ORDERED TO SIT DOWN. Mr. De Souza again received a hearing in the court of appeal.

In the court of appeal yesterday Mr. De Souza, the English barrister, rose to move a pending case. The court stopped him, saying, We have decided against you before. You are trifling with the court.

Mr. De Souza: Out of respect to your lordship I have that observation without reply. On the former occasion I was about to move for one Hunter; but in reference to the court I proceeded not with my motion. I now am a counsel for another person; and being required to make this motion, and convinced of my right to make it, I am compelled to do so.

The court: We told you that we respect the decision of the court of appeal, and would abide by it. You yourself reported it to us. Mr. De Souza: In a question of respect, but of my right, Your lordship emphatically told me on March 3 that you were not bound by the decision of the common law. First, my mentioning the matter to you could not make it cognizable in its nature it was not so, and secondly, your information was not derived from me. As I was about to mention the matter you stopped me, saying that you could not but know what was common talk in the press, but that you could not take cognizance of it.

The court: We leave the decision of the matter to the lower court; we sit as a court of appeal.

Mr. De Souza: You have already determined this point. You told me on March 3 that if I appealed before you in a pending case you would be bound by the authority of the sergeant's case. My present attitude is a necessary outcome of your own suggestion.

The court: We should be sorry if we had to see any evidence nearly marked. Mr. De Souza: I lack under the impulse of professional duty, which I am bound to perform at whatever hazard. It may be painful to myself and disagreeable to you, but I should be unworthy of my position if I allowed either of these considerations to restrain me from a proper duty.

The court:—We, too, have a duty to perform. We must be consistent. We desire to see you to do down.

Mr. De Souza:—Your consistency is for my duty is for me. Before I sit down I would bound to perform a proper duty, tender affidavits, etc., identifying myself. I am head in the bath of allegiance; and ask those who have been received.

The court:—The court declined, and again desired him to be seated.

Mr. De Souza asked that the matter might be recorded, for otherwise there is nothing to show what has passed. The personality of the court might be changed before to-morrow.

The court again refused, and Mr. De Souza sat down.
