SHIPMENT OF POTATOES TO UNITED STATES. On and after the 1st January, 1916, Potatoes may be shipped from Canada to the United States, subject to the following conditions:

1. Potatoes offered for export to the United States must be free from injurious diseases and insect pests.

2. No shipment may be made until a permit has been issued in the United States regulations. Each shipment should therefore be designated on the accompanying papers by the permit number which will be furnished by the United States inspector.

3. No inspection or certification will be required prior to shipment, but potatoes and shippers are advised that the continuation of such entry will depend on the offering for entry from dangerous diseases and insect pests.

All persons engaged in trade should have their potatoes carefully "racked," and any diseased or scabby potatoes removed.
