In the samples employed in the test, the composition was 50 per cent. of coal dust and 3 per cent. of oil. Labor Protests Against New Franchise Bill

A letter protesting akainst section 19 of the new Franchise. Bill, and bearing the signature of Tom Moore, president of the Trades and Labor Congress of Canada, as well as the representatives of the four great railroad brotherhoods, has been sent to Hon. Hugh Guthrie. Solicitor-General. This letterstates that the section named appears to debar labor organizations from contributing directly to election expenses or raising money by individual subscriptions to defray such expenses. It submits that the section is too drastic, and will interfere with legitimate interest and activity of citizens who desire to give practical support to the political and economic welfare of the country through the machinery of their unions.

The letter also recommends that the bill be so amended as to provide that deposits shall be returned to candidates within 10 days after the successful candidate has been declared elected. There were 1,847 railway acci dents during the nine months end-ing December 31, 1919, according to the report of the Board of Railway Commissioners, covering that per-iod, which was tabled in the Comons yesterday. In these accidents for were all persons killed and 1,502 injured. The board in its report notes that only the nine months' period can be covered in this report, as the amendments to the Railway Act require that the

the Railway Act require that the report be presented on December 31 each year, instead of at the end of the fiscal year as formerly. The number of trespassers killed during the nine months was 64, and 68 trespassers were injured.

Highway Crossings Archidents Jamp. Automobile and accidents at highway crossings are on the increase. In the four years and nine months previous to December 31, 1915, there were 231 such accidents. By periods they were as follows: 1916, 15; 1917, 35; 1918, 54; 1919, 66, and 66 in the nine months ending December 31 last year.

Derailments and the deadly unprotected highway crossings accounted for more victims than any other class of accidents during the period of 1919. In the former class of accidents there were '13 people killed and 24' injured. At crossings there were 38 killed and 138 injured.


