All the Red Cross and hospital arrangements proved perfect. All lights were extinguished and public performances at the theatres and music halls were aband oned.

The people went home and the town was without light till morning."

The air-raider passed along the sea front and dropped the first bomb into Norfolk Square Garden close by the beach and the Britannia Pier. This did no damage.

The raider then proceeded in a southwesterly direction across the town and when near the centre, dropped several bombs in the neighborhood of St. Peter's Road, the main thoroughfare leading to the Parade grounds. It was there that the greatest damage was done, especially in the smashing of windows in houses and shops.
