ALBANY CLUB

BY-LAWS AND RULES

- 1.—(a) All persons being bond fide residents within the limits of the City of Toronto, shall, after election thereto by the Directors of the Club, be allowed (subject to the By-laws), the privileges of the Club, upon the payment of the sum of twenty-five dollars as an entrance fee, and twenty dollars as an Annual Subscription, payable in advance, annually, from the first day of January.
- (b) All persons being non-residents, viz.: residing not less than ten miles from the limits of the City of Toronto, shall pay ten dollars per annum in advance, without entrance fee; all persons residing without the Province of Ontario shall pay five dollars per annum, in advance, without entrance fee; all Bank Clerks, Law Students, and Officers of the Infantry School Corps, residing within the said City, shall, after election to Membership in the said Club in manner hereinbefore provided, pay annually, in advance, the sum of twenty dollars, and being entitled to enjoy (subject to the By-laws of the Club) the same privileges as Resident Members.

2. - Management.

The entire management and control of the affairs of the Club shall be entrusted to a Board of Directors, consisting of fifteer. Shareholders (bono fide holding one or more Shares of the Capital Stock of the Club, and not in arrear for any calls thereon.

3 - Election of Officers

At every Annual Meeting the Snareholders shall elect Fifteer. Directors and they shall remain in office until their successors are appointed. Said Directors shall from among themselves elect a President and two Vice-Presidents, and appoint an Honorary President.

4 - Presiding Officer.

The President or in his absence one of the Vice-Presidents, shall preside at all Meetings of the Board; but in the absence of both President and Vice-Presidents, and providing that there be present not less than three Directors, then a Chairman pre tem, shall be chosen from among those present.

5.—Committees.

The Board of Directors may elect from their own body such Executive Committees as may be deemed necessary for the internal management of the Club, such Committees to consist of not less than three of the Directors, who shall elect their own Chairman, and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Board.

6.—Secretary-Treasurer.

The Secretary-Treasurer shall have the collection of all fees, charges, and subscriptions, and have charge of all the funds of the Club, shall keep a regular account thereof, subject to examination at any time by the Financial Committee, or such other Committee as may be chosen by the Board of Directors, he shall keep a record of all Meetings (whether Regular or Committee), and notify Candidates for admission of their election, he shall have the custody of the Corporate Seal of the Club, and shall hold office at the pleasure of the Board.

7.—Board Meetings.

The Board shall hold Monthly Meetings or whenever summoned by the President or one of the Vice-Presidents, and shall have full power over all Officers of the Club.

8.—Vacancies in Board.

The Board shall have full power to fill any vacancy through death, resignation, or as hereinafter provided.

9.—Rules of Domestic Affairs.

The Board shall prescribe rules for regulating the domestic affairs of the Club, with full power to appoint and remove the Steward and all servants of the Club, at

the pleasure of the Board. The Board shall fix the prices to be charged on the bills of fares and all other prices. The Secretary-Treasurer shall upon request furnish a statement of profits to any given date, upon the business of the Club, with a statement of liabilities in connection with the Club, or any other statement in connection with his position.

10.—The Board shall be empowered to vacate the place of any Member of the Directorate by a vote of two-thirds of the Shareholders present at a Special Meeting called for that purpose.

11.—Suspension or Forfeiture of Membership or Expulsion.

The Board of Directors shall have power by a vote of two-thirds of its Members present at a Special Meeting of the Board called for the purpose to suspend or forfeit the membership of, or to expel any Member for any conduct on his part likely to endanger the welfare, interests, or character of the Club; or for wilfully infringing any of the By-laws, Rules, or Regulations of the Club.

12.-Election of Members.

No person shall become a Member of the Club unless a *Conservative*, and until he shall have attained the age of twenty-one years; every candidate for admission must be proposed by one Member and seconded by another previous to his name being submitted to the Board of Direc-

tors (five Members of the Board to form a quorum); his name, and with it those of his proposer and seconder, shall be posted in a conspicuous place in the Club House at least one week before being submitted to the Board for Ballot. No Candidate for membership shall be elected should two black balls be cast against him.

13.—There shall be five classes of Members:

- (1) Members Resident in the City of Toronto.
- (2) "Non-resident (Province of Ontario).
- (3) " (outside Province of Ontario).
- (4) Members Special.
- (5) "Transient or Privileged.

Each Resident Member shall pay an entrance fee of twenty-five dollars, and an annual subscription of twenty dollars, payable in advance. The subscription shall date from the first day of January in each year.

Non-resident (Province of Ontario, but ten miles distant from Toronto), Non-resident, without the Province of Ontario, and Special Members are subject to election in the same manner as Resident Members. The Annual Subscription for Non-resident Members residing in the Province of Ontario shall be ten dollars, in advance, without entrance fee; for Non-resident Members without the Province of Ontario, the Annual Subscription, without entrance fee, shall be five dollars, in advance; and for Special Members the Annual Subscription, without

entrance fee, shall be twenty dollars, payable in like manner and on the same conditions as those of Resident Members.

Privileged or Transient Members (necessarily Conservatives) are entitled to the privileges of the Club for a period not to exceed two weeks, without entrance fee or subscription, but shall have no right to introduce any friend, or to in any way interfere with the management of the Club; such Privileged or Transient Members must be introduced by a Member of one of the other four classes of Members, and the name of both the person introduced and the Member shall always appear in the Visitors' Book upon the day of introduction, specifying day and date and duration of privilege, always subject to the Board of Directors.

Members elected in any other month than January shall pay the proportionate amount of their subscription.

14.—Supernumerary Members.

Any ordinary Member who shall remove his residence to a greater distance than ten miles from Toronto (all his subscriptions then due being paid) may give notice in writing to the Secretary of such removal, and of his intention not to make use of the Club thenceforward; and such ordinary Member shall cease to be liable to pay the yearly subscription so long as he shall continue to reside at such distance from Toronto, and does not use the Club, shall be considered a Supernumerary Member, and his

name shall be entered by the Secretary in a book kept for that purpose.

Any such Member shall be reinstated to all his privileges upon his return being notified in writing to the Secretary, and such notification be given within one month of his return, and upon payment of his subscription for the then current year; failing in such notification and payment such Member shall be considered as having withdrawn himself from the Club, unless the Committee decide otherwise.

15.—Visitors.

Any Member, at his own expense, has the privilege of introducing one or more of his friends to the Visitors' rooms, and to breakfast, lunch, or dinner, and the name of each such friend shall be entered in the Visitors' Book.

Guests of any Member, with whom they have dined or lunched at the Club, shall, providing they are Conservatives, have access to any part of the Club, while such Member is with them; but if not known to be Conservatives, then only access to the Visitors' room, and Private Dining room, while such Member is with them.

16.-Club Rules and Houre.

The Club House shall be open every day for the reception of Members at 8 a.m., and shall be closed and lights extinguished at 1 a.m., except on Saturdays and Sundays, when the hour of closing shall be midnight. But when

no Member is in the house at midnight of any other evening the Club shall be closed at that hour, and no Member shall be admitted into the Club after these hours on any pretence whatever, unless specially authorized by the Committee.

Every Member is to pay his bills for every expense he may incur in the Club before he leaves the house.

Any Member allowing his house account to remain in arrear for more than one week shall be posted.

Any cause of complaint by any Member is to be by letter to the Secretary-Treasurer, and any inattention or improper conduct on the part of a servant is also to be stated by letter to the Secretary-Treasurer; the name of any Member complaining is made known to the Board of Directors, and if so desired only to the President or one of the Vice-Presidents.

No gambling shall be permitted in the Club, and no games of any kind on Sundays.

Dogs are not to be allowed inside the Club on any pretence. Newspapers, books, or other articles, the property of the Club, are not to be taken from the Club.

Strangers calling to see Members will be required to remain at the entrance of the Club until it is ascertained if the Member is within.

The waiters and all other servants of the establishment will be subject to the order of the Steward and Secretary, and will perform such duties as they may prescribe.

No stranger shall be admitted into the Club House except on business, and the servants are strictly prohibited from receiving visitors or followers. No Member shall give, and no servant shall receive a gratuity in the Club on any account whatever.

If any money or articles, supposed to be the property of Members, shall be found by the servants in the Club House, they shall be delivered to the Secretary through the Steward.

The servants' entrance in the rear will be under lock, and the key thereof be in the custody of the Steward, and servants must not enter or go out of the Club except by servants' entrance at the rear of the building.

Members will fill up their bills for meals themselves, and must on no account employ the waiters to do so.

Articles of glass, earthenware, etc., which may be broken by the Members, either in the Coffee-room or elsewhere in the House, must be paid for by them.

No advertisement shall be allowed to be laid on the table, or put up in the Club by a Member; but any pamphlet, etc., which it may be wished to be made known to the Club, shall be sent to the Secretary, to be laid before the Committee.

Writing materials will be provided in the Reading-room and Smoking-room.

Members will be careful to check the tickets before paying.

17.—Billiard Room.

(1) The game of English Pool shall have choice of tables and take precedence over Billiards and Pyramids, and may be played in consecutive games.

(2) For Billiards and Pyramids the tables can only be engaged for two games. Precedence in playing and choice of tables given according to entry of names on the marker's slate. The charges will be as follows:—

English Pool, five cents per ball, stars to pay extra.

Black Pool, " "

Pyramids, thirty cents per hour.

Billiards, " "

Snooker Pool, forty cents per hour for three players, ten cents per cue a game for four or more players.

No more than three games shall be played on any one table if required.

The marker is instructed at the conclusion of each game to present to the loser a cheque for the amount of his game.

Members cutting the cloth will be fined in proportion to the damage done.

18.—Bed Rooms.

No Bed Room can be retained by the same Member for more than fourteen days, and an interval of one week must elapse before occupation of that or any other Bed Room can be renewed, during which the effects of that Member must be removed from the Club building.

19.—Smoking.

No smoking shall be permitted in the Members' Dining Room or Reading Room.

20.—Causes of Forfeiture of Membership.

The name of every Member failing to pay his annual subscription before the first day of March in each year shall be posted in the Club, and if the subscription be not paid before the first day of July following he shall then cease to be a Member, and his name shall be erased from the books of the Club unless the non-payment be explained to the satisfaction of the Board of Directors. No Member shall be allowed to use the Club House or exercise any of the privileges of membership until he shall have paid all arrears to the Club, and subscriptions which may be due by him, which subscriptions are due on the first of January.

On the election of each new Member the Secretary shall notify the same to him and furnish him with a printed copy of the Rules and Regulations, and request him to remit the amount of his entrance fee and subscription to the Secretary-Treasurer, and until the same be paid he shall not be entitled to the privileges of the Club.

Any Member who shall withdraw, resign, or whose Membership shall become forfeited from any cause shall ipso facto cease to be a Member of the Club, and to have any right, privilege, or use of the Club in any way whatever.

21.—Annual and Other Meetings.

There shall be a General Annual Meeting of the Share-holders, to be held at the Club House on the last Tuesday in September, in each year.

The Board shall also have power to call from time to time Special Meetings of the Shareholders. Notice of all Meetings of the Board shall be given in writing to the Members thereof by the Secretary-Treasurer.

22.—Any amendment to the Constitution shall require an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Capital represented in person or by proxy, at a General or Special Meeting of the Shareholders called for the purpose.

23.—Scrutineers.

The President or presiding officer at the Annual or Special Meeting shall appoint two Scrutineers from among the Shareholders, whose duty it shall be to open the polls and count the ballots in the presence of at least three other Shareholders, and those persons having the greatest number of votes shall be entitled to office, and shall enter upon their duties forthwith after the date of their election.

24.—Construction of Constitution and By-laws.

In respect to all questions of the Construction of the Constitution and By-laws, the decision of the Board once made thereon shall be final and obligatory, until rescinded by the Board itself at any General or Special Meeting.
