

-Features of Insurance. A general meeting of the Board of Trade was held yesterday afternoon to receive a notice of motion regarding proposed changes in the bylaws of the board. The notice of motion was moved by Mr. Warring Kennetion was moved by Mr. Warring Kennetic was a street while the company can use one-half the street while the other half is being naved motion was moved by Mr. Warring Ken-nedy, and Wednesday afternoon, April 5, medy, and Wednesday afternoon, April 5, was named as the time that the proposed changes are to be passed upon definitely. The most important change is that giving members the opportunity to commute their annual dues of \$17 by paying \$200 for a life membership. Another important change is that to provide for membership of persons over 50 years or over. Since 1886 members have been obliged to contribute to the gratuity fund. A new clause in the bylaws permits persons 50 years and over, who are found ineligible for the gratuity fund, to become members on payment of \$25 entrance fee and the fees of the then current year. These members will not be subject to gratuity fund assessments. In the conversation, which President Wilkie declared in order, Mr. W. B. Hamilton doubted that the gain made in the sale of life memberships would be more than counterbalanced by the loss in yearly fees. Suppose 100 life memberships were sold at \$20,000. The interest on that amount would be \$1200, while the loss of annual fees would amount to \$1700. He did not think this a good method of paying up the current indebtedness of \$15,000.

Vice-President Blain stated that the current indebtedness was not \$15,000; in fact,

Vice-President Blain stated that the curent indebtedness was not \$15,000. reat indebtedness was not \$15,000; in fact, there was no indebtedness. The board had assets to more than cover the debt in their unsold debentures. If Mr. Hamilton and others would buy these there would be no

That did not alter the fact that the board had assets more than sufficient to pay its debts, but instead of selling these debentures they proposed to issue life memberships. Careful computation showed that, considering the compounding of interest, there would be a gain instead of a loss.


