THE ROYAL VISIT

∞ An Important Event in Canadian History ∞



IN 1901 His Majesty King George V and Queen Mary, then the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York, visited Canada, touring the Dominion from Ocean to Ocean. It is needless to say that the journey of the Royal party was a series of magnificent successes from start to finish, the enthusiasm of the Canadian people at every point knowing no bounds.

The Royal train on which the Royal party travelled was a source of attraction throughout the entire trip. Everyone wanted to see it. This was not possible, but that a clear conception of the magnificence of the train might be possessed by Canadians as a whole the present pictorial souvenir of the Royal visit was prepared.

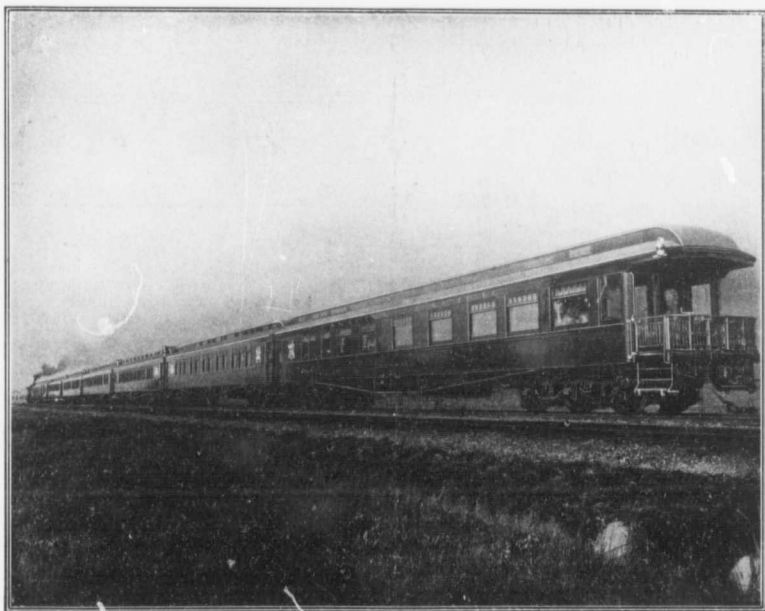
Immediate interest is given the event to-day, and causes the booklet to be eagerly sought for, in the fact that the Royal visitors of a decade ago are to-day the honored and beloved Rulers of the Great British Empire of which Canada is recognized as the brightest gem in the Crown.

Throughout these pages there will be found very fine illustrations of the exterior and interior of the train and along with these a view of the interior of the magnificent palace steamer "Empress of India," on which their Royal Highnesses took passage from Vancouver to Victoria and return. A picture is also shown of the Royal box in Massey Hall on the occasion of the State concert given on the evening of October 10th, 1901.

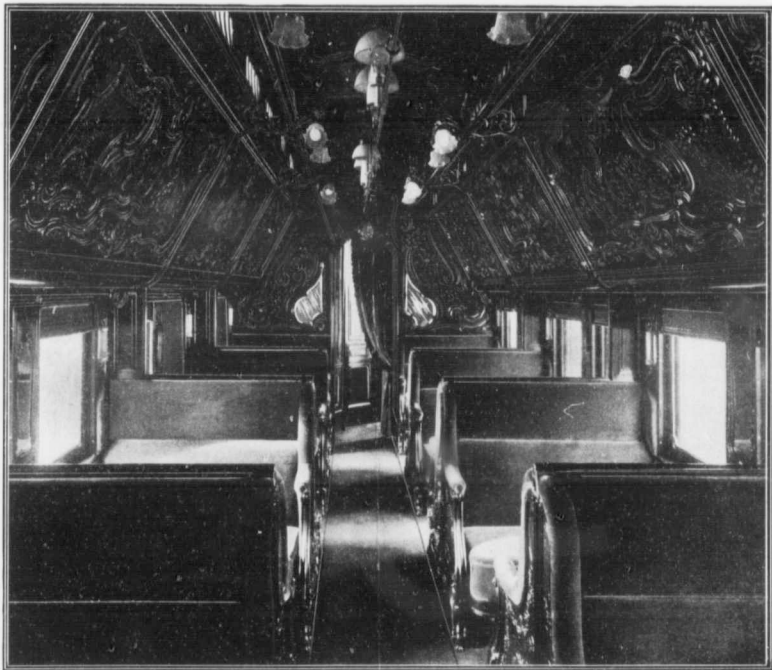

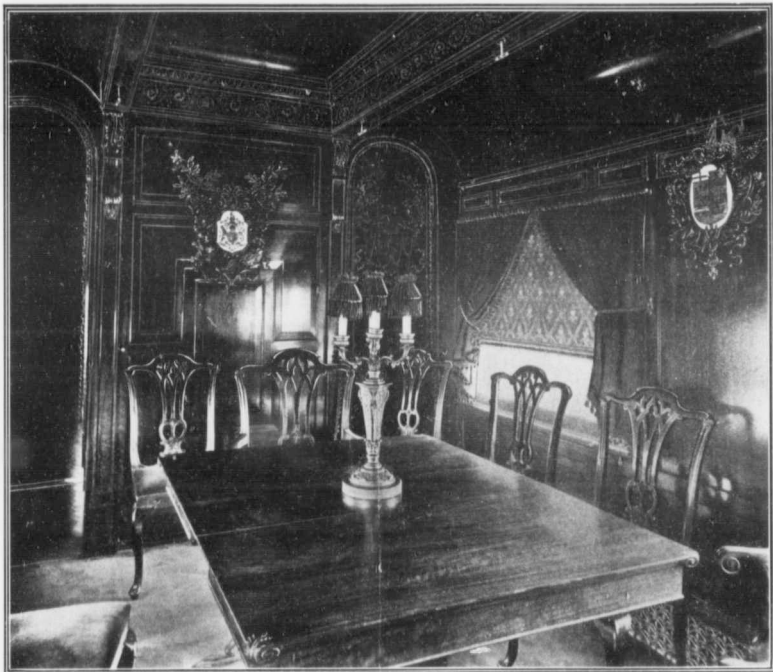


The sleeping cars of the Royal train were designated "Australia," "India," and "South Africa."

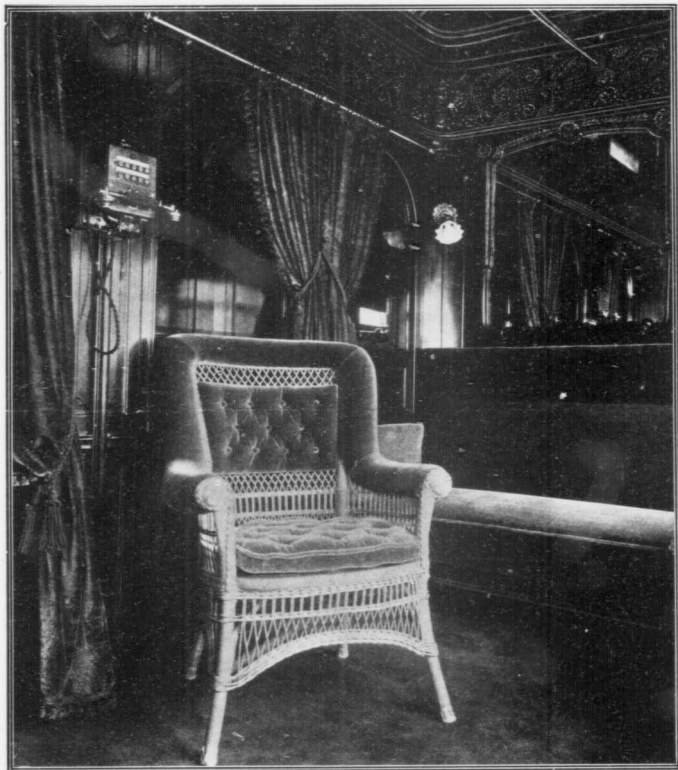
Private dining room, day coach "Cornwall."

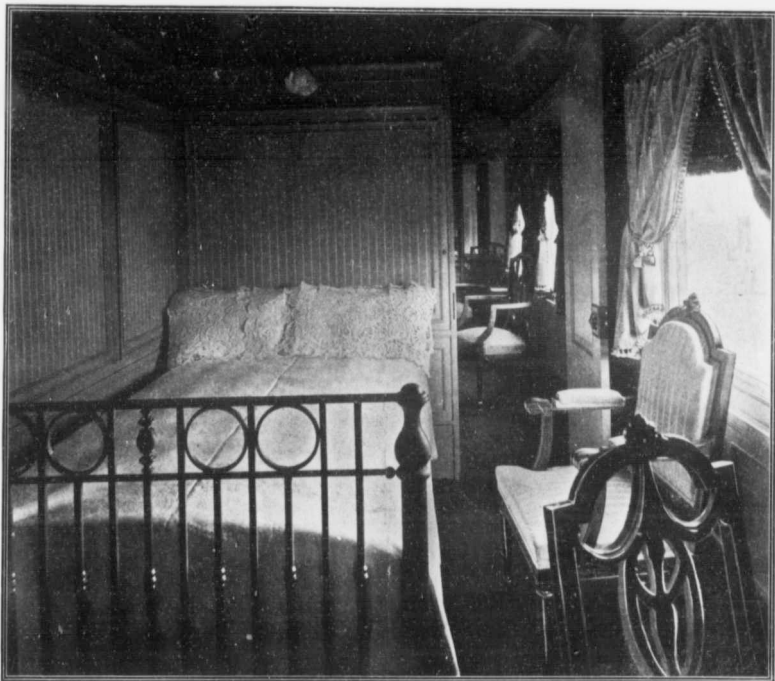


Section of the car "Canada," which is finished in prima vera or white mahogany and upholstered in terra cotta and olive green plush.

A unique telephone system connects with all sections of the Royal train.

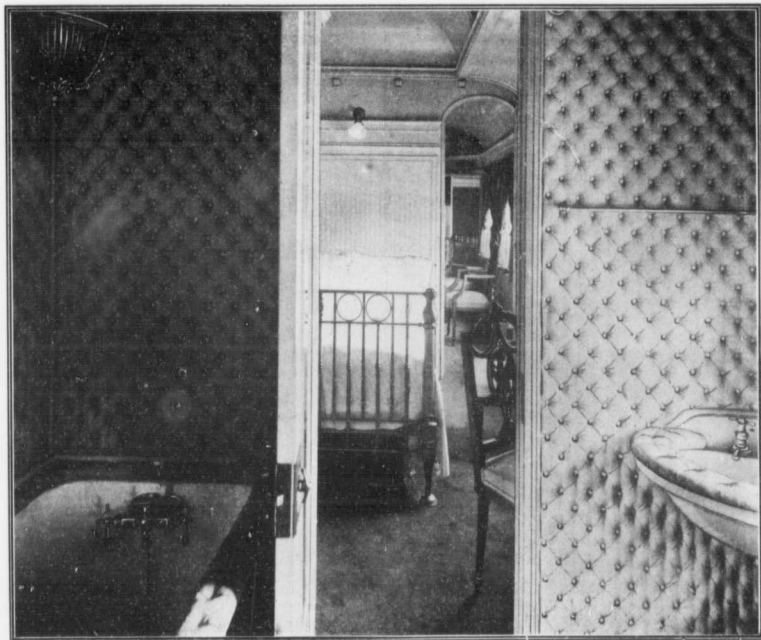


The dining car "Sandringham," which is shown in this view, is on a par in point of completeness and attractions with the other compartments of the train.

This is the latest novelty even in a Royal train. The shower bath is installed in a small chamber, which is upholstered in grey waterproof cloth.

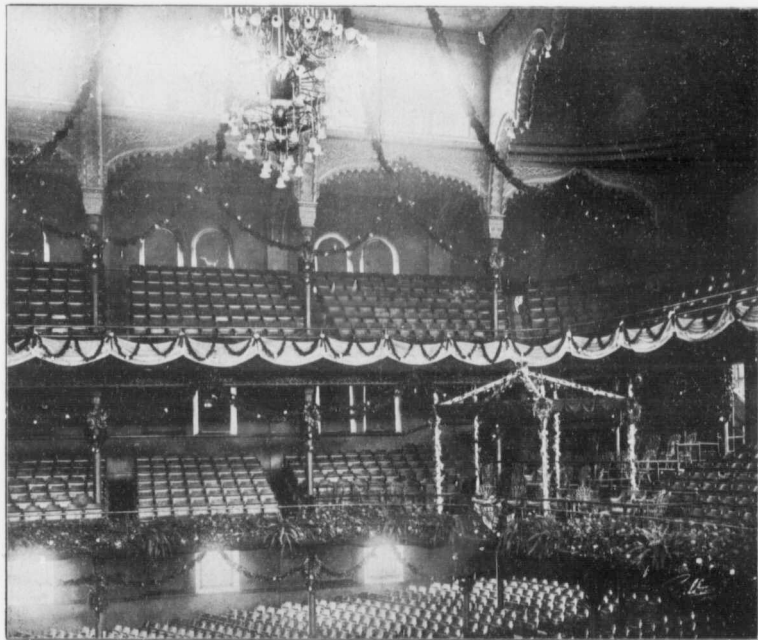
