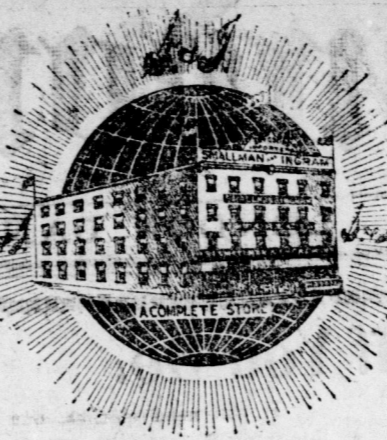

A GRACIOUS ACT

Of the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York—Visited Principal Grant in the General Hospital—The Duke's Apt Replies.

Kingston, Ont., Oct. 15.—An incident of a pleasing character in connection with the visit of the duke and duchess was their calling at the General Hospital to see Rev. G. M. Grant, who is convalescing there. The visit was brief, but cheerful, and the duke took occasion to invest the distinguished principal of Queen's College with the C. M. G. conferred upon him by the King. The duchess showed her solicitude by asking about the hospital and its equipment. She also spoke to two sick nurses. At the college the duke made a digression by planting a tree.

THEIR NEW HOME. The Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York, when they return from their trip around the world will take possession of the Marlborough House, which was presented to the duke by King Edward VII. The title of Prince of Wales will be conferred on the duke on his return. The necessary documents have been prepared, and the residence will be appended as a special nursery wing of the Marlborough House so as to fit the residence for its future occupants. A special nursery wing will be added to the structure, and the orders are that this shall be completed before the announcement of the duchess in April next.

Western Ontario. Live Items Culled for Busy People's Information.

Addison S. Barber died at St. Thomas on Monday evening, Van Tuyl, a Portland, N. Y., Feb. 21, 1821, being in the 81st year of his age. He was removed to his first wife's residence in 1834. The old Michigan Central ice house, St. Thomas, was almost totally destroyed by fire on Monday evening, Oct. 15. The building was a three-story structure, and was built by the late James M. McDonald. The fire broke out at about 10 o'clock, and was extinguished by the fire department. The loss was estimated at \$20,000.

GOOD-BYE TO KINGSTON. When the steamer Kingston left port his royal highness stood on the bridge of the steamer with arms outstretched and Capt. Esford. It was a quarter of two o'clock when the ropes of the steamer were hauled in. The big steamer swung slowly out from the wharf, the cannon from Point Frederick boomed out a royal salute. The multitudinous of people on the wharves cheered lustily, and the whistles of every steamer along the shore sounded a farewell blast.

AT A MEMORABLE MOMENT. It was a memorable moment for Principal Grant when the heir to the throne of Britain and the English princess entered the general hospital where he lay ill, propped up in bed to give him their greeting and to express their hope that he would soon recover his health and strength. Their royal highnesses conversed a few moments with the principal, and the duke decorated him with the Order of Companion of St. Michael and St. George (C. M. G.) When the royal visitors were about to take their departure, Principal Grant, with a broad smile, informed them that he was gratified that they had been graciously pleased to pay him a visit, he would return it at some future period, and both the duke and the duchess smiled and laughed, and hoped to see the principal in the home land some day.

SMALLPOX AND TYPHOID. Montreal, Oct. 15.—A sick patient was taken to the Notre Dame Hospital last night, and it was afterwards found that he was suffering from smallpox. He was removed to the civic hospital, Sydney, N. S., Oct. 15.—A Frenchman named LaPere, who came here two weeks ago from St. Hyacinthe, Quebec, Oct. 16.—Dr. J. H. Stewart, surgeon, lieutenant-colonel of the R. C. A., ridicules the report emanating from Montreal, that he had contracted typhoid fever had broken out among the non-commissioned officers and men of the Duke of York's Canadian Hussar regiment to Quebec.

SUDDEN DEATHS. Thamesville, Ont., Oct. 15.—Miss Bedford, eldest daughter of William Bedford, of Camden township, while working outside, suddenly sank to the ground and expired. The cause is supposed to be the bursting of a blood vessel at the base of the brain. Waterford, N. Y., Oct. 15.—Rev. Joseph W. Hartman, a Methodist preacher, died suddenly of apoplexy on a railway train near Union Springs last night. He had preached at Odessa, and was assigned by the conference to the Methodist Episcopal Church of Union Springs.

FATALLY BURNED. St. Catharines, Ont., Oct. 15.—Anna Phelan, the 5-year-old daughter and only child of Thomas Phelan, Wellington street, was fatally burned yesterday, and died tonight at 7 o'clock. She was playing in the yard, where some rubbish was being burned up, and in some way her clothes caught fire. She was frightfully burned over the entire body.

MARVELOUS ESCAPE. St. Thomas, Oct. 15.—M. McCoy, one of Kenny's Michigan Central gang, had a miraculous escape from death on Saturday. He was walking on the track when he was struck by an engine at Montrose. He was knocked down and the locomotive and ten cars passed over him. He escaped with a few playing wounds and an injury to one of his legs. He was removed to the hospital room in the depot at Clifton, where his injuries were dressed.

Progress in the Klondike.

F. C. Wade, formerly of Winnipeg, and at present crown prosecutor for the Yukon, gives an interesting sketch of the history of the Klondike district.

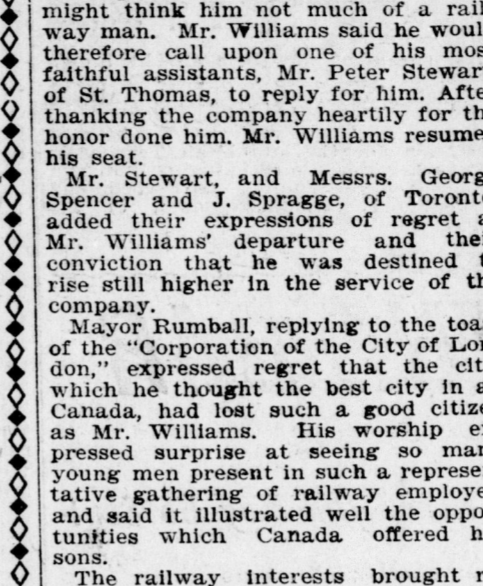

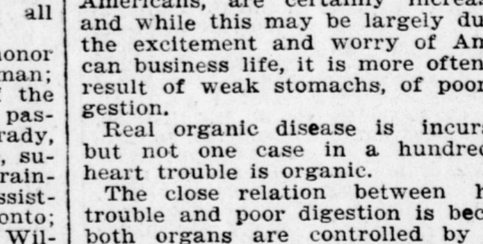

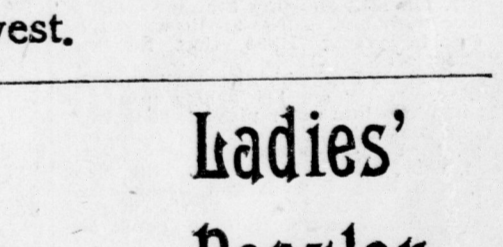
