General News.

The international monetary conference convened at Brussels last Wednesday.

Mrs. Elizabeth McNeil, who lives at Clyde's Cove, Harrington, Co. Que., and is 110 years of age, is supposed to be the oldest woman in Canada.

Canada will have a splendid geological exhibit at Chicago. It is being prepared by the geological survey department under special instructions from Hon. Mr. Daly.

A golden throne of the value of \$2,500,000 is to be presented to the Pope by the united subscriptions of all the Roman Catholic catholics in the world. It is to be given to His Holiness on the occasion of his episcopal jubilee.

Gen. Peary will be allowed to make his second trip towards the north pole. The secretary of the navy will sign an order granting Mr. Peary the three years' leave of absence which was asked for him by the Philadelphia Academy of Natural Sciences.

A Meteor of great brilliancy passed over Kenoche, Wis., early last Wednesday morning, its course being towards the north east. It exploded soon after passing the zenith and a report like distant thunder was heard about one minute afterwards. The trail of light was visible fully five minutes.

A Dublin professor has made the calculation that if men were really as big as they sometimes feel there would be room in the British Isles for only two professors, three lecturers, two doctors and the editor of an evening paper. The rest would be crowded into the sea and have to swim for it.

A petition, signed by 200 residents of Magdalen Island, has been presented to the members of the Quebec cabinet, asking that on account of their position and special needs, they be separated from the county of Gaspé. The ministers promised to take up the matter and introduce a bill concerning it at the next session of the legislature.

One of the worst car famines ever experienced in South Dakota exists at present. Elevators and grain houses on all railroads are full, many of them loaded beyond their safe capacity. Grain has been rolling into the markets at a most rapid rate until the entire rolling stock and motive power of the railroads have been exhausted.

A scandal has been discovered in connection with the management of Kingston penitentiary. Stores purchased for the institution have been disappearing mysteriously of late and as a result of an investigation by Inspector Maylan, the accounts of many of them loaded beyond their safe capacity. Grain has been rolling into the markets at a most rapid rate until the entire rolling stock and motive power of the railroads have been exhausted.

The Grand Trunk has discharged 40 of its oldest employees at Fort Horne, Mich. For years the company has given its men reduced freight rates and they have bought their coal abroad. It has been discovered that the men were in the habit of ordering three times as much as they needed and have been supplying their neighbors. The company is angry and many of the best men have been discharged.

The department of agriculture has received a letter from Rev. Dr. McCulloch, of Toronto, N. B., offering to exhibit at the World's Fair a quadruped used by Columbus on his voyages of discovery. It appears that a Scottish merchant in the early part of the last century bought the quadruped at a sale of Columbus's effects in Spain and afterwards bequeathed it to his son, who in turn gave it to Dr. McCulloch's father in 1825. The quadruped has been in Dr. McCulloch's possession since 1843.

Henry Horndon, a prominent stockman of Clarksville, Tenn., has a horse whose affection is puzzling the horsemen of that section. The animal is a very fine one, and in the daytime valuable, but at night is useless, becoming as blind as a bat after dark, and will not move when hitched to harness. If the horse is turned on a pasture to graze at night he will be found within ten feet of the spot where he was left, next morning. The case has puzzled all veterinary surgeons. Surgeon Stanton says it is the only case on record.
