

Sultan Agrees to Reforms Ambassadors Are Notified

Christians To Be Allowed To Be Soldiers Without Knowing Turkish Language.

What Powers Ask.
The identical note on the subject of reforms in Macedonia, presented to the Grand Vizier on Saturday by the Austro-Hungarian and Russian ambassadors, has been translated into Turkish, and was handed to the Sultan the same evening. The powers recommend, in addition to the appointment of an Inspector-General of Germany for three years, with ample powers to act independently, and to preside in cases of emergency.

BIBLE FOR KING EDWARD.
To Be Purchased by British Bible Society.

JUST before the coronation of King Edward VII., according to the report of the British and Foreign Bible Society for 1900, the society, thru its president, the Marquess of Northampton, asked the King if he would accept a Bible published by the society for

use in the coronation ceremonies in Westminster Abbey. The King replied in the affirmative. Afterwards it was ascertained that Bibles used at a coronation service must contain the Apocrypha, and, as the Bibles printed by the society do not contain the Apocrypha, the society was compelled to forego the proposed gift to the King. After the coronation the King expressed his desire for a book printed by the society, which, he said, he would prize highly as a memento of the coronation.

The Bible that the society has prepared for presentation has been completed.
