

So last spring the field was planted with corn, and as the thistles began to make their appearance, the cultivator was started and kept almost constantly going, with a man following with a hoe to clean out such shoots as were missed. Soon a triple hoe was anbstituted, and more where the thistles grew several times between each corn row, forcing the shovels deeply into the earth. This was continued till the corn, which grew very rapidly, was toe large, after which hooing was kept up as often as any thistles showed themselves, throughout the season. And towards the last, after an interval of two weeks, but two or three plants could be found, and Mr. M. feels very certain that next season will finish them with less than half the labur that it took this season.—Cor. Pen. Telegraph.


