The Venerable Archdeacon Allen died on 11th November. He was one of the earliest members of the Cathedral Chapter, and has been one of the most prominent Clergy of the Diocese for many years.

The Bishop has appointed the Rev. George Warren, B.A., Rector of Lakefield, to be Archdeacon of Peterborough in succession to the Rev. Thomas William Allen, deceased.

The Bishop has appointed the Rev. John Cheyne Davidson, M.A., to be a Canon of St. Alban's Cathedral, with the Prebendal Stall of Peterborough.

PAROCHIAL MISSIONARY COLLECTIONS.

At the Triennial Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, held in October last, it was stated that in ten years, \$40,000 had been collected by the P.M.C. in this Diocese.

Returns of the St. Alban's Branch are: for September, \$14.35; November, \$18.90; December, \$22.90.

A meeting was held at the residence of the Sec.-Treas. on November 9th, at which new collectors were appointed and other business transacted. Canon Macnab addressed a few encouraging and helpful remarks to those present.

THE ALTAR GUILD.

The Annual Meeting of the Altar Guild was held on November 29th at 87 Howland Avenue. Canon Macnab presided and there was a good attendance of the Committee and members. The Directress presented her report for the year, shewing faithful work from the members and a satisfactory balance in the accounts.

A new set of purple book markers has been given by a friend, and worked by a member of the Altar Guild.

THE CATHEDRAL LEAGUE.

The Cathedral League is fairly well established and numbers fifty-seven members in the St. Alban's Branch alone. The interest is spreading, and it is hoped that every member will make a fresh effort to procure other members throughout the Diocese. The interest was noticeable at the Exhibition of Work held in the School on Saturday afternoon the 25th November, when a very successful display of work, including art, fancy work and useful items, was made. Afternoon tea served by some of the members of the League formed an important and enjoyable addition to the Exhibition.

EXTENSION.

A meeting of the Sub-Committee was held lately at which it was decided to issue subscription cards, a number of which have been distributed accordingly. There has not yet been sufficient time to enable results to be seen, or anticipated. It was announced at the meeting that there has been given and promised (promises in some cases contingent upon a due measure of success) altogether about \$2,500, all of which, with the exception of some small amounts, had been given or promised voluntarily and without solicitation or canvassing.
