To prepare a bill, the Government, in the first instance, drafts a bill, which is then introduced into the House of Commons, and is there read and discussed. The bill is then sent to the Lords, who also read and discuss it. If the bill is passed by both Houses, it is then sent to the Queen for her royal assent. If the bill is not passed by both Houses, it is then sent back to the House of Commons for a second reading.
