The Church of England.—During the last forty years the Established Church of England has spent over £1,000,000 a year in church building and church restoration (over £28,000 a month). She has during the last five years, given at the rate of £241,000 a year for the endowment of her churches; within the last forty years she has built over 5,000 new parsonage houses, in addition to old ones restored, and has increased her incumbents by nearly 8,000. Her outgoes as present number some 5,800, and she raises £282,000 a year to pay them, of which £40,000 is paid by incumbents. The church of England raises, voluntarily over £5,500,000 a year; that is nearly £460,000 a month.

The dog wagged his tail with good-natured composure, and the boy cried, in his childish treble, "Paw Bose has come home." I gathered up my law-books and retreated, and I never had perfect confidence in circumstantial evidence since.—Harper's Magazine.
