"PACIFY" MEXICO President Decides to Serve Notice on Warring Factions That Means Will Be Taken to Enforce Peace. Washington, May 28—President Wil-son has decided to serve notice on all the warring factions in Mexico that con-ditions in that country have become in-tolerable, and that unless they, them-selves, compose the situation soon, some other means may have to be employed to accomplish the result. The first intimation of the president's day in his appeal issued as head of the American Red Cross Society setting forth that "due to several years of inter-nal disturbances, the unfortunate people of many parts of Mexico have been re-duced to the verge of starvation," and urging contributions to relief funds. Later the White House gave out the for the Mexicans was issued it was also stated at the executive offices that a statement from the president on the present situation in Mexico might be expected within the next few days." This statement has been prepared and will be issued after the cabinet meeting next Tuesday, and then communicated to the leaders of all the Mexican fac-tions.

ALIENS PLEAD GUILTY TO FRAUD IN U. S. COURT


IN U. S. COURT New York, May 28—Pleas of guilty were entered in the Federal Court late today by Franz Rosenberg, of Hanover, Germany; Sigmund Karman and Al-bert B. Newman, of Hungary, to indict-ments charging them with having de-frauded the United States by filing false manifests at the Custom House in connection with an alleged effort to get contraband of war to belligerents by concealing rubber within bales of cot-ton waste and barrels of rosin shipped on the steamers Carpathia and Cretic-The first two were fined \$500 each, and Newman \$200. The three men admitted that their purpose was to circumvent the Allies, and by so doing they believed they were performing a patriotic duty. Before sentence was passed, Roger B. Wood, assistant United States district attorney, asked for severe punishment for the men "who engage in a scheme likely to cast suspicion on the shipments of every honest merchant in the United States," and which, he added, "might perhaps justify the Allies in seizing all shipments from this country."
