



ASSASSINATION CHARGED.

CUBANS SAY GENERAL MACEO WAS MURDERED-WHILE UNDER A FLAG OF TRUCE-OFFICIAL SPANISH DENIAL.

CINCINNATI, Dec. 14. A Jacksonville, Fla., despatch says: This city was thrown into great excitement by the news Sunday afternoon that the patriots had admitted the correctness of the report that Autonio Maceo had been butchered. C. M. Dehau, chiet of the Florida Cuban Junta, gave out the following: A letter received by a prominent Cuban in this city gives a detailed account of the assassination of Gen.

Maceo and his entire staff, with the Maceo and his entire staff, with the exception of Dr. Zertucha, who was maceo's physician. Maceo, never for a moment thinking that treachery was intended, especially as the invitation came from such a prominent Spaniard as the Marquis Ahumada, immediately returned, answer saying he would be glad to meet the Spanish general, and only accompanied by his staff went to the rendezvous, little dreaming of the awful fate in store for him.
