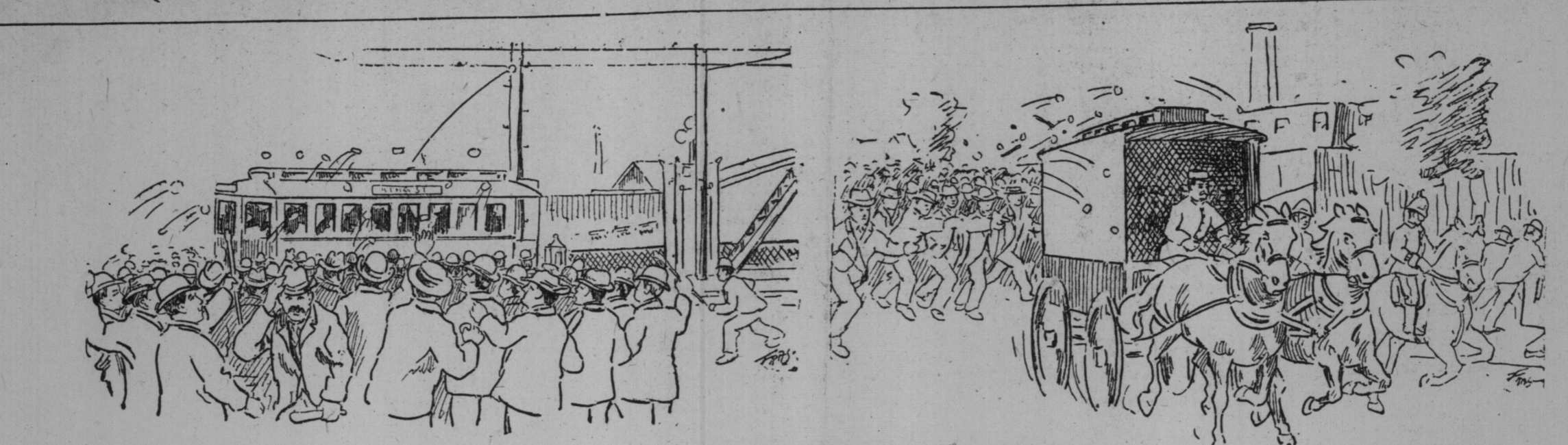

No sooner had the doors of the north end barn than a missile crashed through the vestibule window, striking Whitehead. The bullet passed through the power, and the car started on its way. It had not reached the Don bridge before six men were on the car, protected by six policemen, who were also on the platform. The car got to the top of the hill and was quickly distributed to the best advantage.

Several cars had their windows demolished, and it was a wonder that those in charge of them were not seriously injured by the flying missiles. Before 6 o'clock the strikers commenced to gather, and a half an hour later there was a good sized mob, which was being steadily augmented. The police arrived about this time and were quickly distributed to the best advantage.

Men Lodged in Barn. Three or four more loads of non-union men were also conveyed to the north end barn and lodged safely, despite the threatening attitude of the crowd. The police, however, suffered in this expedition. Driver Rose of one of the wagons was badly injured by being hit in the back by a stone, and accounted for the scattered of the crowd.
