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

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STANDING RULES AND REGULATIONS

OF THE -

THE CORPORATION COUNCIL OF

UNITED COUNTIES OF STORMONT, DUNDAS AND GLENGARRY,

As Revised and Adopted by the Council, October, 1886. and as subsequently altered and amended.

Meetings and Adjournments of the Council.

1. The Council shall meet at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, at the Hours of Court House, Cornwall, unless otherwise especially provided; and meeting and if at the time appointed there be no quorum, the Warden, or the adjournment. Chairman appointed in his absence, may take the chair and adjourn with the consent of the majorty then present.

2. When the Council adjourns, the members shall keep their bers shall leave seats. seats until the Warden or Chairman leaves the chair.

3. Whenever the Warden or Chairman is obliged to adjourn the when names Council for want of a quorum, the hour at which such adjournment to be taken is made, and the names of the members then present, shall be in- down. serted in the minutes of the Council.

4. When a quorum is present, the Warden or Chairman shall Appearance take the chair and call the members to order. The roll shall then of a quorum. be called.

5. Immediately after the Warden or Chairman shall have taken be read. Minutes to the chair, the minutes of the preceding day shall be read by the Clerk. Any error or omission in the minutes shall then be corrected When reports by the Council.

All the reports, by-laws and memorials adopted by the Council ed in body of shall be printed in the appendix to the minutes.

6. In the election of Warden, the names of the candidates shall The Election of Warden. be placed in the hands of the Clerk immediately after the members shall have taken their seats, and in case of more than one candidate being proposed, then the Clerk shall name two scrutineers from the members present, and shall proceed to take the vote by ballot. He shall check the vote after being counted by the scrutineers, and shall declare the number of votes cast for each candidate : he shall continue the ballot-dropping the name of the candidate having the least number of votes-until a majority of the members present has been obtained for one of the candidates, when he shall declare the candidate who has so obtained said majority duly elected. In case of a tie the question shall be decided as provided by R. S. O.

1887, chap. 184, sec. 227.
7. The Warden or Chairman shall preserve order, and decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Council.

8. When the Warden or Chairman is called upon to explain a point of order or practice, he is to state the rule applicable to the der, dc. case without argument or comment, and when objection is taken to the ruling of the Warden or Chairman, members may discuss the point of order before the vote is taken.

9. In case the Warden shall not be in attendance the Clerk When chairshall call the meeting to order until a Chairman be chosen, who man is to be shall preside until the arrival of the Warden. If the Warden or chosen. Chairman desire to leave the chair for the purpose of taking part in the debate, or otherwise, he shall appoint one of the members of Council to fill his place until he resumes the chair.
