The market for ship property has ruled rather quiet during the past month, owing mainly to the extreme views of owners, which greatly restrict operations. Good se ond-hand vessels are held at prices almost equal to the cost of new vessels; consequently buyers prefer building. The demand is very fair, but the offerings of good rateable tonnage are very limited. The future prospect—for the current year at least—is highly encouraging to the shipping interest. Kates of freight at all the most important points of trade are not only well sustained, but at some of them have again advanced, while at most points there is reported a want of tonnage. The usually heavy losses, too, of the present season eave dimanished, to a serious extent, the amount of available tonnage for the year, which the constructions for the same time will hardly cover by one falf.
