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## The Order of Morning Prayer.

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¶ *The Service shall be the same with the usual Office for Holy-days, except where it is in this Office otherwise directed.*

¶ *Let him that ministereth read with an audible Voice these Sentences of Scripture; and after them the Exhortation—Dearly beloved Brethren, &c.*

**T**O the Lord our God belong mercies and forgivenesses, though we have rebelled against him; neither have we obeyed the voice of the Lord our God, to walk in his ways, which he set before us.

I will arise and go to my Father; and will say unto him, Father, I have sinned against Heaven and before Thee, and am no more worthy to be called Thy Son.

¶ *Instead of the Venite exultemus, this Hymn shall be used,*

**T**HE sacrifice of God is a troubled spirit; a broken and a contrite heart, O God, Thou wilt not despise.

*I said, I will confess my sins unto the Lord, and so Thou forgavest the wickedness of my sin.*

I will love Thee, O Lord, my strength; the Lord is my rock and my defence; my Saviour, my God, the horn also of my salvation, and my refuge.

*I will call upon the Lord, who is worthy to be praised; so shall I be safe from mine enemies.*

¶ *The two following Collects shall be used instead of the first Collect for the day.*

**A**LMIGHTY and Eternal Lord God, the Supreme Ruler of the Universe, and Arbitrer of Nations, We, Thy sinful creatures do prostrate ourselves before Thee, in this time of danger, and implore Thy merciful protection. Save us, we beseech Thee, from the hands of our enemies, who trust in violence, and delight in blood; who, having turned a deaf ear to the voice of peace, have purposed to overthrow our Religion, Laws and Government, and have marked us out as the devoted victims of their ambition and fury. Confiding in Thy Almighty Power, and not in the aid of men, we fly to Thee for deliverance from these impending calamities. Without Thy assistance, the wisest counsels of men, the multitude

multitude of an host, however great, and the instruments of war, however formidable, are weak and vain. Be Thou to us a tower of defence against the assaults and stratagems of our enemies; and let our refuge be under the shadow of Thy wings, until this tyranny be overpast; that to being preserved by Thy Providence, we may joyfully praise Thy name, acknowledge our Deliverer, and faithfully serve Thee from generation to generation; through Jesus Christ, our only Saviour and Redeemer. *Amen.*

**O** LORD, our Heavenly Father, we acknowledge with grateful hearts, Thine unspeakable goodness in encouraging us to apply to Thee for succour, and to Thy holy word for comfort. We have been signally blessed in the possession of Thy pure Religion, and in the enjoyment of temporal prosperity. But we, alas! have forsaken Thee, the fountain of all happiness; neglecting the substance of our pure Religion; and making our worldly goods the instruments of evil desires and practices. We feel and lament this prevailing sinfulness; and devoutly implore the assistance of Thy grace to restore to us a dutiful sense of thy mercy towards us; beseeching Thee to cleanse and sanctify our hearts by the influences of Thy Holy Spirit; and in the multitude of Thy mercies, through Jesus Christ, to do away our offences, and to remember our iniquities no more.

© let the light of Thy countenance shine upon us this day! Warm and invigorate our drowsy affections; confirm and strengthen our resolutions of amendment, that we may put away all ungodliness and sinful lusts; and earnestly follow after that peace which they have who

love

love Thy law : That so holding fast the profession of our faith in purity of mind, we may finally become acceptable to Thee, through Jesus Christ our Lord.  
*Amen.*

¶ *Then shall follow the Second and third Collects at Morning Prayer—and immediately before the Litaney the following Prayer shall be used.*

**O** GOD, who commandest us, when we are in trouble, to open our hearts, and to tell out our sorrows unto Thee in Prayer, and dost promise to listen with compassion to our humble supplications ; Give us grace so to approach Thee, that we offend not in word or thought. Put away from us every impatient feeling, silence every unworthy expression ; let not our Prayers assume the language of complaint ; nor our sorrows the character of despair.

Upon Thee, O God, and upon the multitude of Thy mercies, we repose our grief. To Thee we look for that blessing, for which our hearts bleed. Raise, we implore Thee, our beloved Sovereign from the bed of sickness and of affliction ; soothe his parental cares ; restore him to his family, and to his people.

And of Thy great mercy, O God, look down with pity and compassion on the accumulated sorrows of the Royal Family. Give them strength, and courage, and virtue to meet, with pious submission, the grievous trial to which they are exposed ; and whether it shall seem fit to Thine unerring wisdom, presently to remove from us this great calamity, or for a time to suspend it over us, teach both them and us, patiently to adore thy inscrutable Providence, and to bless Thy holy name for ever and ever.

## Morning Prayer.

These prayers and supplications we humbly address to Thy Divine Majesty, in the name, and through the mediation of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

*Amen.*

¶ *Then shall followe the Litany; and after the Prayer (We humbly beseech Thee, &c.) the following shall be used—*

**O** LORD, most good and powerful, we Thy sinful people, here assembled before Thee, do acknowledge it thine unspeakable mercy, that for our manifold and heinous provocations we are not utterly consumed, and given over a prey to our enemies. We confess with sorrow our long unfruitfulness under the means of grace, and the light of Thy Gospel, and the many wonderful deliverances of our Church and Civil Constitution, which Thou, in Thy great goodness, hast vouchsafed unto us. Shouldest Thou, O Lord, enter into judgment with us for the crying sins that abound among us—our infidelity and profaneness, our heresies and schisms, our gross impurities and intemperance, our lukewarmness in Thy cause, and neglect of Thy ordinances, and our other manifold offences: Thou mightest justly inflict upon us the severity of Thy wrath, and deliver us up to the insults and oppression of our cruel enemies. But there is mercy with Thee, therefore shalt thou be feared. Thou art the Lord God, tender and full of compassion; not willing that any should perish; but that all should repent, and be saved. Look down, therefore, we beseech Thee, with an eye of pity and loving kindness on us Thy servants, who, with contrite hearts, do here bewail our transgressions and wretchedness.

Let our land, in this time of trouble, still enjoy the light of Thy countenance, and the blessings of Thy bountiful hand; and so work upon our hearts and minds, by the influences of Thy Holy Spirit, that being turned from the evil and error of our ways, and created to newness of life, we may walk before Thee in all holiness and righteousness in this world, and inherit Thine everlasting kingdom in that which is to come, through the merits of Jesus Christ, our only mediator and advocate.

*¶ Then the People shall say this that followeth, after the Minister,*

**T**URN us, O good Lord, and so shall we be turned. Be favourable, O Lord; be favourable to Thy people; who turn to Thee in Fasting, and mourning, and Praying. For Thou art a merciful God, full of compassion, long suffering, and of great pity. Thou sparest when we deserve punishment; and in Thy wrath thinkest upon mercy. Spare Thy people, good Lord, spare them; and let not Thy heritage be brought to confusion. Hear us, O Lord, for Thy mercy is great; and after the multitude of Thy mercies look upon us, through the merits and mediation of Thy blessed Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

*¶ Instead of the Prayer in time of War and Tumults, let the following be used,*

**O** ALMIGHTY GOD, maker of the universe, and sovereign Disposer of the affairs of men; at whose command nations and empires rise and fall, flourish and decay: We, Thine unworthy servants, most humbly implore Thy gracious aid and protection,

We flee to Thee for succour in this time of peril and necessity, when, in defence of our liberty, our laws, and Religion we are exposed to the dangers and calamities of war. Vouchsafe, we beseech Thee, Thine especial protection to Thy servant, our beloved Sovereign. Direct his councils, prosper all his measures for the welfare of his subjects, and for the preservation of our Church and Civil Constitution. Let no internal divisions, nor any other sins and provocations of the nation, obstruct his designs for the public good, nor bring down Thy judgments upon us. But spare Thy people, O Lord, spare them; and by Thy grace, so unite us in a spirit of obedience to Thy law, zeal for Thy truth, and loyalty to Thine anointed servant, whom Thy good Providence hath set over us; that we may evermore rejoice in Thy salvation, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

¶ *A Prayer for the United Kingdom, for our Allies, and for the Church.*

**O** LORD and heavenly Father, look down, we pray Thee, with compassion, on the whole race of mankind; particularly on the people of the United Kingdom, and of this Colony, and on those who are involved with us in the dangers and distresses of the present war. Enable us patiently to bear the evils which are necessarily incident to such a contest, and all other temporal afflictions; and instruct us, by Thy grace, to follow those things which make for peace, and for our eternal salvation, so that our trials may finally promote our everlasting interests. Regard, we beseech Thee, with Thine especial favour, the Church to which we belong. Protect and defend it from adversaries and e-

gion and piety, may be established among us for all generations. These and all other necessities, for them, for us, and Thy whole Church, we humbly beg in the name and mediation of Jesus Christ, our most blessed Lord and Saviour. *Amen.*

## Communion Service.

¶ *After the Prayer for the King (Almighty God, whose Kingdom is everlasting, &c.) shall be read the two Collects of the day as in the Morning Prayer (Almighty and eternal Lord God, &c.) and (O Lord, our heavenly Father, &c.) and then shall follow—*

¶ *For the Epistle, Isaiah, LVIII.*

¶ *The Gospel, Luke, XIII, 1—9 inclusive.*

¶ *Then shall follow the Nicene Creed, and after that the Sermon.*

¶ *After the Prayer for the whole state of Christ's Church militant, the following shall be used—*

**B**LESSED Lord, who at sundry times and in divers manners, hast been pleased to manifest Thy singular mercy to our nation in the preservation of our Religion, our Laws, our Liberties and Government from the secret conspiracies and open attempts of those who had purposed to destroy them: We, adoring Thy glorious



glorious Majesty, with all praise and thanksgiving for the same, most humbly and earnestly beseech Thee to impress continually upon our minds such a grateful remembrance of these invaluable blessings, that by our religious and exemplary use of them to Thy honour and service, we may obtain the continuance of Thy Protection. Take away from us, O Lord, all hardness of heart, all neglect of Thy ordinances, all contempt of Thy word and commandments. Endue us with a spirit of piety and devotion; a spirit of justice and temperance, of humility and charity, and of all other graces which should adorn the Christian profession; that so Thy dreadful displeasure and judgments may be averted, and iniquity not become our ruin; and that we being Thy faithful people, Thou mayest dwell among us, and defend us from all our spiritual and temporal enemies; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

**W**E humbly beseech Thee, most merciful God, that by Thy grace, Thou wouldst keep alive in us, who have this day presumed to implore such great blessings at Thy hands, a constant sense of Thy presence, and dependence on Thee. Suffer us not to return to our former lukewarmness, neglect of duty, or violation of Thy holy laws; nor again to yield to those evil passions and desires which have brought down Thy judgments upon us. But save us, O merciful God; save us, not only from our worldly, but also from our spiritual enemies; and most especially save us from ourselves; for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

O Lord and Heavenly father, look down upon us, O pray Thee, with compassion, &c.

¶ *The Prayer for the Clergy and People, (Almighty and everliving God)*

¶ *Immediately before the Prayer for all conditions of men (O God, the creator and preserver of all mankind, &c. shall be used the Prayer for the King and Royal Family, as at Morning Prayer.*

¶ *The Prayer for the Legislature (Most Gracious God, &c.)*

¶ *The following Prayers shall be then used (Blessed Lord, who at sundry times, and in divers manners, hast been pleased to manifest, &c.) and (We humbly beseech thee, O Lord our God, &c.) as at Morning Prayer.*

¶ *The Prayer of St. Chrysostom (Almighty God, who hast given us grace at this time with one accord, &c.)*

**T**HE face of God, which passeth all understanding, and is seen in your hearts and minds in the knowledge of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, and of the Holy Spirit of God Almighty, the Father, who is with you, and is amongst you, and is
