BOER VISITORS.

The Boer delegates who are making a tour of Canada studying Canadian agricultural methods, arrived in Kentville on Wednesday afternoon at 4 o'clock from Wolfville.

The visitors were Mr. and Mrs. Moody Lane, of Bloekstorp, H. F. Rood of Pretoria and Mr. and Mrs. Joorte. They are being accompanied through Canada by Capt. H. J. and Mrs. Kirkpatrick, of Pretoria, and by W. W. Moore, of the agricultural department, Ottawa, President Bigelow, of Wolfville, and Col. Blair, of Truro, accompanied them from Wolfville to Kentville.

They were guests of the Aberdeen Hotel and were met by the Mayor, Town Council and a delegation from the Board of Trade and also a few prominent farmers. Mr. M. G. DeWolf was present and presented each lady with a beautiful bunch of Sweet Peas. As Mrs. Kirkpatrick is a blonde he presented her with a bunch of pure white ones.

Those who were in conversation with the visitors found them most affable and highly delighted with what they had seen of Canada. The woods and beautiful streams were of much interest to them, as such as is found in Canada is not seen in their country.

They will be in Canada about two months, after which they will return to their own country filled with valuable information in regards farming etc., far advanced of their methods. Messrs. Joorte and Moody Lane, are wealthy men owning fifteen large farms. The latter is an Irishman who went to the Transvaal, thirty years ago. Mr. Rood, of Pretoria, is a young man, a son of an immensely wealthy Boer. All three men fought through the war, either until it ended, or until captured. Mr. Lane and Mr. Joorte, were amongst those of Cronje's soldiers who surrendered after the gallant night attack by the First Canadian Contingent at Paardeberg.

BOERS AT BERMUDA

A DENSTAN II.

Before the joyful news of the cessation of hostilities in South Africa reached Bermuda, several of the prisoners asked to be permitted to take the oath of allegiance. Report to that effect soon spread throughout the camp, and those who were desirous to become loyal to Great Britain were hurriedly rushed into the water by their fellow prisoners, and in order to prevent drowning, the soldiers were ordered out and after a brief struggle the few helpless ones were rescued from the azure deep and their unworthy comrades. Such is an account of one of the many similar incidents.

On several occasions a daring Boer effected his escape, but only to be recaptured. One succeeded in eluding the guards and swam about half a mile to the United States mail boat and managed to reach New York in safety. In all other cases, however, the fugitives were captured soon after their escape, as a roll in each camp was called twice a day. The reward offered by the British for an escaped prisoner was \$15, and one colored Bermudian was fortunate enough to secure \$45 in one day for having captured three by strategy.

Very strict discipline was observed in the camps during hostilities. The waters around the prison islands were marked off with buoys inside of which no craft was permitted, except the government duty boat, conveying provisions and mail. Several natives were bold enough to trespass on the forbidden waters, but they rapidly withdrew when a shot would pierce their sail or lodge in their boat, and in one instance a man was shot in the wrist for disobeying martial law. These buoys were placed about 500 yards from the shore.

Besides having military guards around the island, several war ships were placed among the various camps, and their searchlights were frequently used after dark. It was owing to the ships' searchlights that several fugitives were recaptured while endeavoring to swim across the main island. One prisoner was caught climbing the iron barbed wire fence encircling the camp and was hailed by the sentry, but owing to him treating the call with contempt a bullet was sent through him, and he was taken up lifeless.

The death rate among the prisoners was very small considering their dirty manner of living. Only once were three buried in one day. The average was about two per week, and this speaks for Bermuda's excellent climate.

Mayor Yould stated how pleased the town had been to entertain all the exhibitors and friends.

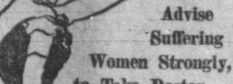
Sir Frederick Borden said he had consolation in two facts that this fair had been a great success.

New Use for Refined Paraffine Wax

A new and important use for Refined Paraffine Wax seems to have been discovered by a prominent resident of Ohio, living near Lancaster, who had two trees badly damaged by storm, one being a maple and the other an apple. In each case a large limb was broken down from the trunk, but still attached to it. The limbs were propped up and fastened securely with straps, very much as a broken leg might be fastened with splints and then melted refined wax poured into and over all the cracks. The "surgical operation" was entirely successful. The Paraffine prevented the escape of the sap, kept out the rain and moisture which would have rotted the trees, prevented the depredations of insects, and the limbs seem thus far to be perfectly re-attached to the trees.
