school work beg to submit the following report:—

We herewith submit a report of the labors done in this portion of the Church's work during the past year, with comparative statements, showing an increase in most of the departments of the Sabbath-school work. While it is gratifying to be able to report general advancement, yet we feel to regret the inability to report a corresponding increase with last year's statement in many branches of the work.

We are pleased to report a marked increase in the number of conversions during the year, it being 743 as against 252 last report, thus showing an increase of 491, the greatest being on the Crystal City District, 174, as against fourteen in last year's report. All other Districts show an increase excepting one, which has a decrease of nine. We believe that

the remarkable increase on the Crystal City District is due largely to the wonderful success of the Misses Judd, the evangelists, who have been laboring in that District for the past year.

Your Committee would urge most strongly the necessity of a more diligent use of our Catechism in the schools, there being only 716 out of 9,228 scholars studying the same. We feel that such neglect must lead to deplorable ignorance of the doctrines as taught by our Church, and we would recommend that the Superintendents of the various Circuits and Missions be urged more faithfully to insist on the introduction and use of the Catechism in every school on their respective Circuits and Missions.

We are pleased to note a still further diminution in the number of Sunday-school papers, other than those published by the Methodist Book Room, taken by the various schools, and trust that our own Church papers, being second to none on the continent, will continue to receive the loyalty of patronage they so justly merit. We are glad to report 2,192 copies of our new and excellent paper, *Onward*, as having been distributed throughout our schools during the past year; and we feel assured that the superiority of this neat and progressive paper is a sufficient guarantee of its onward march and popularity amongst the senior students of our schools.

We regret to have to report only thirty—a decrease of ten—schools holding regular meetings for the study of the lessons during the past year. We cannot but look upon this as a change in the wrong direction, and would urge regular weekly meetings of the teachers—say in connection with the weekly prayer-meetings—where practicable, for the study of the lessons, in order to secure a more efficient and uniform teaching of the lessons.

We observe that in several Districts, Sabbath-school conventions have not been held, and we would urge upon the Chairmen of Districts a more thorough enforcement of the Discipline in this regard.

We would further recommend that the Chairmen of Districts be instructed to make provision for returning the number of officers and teachers, members of the Methodist Church, laboring in union Sunday-schools, and of children of Methodist families attending the same.

We would also urge upon all schools the propriety of purchasing books for library and prize purposes from our Methodist Book Room, both from a financial and spiritual standpoint, thus materially lessening the risk of an accumulation of improper Sabbath-school literature.

The attention of your Committee has been directed to the fact that the ministerial brethren have been selected and topics given them two months ago on which they were to speak at the Sunday-school anniversary meeting in connection with the present Conference services, while the laymen, not having been spoken to on the subject, are expected to give impromptu addresses. This the latter consider unfair to them, and we would respectfully urge the propriety of either reversing the order or giving the lay brethren an equal chance to think over the subject before being invited to address a meeting.

Your Committee recommend that S. R. Parsons be the Secretary-Treasurer for the ensuing year. The amount of money raised by the schools for all purposes is \$7,267.11, as against \$5,423.83 the previous year, an increase of \$1,843.28.

Your Committee beg to report as follows:—

That whereas, an impression has gone abroad that the North West Territories enjoy a strictly prohibitive liquor law, and that Prohibition has been on trial and has failed; and whereas, an Act was passed upholding Prohibition, under a restricted permit system, and whereas the said permit system has been inefficiently administered, and in direct contravention of the spirit of the Act, it is hereby resolved that we uphold the temperance people of the Territories in the expression of their sentiments manifest in the Prohibition petitions sent in to the Dominion Government. And whereas, we believe that one of the best measures in existence for the inoculation of temperance sentiments, and the development of the principles of Prohibition lies in the education of the young, we therefore respectfully request the Boards of Education for Manitoba and the North-West Territories to place upon their authorized list of text books a suitable text-book on Temperance.

2. Whereas, this Conference has learned with very great humiliation that some of the members of our Church, notwithstanding the action of this Conference last year in "urging our friends to take no part in the accursed traffic in intoxicating liquors," have signed the applications which persons have made for the legal sale of liquors:

Be it therefore resolved, that we, as a Conference, express our strong disapproval of such action on the part of our members as being directly opposed to the spirit of the Discipline, and the teaching of God's Word.

3. We reaffirm our entire confidence in the work of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union, and we strongly urge our ministers and people to do all in their power to encourage and promote the very efficient and thorough work of that organization.

4. Your Committee recommend that our people lay aside all party feeling on the great question of the abolition of the traffic in alcoholic liquors, and vote only for those persons, for either parliamentary or civic honors, who are known to be in thorough harmony with the principles of prohibitive legislation; and where there are no such candidates, then we deem it a duty incumbent on our people to bring forward such candidates and labor for their election.

5. Inasmuch as the last General Conference recommended that each Annual Conference, at the session of 1891, elect two or more delegates who shall represent the General Conference without any expense to the same, at the Temperance Convention to be held in Chicago in 1892,

Your Committee recommend the appointment of Rev. T. Ferrier and Mr. Thomas Nixon as delegates from this Conference to said Convention.

6. We would also recommend the Conference to direct the Committee on Conference Services to insert in the published programme the names of laymen who are to take part in the same, and to notify them of their appointment.

7. Your Committee were in receipt of a communication from the Secretary of the Dominion Alliance requesting the appointment of delegates to its annual meeting in the City of Toronto, September 10th and 11th, 1891. We recommend the appointment of Revs. Alfred Andrews and A. W. Ross, and Messrs. J. W. Smith and Hon. J. W. Sifton, as delegates from this Conference.

And that a copy of this resolution be forwarded immediately, by the Secretary of Conference, to our representatives at Ottawa.

REPORT OF SABBATH OBSERVANCE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee, in considering the question of Sabbath Observance, have been seriously impressed with the fact that there is yet very much left undone that might be done to improve the morals of the public generally.

Strange as it may appear, yet, nevertheless, it is true that there are numbers of persons in this land who lend themselves to transactions which are not only questionable, but demoralizing in their influence, and who, prior to their coming here, would have strongly denounced such conduct, and blushed with very shame to have their names mentioned in connection with such matters.

Among such are the finding of pleasure in visiting friends, especially during the hours of divine service on the Sabbath, roaming the prairies in pursuit of game, shooting, fishing, boating and public driving, all of which we most strongly condemn.

Believing, as we do, that the Fourth Commandment is of perpetual obligation, and its observance by nations and individuals essential that their highest interests may be preserved and protected, your Committee note, with much satisfaction, that "Charlton's Lord's Day Observance Bill," which voices the enlightened Christian sentiment of our land on this question, has passed to a second reading in the House of Commons, and promise is given that its principles will be embodied in the legislation of Parliament.

We are also glad to observe a disposition on the part of some railway managers in our country to curtail operations on the Lord's Day, and give their employees opportunity to secure the blessings of the day of rest.

The proposition to keep the gates of the World's Exposition open on the Sabbath is a painful exhibition of the low views taken by many in a Christian land on the question of Sabbath Observance. The agitation commenced by our fellow-Christians in the United States to prevent this contemplated action has our warmest sympathies, and we earnestly pray it may have a successful issue.

In order to secure the best and united efforts of the Conference in all matters pertaining to a better observance of the Lord's Day, your Committee feel that they cannot do better than repeat the counsel of last year's report, embodied in the following clauses:—

1. That our ministers preach on this subject wherever and whenever necessity seems to call for their counsel, interpreting the law in the broad and liberal manner which our Saviour's example and teaching on the question requires.

2. That our ministers and members carefully abstain from giving countenance to any form of Sabbath desecration, manifesting a cheerful willingness to suffer loss and inconvenience rather than lend the influence of their example to unchristian practices.

3. That, as a Church, we co-operate heartily in all efforts that may be made to obtain stricter laws and better enforcement of existing laws relating to this question.

Your Committee cannot too strongly impress upon our people the imperative necessity of establishing Epworth Leagues in every congregation where it is practicable. There are large numbers of young people in our societies who are in a transitory state. They consider themselves too old for the Sabbath-school, and feel that the manners and membership of the Church are too advanced for them. The Epworth League is a connecting link between the Sabbath-school and the Church. It promotes a bond of sympathy and Christian effort among the young people, develops their Christian life, drills them in work for the Master, and is a wise preparation for future usefulness.

In the Journals of the General Conference and the Discipline, full provisions are made for the work of the Epworth League. Where there are in existence Christian Endeavor and other Young People's Societies, preference should be given in every case to the Epworth League, yet this matter must be guarded with prudence in cases where other Young People's Societies now exist.

The Constitution of the League is simple, flexible and comprehensive; copies of which can be obtained from Dr. Withrow. In newly settled districts with a sparse population, the Devotional Department may be organized even with three or four members, who can proceed to organize the other departments as their numbers increase. The highly efficient, attractive and useful paper, *Onward*, is specially adapted for the senior scholars of our Sabbath-schools and members of the Epworth League. We recommend and strongly urge this paper upon our Sabbath-schools and young people in general, feeling assured that nowhere else can they find so much value for their money. It is important everywhere to give constant and thorough attention to the young people, but especially is this necessary in the changing condition of population in this new country, therefore your Committee strongly recommends that each minister, where no Epworth League exists, be requested to take such steps as will lead to the inauguration of this valuable department of our work in each congregation and Sabbath-school throughout the Conference.

The Conference rejoices at the continued growth and usefulness of the Woman's Missionary Society, and believe it to be second only to the General Missionary Society in helping on the cause of missions, and we recommend that wherever practicable the ministers co-operate with the Woman's Missionary Society in holding public meetings and anniversaries.

1. That the question of organic union of the different churches belongs to our General Conference.

2. That the Conference has placed on record its views concerning the union of the Presbyterian and Methodist Churches in the following language:—"In reference to the Presbyterian Church, your Committee rejoice to learn that some measures have been adopted and some progress made during the past quadrennium in the direction of union, and is strongly of the opinion that the time has come when some practical steps might profitably be taken to bring about a better understanding in reference to the work on mission fields, and that an amicable arrangement might be made between the two Churches which would prevent any unseemly rivalry, and the unnecessary expenditure of men and means, especially in the sparsely settled districts of Nipissing, Algoma, Manitoba and the North-West."

3. Your Committee rejoice in the practical adoption of the above recommendations in the co-operation of the two bodies in evangelistic effort, and in the union of toil to banish strong drink from the land.

4. Your Committee further recommend the exchange of pulpits, and we hereby emphasize our sincere desire to cultivate no jealousies and allow no rivalry that will interfere with or hinder the work of God.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE STATE OF THE WORK.

Your Committee have great pleasure in reporting another year of progress in all departments of Church work. While there is evidence of spiritual prosperity generally, many fields have been blessed with gracious revivals of religion, which have resulted in the conversion and ingathering of hundreds of souls, and in the quickening of believers.

Special evangelistic agency has proved eminently successful. The labors of Messrs. Crossley and Hunter, and those of the Misses Judd have been specially blessed. While making particular mention of these consecrated and eminently successful workers, the faithful and persistent labors of the regular ministry, aided by a loyal people, ought not to pass unnoticed, much less undervalued. The difficulties of carrying on special services in the sparsely settled portions of our prairie land are best known to those who have had experience in such attempts, yet we are happy to report that, notwithstanding peculiar and trying conditions, our ministers and probationers have done faithful and successful work. The increase of membership this year is 1,544, making a total membership of 11,450, for which we desire to record our devout gratitude to Almighty God.

The work has suffered in a few places because of inadequate preaching supply. No doubt, loss has been sustained as well as much disappointment produced, because of the Church not having been able to furnish in every place preachers of greater experience than those who have been sent. A few localities have been left with only occasional service, in consequence of the scarcity of men. The demand is pressing and on the increase for young men of ability, training and thorough consecration to the work. May such be raised up in greater numbers, and sent forth into these fields which are white unto the harvest.

The need of church accommodation is increasingly realized as population increases. To provide such accommodation, our people are moving as rapidly as their financial circumstances and other considerations will permit. In many cases the uncertainty which exists as to the location of centres, has prevented congregations concerned from taking action in the direction of church and parsonage building.

The laudable ambition to become self-sustaining at as early a date as possible, which has characterized our Circuits as a whole, we are pleased to report, still obtains. A number of additional fields will be added to this roll of honor this year. As a rule Sabbath-schools are established wherever practicable. The official returns of Sabbath-school statistics do not fairly represent the extent of our Sunday-school interests, or the amount of work being done among the children, a great many union schools being operated, which, of course, cannot be returned as belonging to the Methodist Church.

The accompanying financial exhibit confirms our people's reputation for liberality, and, at the same time pays a tribute to the faithful working of well-tried methods of raising money for church purposes.

Your Committee would commend the action of the late General Conference on this subject to the careful and prayerful consideration of our people, and recommend, with a view to more extensive circulation, that the report of the Committee on Systematic Beneficence adopted by that body be printed in our Conference Minutes.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON PRINCE ALBERT CHURCH PROPERTY.

Your Committee recommend that the Superintendent of Missions, the Rev. Jas. Woodsworth, be requested to visit the Prince Albert Mission as soon as possible, and assist Brother Stacey in coming to a settlement with the person preferring claims against the trustees of our parsonage in that town, and take such other steps as may be necessary to place the mission on a sound financial basis.

REPORT ON INDIAN WORK.

The past year with our Indian Mission Work has been one of encouragement and promise. Encouragement, because of the steady growth of our people in Christian experience, evidenced by godly living and triumphant dying. Loyalty to our country and Government, honesty in dealing with fellow-men, and strong faith in God, are the very apparent fruits of mission in our Indian field.

Promise, because of the very hearty co-operation of the Indian Department of the Government with our Church, which has developed during the year in the erection of a handsome and commodious building at Morley, for the McDougall Orphanage and Training Institution, and the commencing of operations at the Red Deer, for an Industrial School, work on which is now going on. This, when finished, will open a fine field for the education of our people in the west and north, where the reserve and missions will be tributary to this school at the Red Deer.

Further, a site has been selected in Manitoba for another large industrial school, which, when completed, will be the training-home in Christian civilization; for the youth from our missions in the north and east and, as in the past, the Indian work has been sadly hindered because of the lack of such aid. We now, with this provision in store for the education of our people, feel that the future is full of promise to the Church in her efforts for the salvation of these tribes.

Owing to the decimation of the band of Stonies at Woodville, by epidemic, that point is given up, and a new base of operations is proposed at White Whale Lake. This is a centre for several small bands of Indians, and where the Government is about to establish a reserve. At Beren's River, the necessities of the work demand that an ordained man be stationed there.

At Cross Lake, north-west of Norway House, it is desirable to establish a mission.

A view of the year's experiences furnishes abundant cause for thankfulness to God for His many and rich blessings poured upon us as a Church in this country, as well as inspiration for continued and increased devotion and activity in the future.

INTERIM REPORT OF THE UNION CHURCH RELIEF FUND.

In presenting the report of work done since the last General Conference, the Treasurer begs to say that the Committee appointed met soon after the rising of the General Conference, and after careful consideration of each case, decided to carry out the recommendations of the General Conference, and made the appropriations accordingly.

Many members of the Committee expressed great regret that no effort was to be made to raise any sum to reduce the obligations of the Fund, through the meetings to be held in March to celebrate the one-hundredth year of Methodism.

Your Treasurer also regrets to report that remittances have come in unusually slow, not so much from lack of loyalty to the Fund, as from neglect to take up and forward the collections on time. This necessitates the borrowing of money at high rates, in order to keep faith with claimants.

It is of the greatest importance that the ministers look after the interests of this Fund, promptly take up the collections as required by the Discipline, in October, and forward at once to the Treasurer. There are not probably one hundred Circuits in the whole Dominion where this cannot be done.

The amount paid into the Treasurer and to the Rev. James Gray (who has acted in his absence) was \$604.54 to the 15th May, 1891.

The foregoing is respectfully and loyally submitted, with the hope that the future may be brighter, and the collections larger.

GENERAL CONFERENCE REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON SYSTEMATIC BENEFICENCE.

Your Committee, having duly considered the memorial of the Niagara Conference on the subject of Systematic Beneficence, beg leave to report:—

That the principle of systematic and proportionate giving is explicitly enjoined in the Holy Scriptures from the earliest times. The example of Abraham, who paid tithes to Melchisedec, the priest of the Most High God; and of Jacob, who vowed one-tenth of his increase to God, as well as the general prevalence of the tithe system among various nations, shows its early and probably divine origin. It was rigidly enforced under the Mosaic economy, and is endorsed by the sacred writers down to Malachi,

who closes the Old Testament with withering rebukes against those who had robbed God of His just claims against their property, and exhorts them to "bring all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in Mine house, and prove Me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it."

In the New Testament the payment of tithes receives the sanction and commendation of Christ Himself, while the apostle Paul teaches the duty of proportionate and systematic giving in his directions to the Corinthians, that each "lay by him in store, as God has prospered him, on the first day of the week."

The obligations of Christian stewardship rest upon every follower of our Lord Jesus Christ who, "Though He was rich, yet for our sakes He became poor;" and in view of the inestimable blessings secured to us by the Gospel, and the imperative commission to preach it to every creature, we are persuaded that every true disciple of the Master will strive to exceed the minimum of one-tenth by liberal offerings according to his means.

The experience of the Christian Church corresponds with the teaching of the Bible, that those who contribute according to the Scriptural method are prospered spiritually as well as in material things, while, at the same time the treasury of the Lord's house is proportionately replenished.

While we hail with delight the tendency in our Church to rise to a higher plane of religious consecration and giving, we must at the same time express our regret that so much practical unbelief still exists on this subject, as amply shown by the straitened condition of many of her institutions and agencies, because of the scanty resources at her command.

We have, therefore, to make the following recommendations:—

1. That all our people be urged to give to the cause of God as He has prospered them, at the rate of at least one-tenth of their income; and that the use of all unscriptural methods of raising money for church purposes be discountenanced, as unworthy a Christian people.

2. That in addition to the teaching of the pulpit on the duty of systematic giving, our ministers be earnestly requested to arrange for the circulation, throughout their congregations, of suitable literature on this important subject.

We also express our sympathy with Brother Ruttan in his present misfortune, and congratulate him on the fact that he has been found worthy to suffer for the cause of truth and right.

during the past year between Manitoba College, and also, to some extent, St. John's College, and ourselves; and while thanking those who have thus kindly opened their college doors to our students, hereby expresses the hope that it may be found practicable to continue in, and even to extend, such a system of lectures, feeling assured that such action will not only tend to increase the feeling of friendliness now existing between the various colleges, but also be the means of giving to the students of the colleges interested the benefits of such training as they could not otherwise hope to obtain in this Province; and which, we feel sure, will compare very favorably with that given at any other similar institution of high education in the Dominion.

Resolved,—That we cannot allow this Conference to close without placing on record our high appreciation of the inspiring presence and valuable assistance so cheerfully rendered by our General Superintendent, Rev. Dr. Carman. His able sermon on Sunday morning, his soul-stirring addresses during the Conference, and his clear interpretation of the Discipline of our Church, demonstrate to us that he is still the right man in the right place. We all assure Dr. Carman of our continued affection for him, and our prayer is that God may abundantly bless him and his family, and that his life may long be spared to help the Church we all love so much.

 SYMPATHY TO LADY MACDONALD.

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

To the Members and Adherents of the Methodist Church, Manitoba and North-West Conference :—

DEARLY BELOVED,—“Grace be unto you, and peace from God our Father, and from the Lord Jesus Christ.”

In our Conference assembled, we thank God on your behalf for the grace of God which is given you by Jesus Christ, “who shall also confirm you unto the end, that ye may be blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.”

Our aim and joy is to be laborers together with you in the fellowship of the Spirit, for the furtherance of the glorious Gospel of the Son of God.

In these days of theological unrest, we would charge you and charge our own souls to “ask for the old paths,” to be fairly grounded on the impregnable rock of Holy Scripture, to be clear cut and courageous in the enunciation of the fundamental truths of the Gospel; the Bible, the revealed will of God; Jesus the Messiah, of whom Moses and the prophets did write, the Christ of God; the atonement, regeneration and sanctification of the spirit; as Methodists, reading these mighty truths in the light of deep, joyous, personal experience, presenting to the world in well-defined testimony, with all humility and tenderness, and above all by purity of life, a free and full and present salvation. We devoutly acknowledge the presence of the Master with us during the year in the conversion of sinners and in the sanctification of believers. “The best of all is, God is with us,” and to the praise of our great Saviour and Head we record an increase of 1,544 in our membership. Why should not this year upon which we are just entering be even more marked in the conversion of sinners and the upbuilding of believers? Methodism has been pre-eminently a revival movement, and graciously owned of God as such throughout all its history. If this revival work is to go on amongst us we must be united, as pastors and people, in prayer and in the use of the means of grace so honored of God in the past, that “the Word of the Lord have free course and be glorified.” We, therefore, exhort you to be a praying Church, a witnessing people, honoring God in your lives and with your substance.

In this the centenary year of the death of our venerable founder, whose mission it was to spread Scriptural holiness throughout the land, we rejoice to know that the great doctrine of Christian Perfection has been so prominently set forth in the ministry of the Word. Continue to receive this truth with gladness, this great and distinguishing doctrine of Methodism, and let us, as ministers and people, live it before the world, and God shall be glorified in us as a Church. The year has been also one of marked success in our great educational enterprise, Wesley College. The number of students is rapidly increasing. The work done in this institution is of a high order, as shown in the late university examinations. The young men of our ministry are being saved for our work here, having the privilege of attending college within the bounds of our own Conference. We commend Wesley College to your sympathy and prayers, and ask for your continued loyal support.

We mark with joy the advance of settlement and civilization in our new country. Permit us to point out the fact that your moral and political responsibilities are thereby largely increased. We earnestly entreat that the great principles of our Holy Faith dominate your every act of citizenship. Strenuously oppose the deadly error that what is morally wrong may be politically right. Always bear in mind that a pure heart religion must demonstrate itself in social, commercial and political action, if our country ever attains to the full her glorious promise. Great, moral questions confront you; foremost of which is Temperance. The present hour is one of great interest. Various branches of the Christian Church have taken the significant action of unitedly petitioning the Houses of Parliament, praying that the legalized traffic in strong drink, that chief blot on our constitution, be removed. The friends of the traffic are many and wily, and are found in high places. The traffic itself is entrenched in politics. Therefore we beseech you in the interest of our country, of humanity and of the Church of God, keep your ballot clean. Read once again the rules of the society of the people called Methodists, and mark how great is the separation of our Church from the liquor traffic, and determine, by the grace of God, to do nothing that will compromise our beloved Methodism in this matter.

We commend to you the work of the Sabbath-school, as a great field for the development of your own spiritual life, and the most interesting and promising agency for the speedy bringing of the world to Christ. The Church of the future shall be the Church which to-day is throwing her whole energy into the work of winning the children for Christ.

You will notice the great success of that young but vigorous organization, the Epworth League, a movement full of promise, presenting, as it does, a great field of activity for the young people in general, and bringing the young men in particular into touch with the official work of the Church, where we give them cordial welcome. Let these Leagues be formed at every available point, and great blessing shall follow.

Earnestly consider the value of our Church periodicals. We place beyond estimate the advantage of having the *Christian Guardian*, *Methodist Magazine*, and Sunday-school papers in our homes and Sabbath-schools.

Finally brethren, be strong in the Lord, covet the best gifts; and may the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

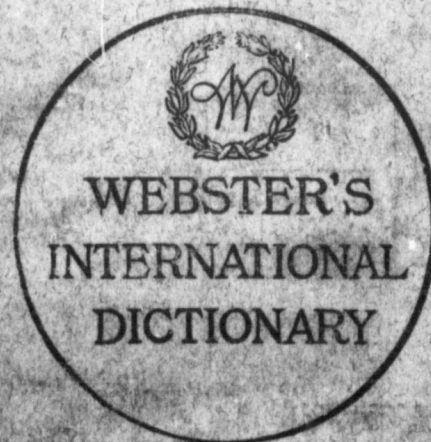
