Instead of 5 per cent on the first \$125,000 of the earnings and ½ per cent. additional for every \$25,000 additional. The company guarantees that additional. The company guarantees that the city will get at least \$10,000 income the first year and \$12,000 in subsequent years. As a rental the company will pay the city \$400 per mite for single track and \$800 per mile for double track.

There is also a stipulation that the company will erect iron poles on King-street from Queen to Victoria-avenue and from Stuart to Herkimer in James-street. On the other street in James-street. the other streets wooden posts will be
